# TOWN COUNCIL ACTION

## April 4, 2011

- Approved installing lane narrowing along Courthouse Road from Nutley Street to Locust Street and installing bike route signage on this section of roadway on the western side of Nutley to the Town boundary (Dog Park) along Courthouse Road and along Locust Street, SW up to Center Street, at the discretion of Public Works following VDOT standards.
- Approved riding a York County, Virginia contract for the purchase of one 2011 Ford F450 cab and chassis for a cost of \$38,815 and a dump body for \$8,585.
- Adopted proposed amendment to Chapter 18, Zoning, Article 4, General Regulations and Uses, Height and Area, Section 18-11.A.,

Area, to permit the Zoning Administrator to approve handicapped ramps.

- Approved to expend approved FY 2009-2010 carry-forward amounts for Public Works not to exceed \$167,270 for silt operations, light replacements, asphalt patching and Life Safety review of Town Hall.

## April 25, 2011

- Accepted sponsorship from Air Treatment Company of Vienna, in the amount of \$17,000 for the 2011 July 4th Fireworks Display, Green Expo and the Halloween Parade.
- Approved to support the Community Enhancement Commission in the development of an education and recognition program to promote advanced energy efficiency in residential and

commercial structures.

- Approved the site plan amendment to include the “Artifact Memorial Plan for Liberty Park” at 801 Follin Lane, SE.
- Waived competitive procurement requirements for the use of RAM Productions for a purchase order in the amount of \$12,000 to be funded via PEG funds.
- Approved a resolution authorizing the Town to submit a maximum \$1,410,000 application for the FY 2012 VDOT Revenue Sharing Program to construct or rebuild Drake Street, SW, Lakewood Drive, SW, Spring and Battle Streets, SE, Center Street, S and Mill Street, NE and authorize the Town Manager to execute documents related to this program.
- Awarded a contract to Arthur Construction for sidewalks and storm sewer installation on Plum Street, SW and Harmony Drive, SW for an amount not to exceed \$250,578.
- Awarded a contract to E.E. Lyons Construction Co., Inc. for water main replacements on Ware Street, SW and Courthouse Road, SW for an estimated cost of \$183,825.
- Scheduled a public hearing to consider revisions to the Code of Vienna Chapter 1 and 17 for May 23.

## COMMENT FROM THE COUNCIL TABLE

### Walkers and Runners and Bikers, Oh My!

There's Maple Avenue, with businesses and stores to meet nearly every need; there's Church Street NW, perfect for strolling and shopping. And there is another thoroughfare at the heart of Vienna: the W&OD Trail.

The Trail links Town gathering places—the Community Center, the Town Green, the Saturday Farmers Market—to our neighborhoods and commercial district. It hosts attractions for a variety of interests, many operated by dedicated volunteers for the benefit of our Community: the Freeman Store run by Historic Vienna, Inc.; the Vienna Train Station with its display by the Northern Virginia Model Railroaders; the Caboose, always available for kids to play on, and open once a month by the Optimist Club of Greater Vienna (check the schedule at [www.OptimistClubofGreaterVienna.org](http://www.OptimistClubofGreaterVienna.org)).

Our Vienna section is a small part of the 45 mile long multi-use trail park operated by the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority (NVRPA), but it is a vital part of our Town. Four years ago I started bicycling regularly on the Trail. Two years ago I was appointed the Town's Liaison to the

NVRPA Board, and am pleased to still serve in that role.

While I will sing the praises of the Trail, I know that it in some ways is a victim of its own success. It can be crowded. The street crossings can be a challenge for drivers and trail users. Here are some ideas, based on my personal opinions, on how we can share the trail to make it a better experience for us all:

**Be Nice and Share:** The W&OD is a multi-use trail. Horses, in-line skaters, baby strollers, bikes, runners—it is there for everyone. Respect other users' right to be there. That means cyclists shouldn't treat walkers as slalom poles, and walkers shouldn't form moving road blocks by walking three (or more) abreast. And please, announce yourself when passing!

**Approach with Caution:** At all street and sidewalk crossings, whether you are on the street or on the Trail, use extreme caution. Don't assume that you have the right-of-way. Even if you do, what comfort is that when you or someone else is seriously hurt? Obey posted signs, and assume that the other guy might not.



**Wear a Helmet:** Lots of things can trip you up and tip you over—many of them are things beyond your control. You can control your protection against them, so wear a helmet. Your loved ones will thank you. And make your kids wear helmets, too.

**Choose Wisely:** While the W&OD may be available to us all, it may not be the right place for all of us. Think about your activity—is it really suited to the busy trail? There are better places to teach your child to ride a bike, or walk a dog who's easily startled. I've witnessed both activities lead to scary situations and near-accidents.

We are truly fortunate to have the W&OD Trail in the heart of Vienna. The coming, cooler months are some of the best times on the Trail and I hope we can all safely enjoy it together.

# FISCAL YEAR 2011-2012 BUDGET ADOPTED

The Town's adopted budget for fiscal year 2011/12, which began July 1, totals \$29,841,559 for all funds, an increase of \$638,879.

The General Fund budget is based on a real estate tax rate of 24.21 cents per \$100 of assessed valuation, a decrease of .27 cents from last year's tax rate, but an effective tax rate increase as defined by law. Based on the estimated median market value from 2011 assessment data, the average Vienna property owner will pay an annual real estate tax bill of \$1,209.54, an increase of \$36.60.

In the Water and Sewer Fund, water rates decreased by 15 cents per 1,000 gallons and sewer rates increased by 50 cents per 1,000 gallons for all users effective July 1.

The Debt Service Fund continues to be supported by receipts from the meals and lodging tax.

## PUBLIC WORKS HIGHLIGHTS

The Department of Public Works encompasses many jobs that include both day-to-day tasks like garbage and recycling collection, as well as long term projects like sidewalks. Recently, Public Works has been working on several capital projects around Town. Capital projects include items that the Town pays for with bonds and will have a life span of 20 years or more. The following are just a few of the capital projects that the Department of Public Works is currently working on.

Currently, the Water division is replacing the water main on Ware Street, SW between Pekay and Walker Streets and adding additional water main connections on Courthouse Road, SW between Plum Street and Courthouse Circle. Soon they will begin replacing the water main pipe stems on Saint Roman Drive, NE.

The General Maintenance and Street Maintenance crews are working on the Plum Street and Harmony Drive, SW sidewalks and also reconstructing the street and sidewalk on DeSale Street, South. The General Maintenance Division will soon begin work on a protected left turn lane from Nutley Street, SW on to Tapawingo Road (eastbound).

In April of this year, two ribbon cutting ceremonies were held for newly completed sidewalks along Dogwood Street, SW and Meadow Lane, SW. The Dogwood Street sidewalk is a critical Safe Routes to School walkway to Vienna Elementary School and was made possible through the help of former Congressman Tom Davis and current Congressman Gerry Connolly. The Meadow Lane sidewalk provides a safe walking route to Meadow Lane Park and provides easy access to the park's many recreational activities and facilities.

The Vehicle Maintenance Division recently provided two new sedans for the Police Department and one hybrid pickup truck for the Parks and Recreation Department.

Projects in the pipeline include curb, gutter and sidewalk replacement along Cottage Street, SW from Walker Street to Patrick Street and curb, gutter, sidewalk and repaving a portion of Maple Avenue.

## SUMMER SAFETY FOR YOUR PETS

Summer is a time for both you and your pet to enjoy the sunshine and be outdoors. Along with the fun, the season also offers up some situations that can endanger your pet. By taking the necessary precautions, you can decrease the chance that disaster will happen. The Humane Society of the United States offers some guidance for pet owners to keep their furry friends safe this summer.

### **Never Leave Your Pet in the Car**

In nice weather you may be tempted to take your pet with you in the car while you travel or do errands. But during warm weather, the inside of your car can reach 120 degrees in a matter of minutes, even if you're parked in the shade. This can mean real trouble for your companion animals left in the car. Dogs and cats can't perspire and can only dispel heat by panting and through the pads of their feet. Pets that are left in hot cars even briefly can suffer from heat exhaustion, heat stroke, brain damage and can even die. Don't think that just because you'll be gone "just a minute" that your pet will be safe while you're gone; even an air-conditioned car with the motor off isn't healthy for your pet.

To avoid any chance that your pet will succumb to the heat of a car this summer, be sure to play it safe by leaving your pet cool and refreshed at home while you're on the road. And if you do happen to see a pet in a car alone during the hot summer months, alert local animal control or the police department immediately. With a little care, we can all enjoy this season together here in Vienna.

### **Leave Your Pet At Home**

The Town of Vienna has an abundance of outdoor activities for you and your family to enjoy during the summer months. In most cases, the Town does not prohibit animals at these events; however, pet owners are encouraged to leave their pets refreshed at home instead of bringing them out in the heat.

You can still have fun with your pet this summer, but should do so while being careful.

- Remember to provide plenty of cool, fresh water and shade.
- Limit their sun and heat exposure during the middle of the day.
- Dark colored dogs can become overheated very quickly.
- Take them out of the sun if they feel hot to your touch.
- Be very aware of hot pavement.

## OPERATION EXTRA EYES FOR DWI'S RESULTS

On July 2, the Fairfax County Police Department in conjunction with the Town of Vienna, Fairfax City, Washington Airports Authority, United States Park, Falls Church City and the Virginia State Police Departments conducted a regional DWI saturation patrol. A total of 59 Uniformed Police Officers/Troopers and three uniformed Auxiliary Police Officers participated in the event.

The enforcement effort was conducted throughout the major roads in the McLean District, the Sully District, the Reston District and the West Springfield District of Fairfax County, the Town of Vienna, the City of Fairfax, the City of Falls Church, as well as the Dulles Access and Dulles Toll Roads, George Washington Parkway, I-495 and I-66.

The effort produced 281 summons issued, 211 written warnings, two refusal to submit to a breath test, 19 Driving While Intoxicated arrests, four reckless driving by alcohol, eight no operator's license/driving on a suspended/revoked, and four criminal arrests including two possession of marijuana and two possession of cocaine.

# GEOTHERMAL EXPLAINED

On March 10, residents were treated to an informative seminar at the Community Center on domestic geothermal heating and cooling systems. Drawing from his considerable experience, Steve Nugent explained how he installs geothermal systems, and Shelton Cartwright provided a technical overview of geothermal's mechanical components, its efficiency advantages and its capacity for improving comfort.

Geothermal systems transfer heat between a building and the ground. At depths below 5 feet, the Earth's temperature remains about 55 degrees Fahrenheit year round. Here,

the heat exchange is potentially four times more efficient than the outdoor air used by conventional equipment. The efficiency challenge for air becomes evident upon realizing that an air conditioner moves heat from inside your house by releasing it into the hotter outdoor air.

A geothermal system is a significant investment that uses a large drilling rig to install a subterranean pipe used to transfer heat between the house and the ground.

The presentation was followed by remarks from two neighbors, Andrew Bloom and Pete Storm who recently installed geothermal systems

at their respective residences. Their perspective bears out geothermal's merits which include quieter operation, reduced need for wintertime humidification and energy savings exceeding 40%. Both neighbors recommend taking steps to first make the house envelope as efficient as reasonably possible. A well-insulated house requires less capacity and a correctly sized system will operate more efficiently.

One related tip: A geothermal installation contract should specify that the lawn and landscaping be restored to its original condition.

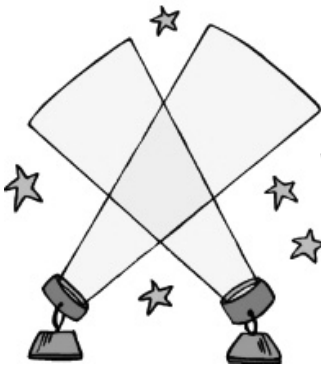

## THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

*From the Vienna Newsletter Archives*

**August 2001:** At its July meeting, the Town Council approved continuation of the Vienna Farmers' Market through October in the parking lot behind Town Hall. The market is open each Saturday from 8 a.m. to noon. In June, Council had given temporary approval for the market to operate on Town property after the originally advertised location on Church Street became unavailable.

**August 1991:** The Town Council will hold a public hearing August 26 on a proposed boundary adjustment with Fairfax County. The purpose of the boundary adjustment is the elimination of bisected lots, better delivery of municipal services and simplification of the boundary. Overall, the Town would acquire an additional 71 acres of property and approximately 218 new residents.

**August 1981:** The final report of the Vienna Metro Station Planning Task Force has been completed. Council appointed the Task Force last year to assess the impact on the town by the Vienna Metrorail Station, scheduled to open early in 1986. "The prospect of several thousand additional cars flowing into Vienna each morning and flowing out each evening represents the most serious potential problem for the community," the report says.

**August 1971:** The Vienna Environmental Council reminds residents that the weekend of August 14 and 15 is Vienna's weekend for volunteers at the recycling depot in the Gem parking lot at Tysons Corner. The facility for recycling newspapers, glass and aluminum is open every Saturday and Sunday.
