This Month in History

from the Vienna Newsletter archives

MARCH 1999 – A “walk-through” on Beulah Rd., N.E., has been scheduled for March 27 to identify right-of-way associated with the proposed improvements to the roadway and which trees may be affected by the project. The Department of Public Works and the Virginia Department of Transportation held a meeting in January with interested residents to review two proposals for Beulah Road, one maintaining the existing alignment of the street and the other slightly realigning the roadway in order to preserve the larger trees.

MARCH 1979 – The Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority has begun cleanup operations in preparation for the extension of the Washington & Old Dominion Regional Park from Falls Church through Vienna. This section of the trail should open later this spring, pending completion of major bridges over Routes 66 and 495. Eventually, the trail will reach 42 miles from Arlington To Purcellville.

MARCH 1969 – As mentioned in a previous newsletter, plans are underway to establish a center for historical preservation on the property of the Freeman House on Church Street. Unfortunately, the Town’s arrangements are not moving ahead as fast as the vandals, as damage to the house proves, and we can only hope there will be enough left to preserve. In addition, the old “Vienna, Va.” signs have been taken from each end of the train station. Anyone knowing their whereabouts are asked to notify Town Hall. The matter of their return will be handled with the utmost discretion.

Water Mains Flushed in Spring

Each spring the Town of Vienna flushes the water mains in its distribution system in order to maintain a high standard of water quality and to ensure proper and efficient operation of the fire hydrants. The preventive maintenance program begins in early April, and flushing usually occurs between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Water mains are flushed by opening the fire hydrants and allowing the water to flow freely for a short period of time. The flushing cleans out sediment that normally accumulates during the summer and winter, and enables the Town to test and perform routine maintenance on the 800+ fire hydrants within its service area.

Flushing may result in some discoloration and the presence of sediment in the water reaching your home or business. These conditions are not harmful and should be of short duration. The Town appreciates your tolerance of this inconvenience. If you need more information, please call the Water and Sewer Customer Service Office at 703-255-6385.

Business License Renewal Deadline

Town businesses are reminded that March 2 is the deadline for payment of the annual business, professional, and occupational license (BPOL) tax. All businesses in the Town of Vienna, including home occupations, must renew their business licenses each year.

The amount of the tax is based on gross receipts, and the rate varies according to the type of business. The gross receipts threshold is \$50,000, below which the tax does not apply. Businesses with gross receipts of \$50,000 or less pay only the minimum license fee of \$30 per year.

License tax renewal forms were mailed at the end of January, and forms are also available in the Finance Department at Town Hall and online at www.viennava.gov. For more information or assistance in figuring license taxes, call 703-255-6321.

Voter Registration Deadline April 6

Monday, April 6, is the last day to register to vote in the May 5 Town election. You are eligible to register if you are a Vienna resident, at least 18 years old by election day, and a U.S. citizen.

You may register in person in the Fairfax County General Registrar's Office at the County Government Center or by mail. Application forms are available in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, all public libraries and other locations around the county, and at www.fairfaxcounty.gov.

If you are already a registered voter, no additional registration is required for the Town election; however, you should check your voter registration card to be sure it lists your current name and address.

Recycle Motor Oil, Antifreeze, Batteries

The next quarterly recycling day for used motor oil, antifreeze and car batteries is Saturday, December 6, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill St., N.E. (entrance at the dead end of the street). This service of the Public Works Department provides citizens a convenient and environmentally responsible way to dispose of vehicle waste products. Too often, used oil is improperly poured down storm drains or into sewers. Just one quart of oil can pollute 250,000 gallons of water, releasing toxic metals such as lead, cadmium, and arsenic into the environment. Recycled oil is a valuable resource that can be re-manufactured into new fuels.

Antifreeze, like oil, can contaminate water and should never be disposed of in drains or sewers. In addition, antifreeze stored around the house presents a great danger to children and pets; it tastes sweet but is deadly poison.

Improper disposal of automobile batteries is a leading cause of lead contamination in landfills and energy recovery facilities. In Virginia it is illegal to dispose of automobile batteries with refuse.

Comment from the Council Table

Become a Part of Life in Vienna

Since I am not seeking re-election to the Town Council, this will be my last column in the newsletter. And so I am going to share some personal thoughts instead of discussing town government issues.

First, I want to express my sincere thanks to everyone who supported me in the last four Town elections, thereby giving me the rewarding privilege of serving on Town Council. A thank you also to all the civic-minded citizens who vote every year, even if I was not their candidate of choice!

Thank you also to the staff members of every Town department. Whether visible to the public or not, they are the engine that keeps Vienna running 24/7. Town Council members may make policy deci-

sions, but it is the diligent support of staff that translates them into effective action. It is also the conscientious and knowledgeable advice of the Town Manager and department heads that gives facts and reality to Council decisions.

Finally, I have a favor to ask. Please, if you have not done so already, become acquainted with how our town government functions – the boards and commissions and their responsibilities as well as those of Council. To use a current buzz word, transparency is alive and well in Vienna. The meeting dates are listed on the Town calendar we all receive, and the public is welcome to come, listen, and participate. Even Council work sessions, including budget discussions, are open to the public. Hopefully, you may decide you would

Vienna belongs to all of us, not just whatever governing body happens to hold office. As of August 1, I will be a 58-year resident of Vienna. When my husband and I came here, it comprised some two square miles and 2,000 residents. Two or three years later, the building of homes in southwest Vienna and land annexation expanded it to four square miles and hundreds of new families. The newcomers took civic responsibility seriously (Many were World War II veterans.), and over the years their efforts paved the way and set the stage for the unique, family-oriented small town we enjoy today. Charlie and I loved this town and it greatly enriched our lives.

I asked a good and wise friend recently to give me the one word that best describes what we personally gain from involvement in the town government or service organizations or community projects, something we will always have. She thought a moment and said, "experience." True, I said, but that's not my one word. Mine is "memories," sometimes funny, sometimes sad, but most of all always rewarding for being a part of life in Vienna.

Trim Plantings for Safety

Now that spring is in the air, residents are reminded to keep bushes, hedges, and other plantings trimmed so that they do not obstruct the vision of motorists or impede pedestrians and bicyclists. The Town Code restricts the height of vegetation to three feet above the curb level within 25 feet of an intersection. All the walkers and bikers in town will appreciate it! If you have questions or complaints about obstruction of vision at intersections, call the Planning and Zoning Department at 703-255-6341.

Tax Relief Offered to Senior and Disabled Low-income Homeowners

Both the Town of Vienna and Fairfax County offer real estate tax relief for low-income homeowners who are 65 years old and over, or permanently and totally disabled. To qualify, the following requirements must be met:

- Total household income of \$72,000 or less. This amount excludes \$6,500 of income of relatives, other than the spouse, who reside in the household. Also excluded is \$7,500 of any income received by a disabled homeowner. 100% tax relief is given for total combined income of \$52,000 or less, 50% tax relief between \$52,001 and \$62,000, and 25% tax relief between \$62,001 and \$72,000.

- Total combined assets of no more than \$340,000. This amount excludes the value of the residence, up to one acre of land, and household furnishings.

- Disabled persons applying for the first time must show evidence of disability.

In addition to real estate tax relief, Fairfax County provides rental grants and relief from personal property tax for one automobile per household.

Applications for 2009 for all programs are due April 1. This date may be extended to December 31 of next year for first-time filers or if hardship conditions exist which, through no fault of the applicant, prohibit applying by April 1.

VISA Debit Card Fees Reduced for Real Estate Tax Payments

Real estate tax payments made online or in person in the Finance Department at Town Hall with a VISA branded debit card will now cost only a flat \$3.95 convenience fee instead of 2.5% of the bill amount. At this time all other credit card and debit card convenience fees are unchanged. You can make your payment online by visiting the Town Web site, www.viennava.gov. Proposed Park & Conservation Zone Hearing March 2

At its March 2 meeting, the Town Council will hold a public hearing on a proposed ordinance to establish a Park and Conservation (PC) Zone to encourage the preservation of open space. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall, and all interested citizens are encouraged to attend.

The intent of the proposed ordinance is for land zoned PC to remain or be restored to a natural, undisturbed, and undeveloped state. Indigenous plants and trees would be preserved whenever possible, and efforts to establish indigenous plants and trees would be strongly encouraged.

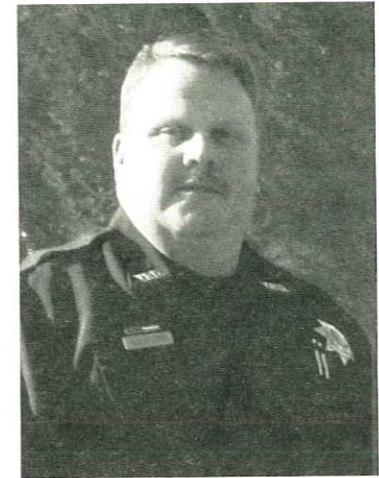

The Vienna Police Want You to Know

"What was the helicopter doing hovering over our neighborhood last night?"

"There were two police cars outside our home yesterday. I wonder what they were doing?"

"I heard that there was a serious crime around the corner three days ago. I wonder if it's true?"

"What goes on during the night when I am sleeping or during the day when I'm at work?"

If you have ever wondered about police related information, events, or crimes that may have occurred in town, we want you to know you have an online source as well as a human resource you can contact. All of our media releases are published on the Town's Web site. (A media release is an informational bulletin typically sent to all area news media sources sharing brief details of a significant event.) For you as a citizen, this information is now available online just as fast as it becomes available to the press! All you have to do is go to www.viennava.gov and click on the "Police Media Releases" link on the left-hand side of the page near the bottom. The releases are cataloged in chronological order starting with the most recent one.

Additionally, we publish online a comprehensive multi-page document on a weekly basis called the Vienna Police Highlights. Police Highlights lists in-depth information regarding most significant incidents handled by the Vienna Police. Police Highlights is typically 10 or so pages long and also incorporates all media releases that were issued during the reporting period. You will also find interesting information on awards and achievements attained by our officers as well as other human interest items relative to the Police Department.

Police Highlights also lists all reportable vehicular crashes that have occurred in town. A brief summary of the situation leading up to the crash, the crash itself, charges filed, and general injury information is included in the list. This publication is also viewable online at the www.viennava.gov site by clicking on the "Police Highlights" link at the bottom left.

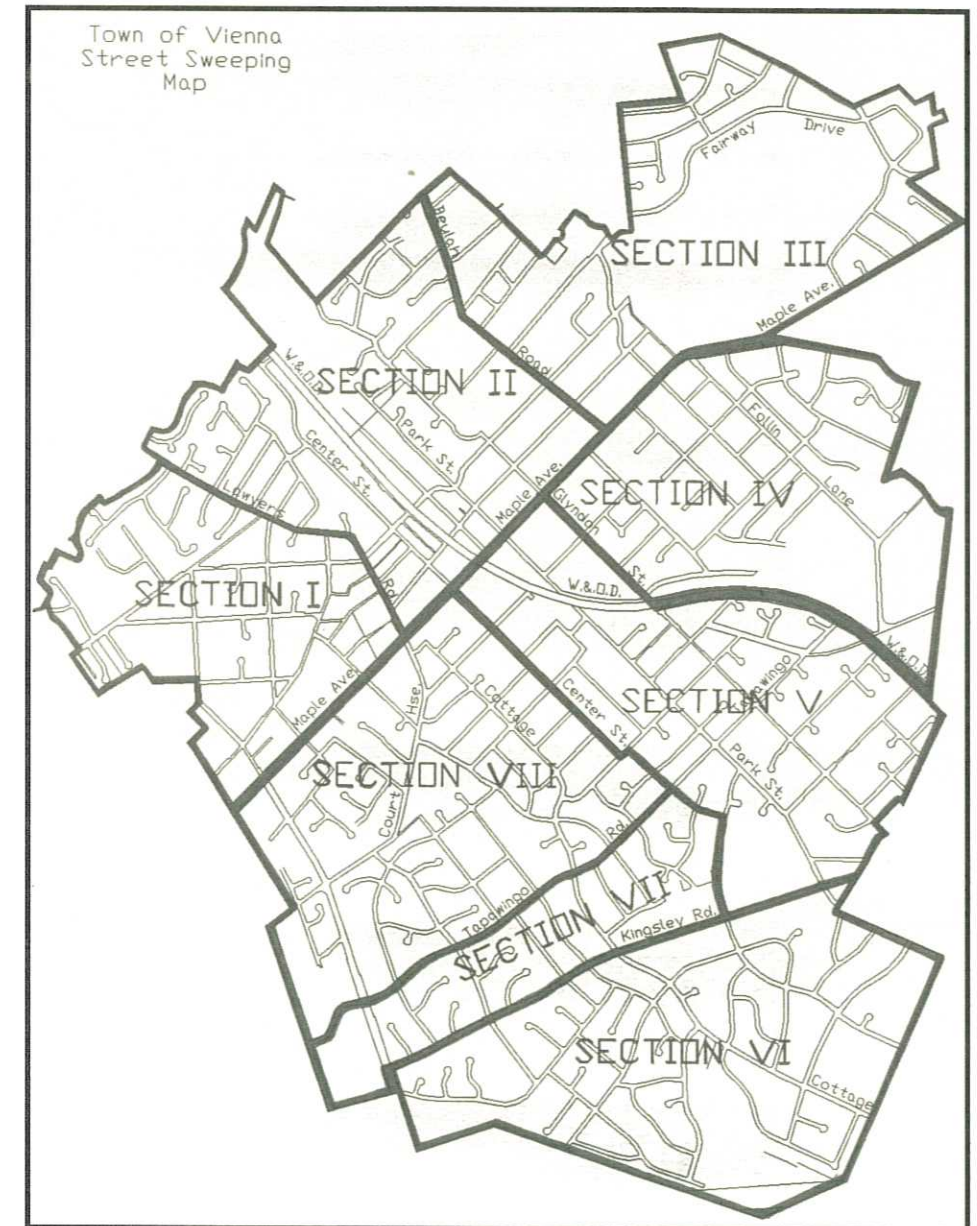
