## NEW REFUSE PROGRAM BEGINS JULY 2

Changes to the way we collect trash, recycling and bulk items will take effect Monday, July 2, 2012.

The new refuse collection program simplifies household refuse collection by dividing the Town into five districts and removing all household waste and recycling items on the same day each week. The new program also expands sanitation services by including the removal of large bulk items weekly on your scheduled collection day. A map detailing the new five-district collection routes/days is available inside on page 4 and is available online at [www.viennava.gov](http://www.viennava.gov). The district boundaries are outlined below.

### New Collection Routes/Days Effective July 2:

Mondays: North of Maple Avenue and West of Mill Street

Tuesdays: North of Maple Avenue and East of Mill Street (including Maple Avenue residents)

Wednesdays: South of Maple Avenue and East of Park Street (including both sides of Park Street)

Thursdays: South of Maple Avenue, West of Park Street and North of Tapawingo Road (including both sides of Tapawingo Road)

Fridays: South of Tapawingo Road and West of Park Street

## COMMENT FROM THE COUNCIL TABLE

### Striving for a Beautiful Vienna

Beginning next month, we're making it easier for residents to dispose of trash, recyclables and other unwanted items each week. The Department of Public Works will be promoting and advertising our new refuse collection program, including new solid waste regulations and the new days/routes, in your monthly newsletter and online.

Starting July 2, everything- including household trash, recycling, bulk items and brush- will be collected on one day each week in each of the newly created five districts. (You can view the new collection map on page 4 of this newsletter!) As we begin to roll out this program, there may be some kinks to work out, but it will work out.

With a little help from everyone, the Town of Vienna can be the cleanest, neatest Town in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

Take a drive around Town and really look. I was astounded by the amount of trash and debris collected recently by community volunteers. For example, two Boy Scout, three Cub Scout and two Girl Scout troops gathered 44 bags of trash and recyclable materials out of Wolfrap Creek. Within the collected debris, there were 50 pounds of barbed wire, pipes and other various items. That was just one day in one location in our Town!

Last month, Marshall Road Elementary School students pitched in to clean up Hunter's Creek on Nutley Street. Both of these locations are places that visitors to Vienna see when driving into Town.

During the April Potomac Watershed Cleanup Day, 97 volunteers, including several Boy Scouts, worked to collect 54 twenty-pound bags of debris and 49 fifteen-pound bags of recyclable material. In addition, over 1,600 plastic



bags were collected. Altogether, it was estimated that 310 pounds of material collected in our stream beds. This is a serious amount of debris and junk that we toss away daily.

**What can we all do?** Well, start by bringing your own bags to the stores and recycle all plastic bags. Think twice about what to recycle and what is regular trash. This is our Town and pride in how our Town looks to us and visitors is an important incentive to do a better job of keeping it clean.

So come on Viennans- let's strive for a clean Vienna!

### PAY YOUR VIENNA PARKING TICKETS ONLINE

You can now pay online for parking citations received within the Town of Vienna. Through the Town's online payment portal, individuals can pay their Vienna parking violations with their Visa, Mastercard, Discover or American Express credit or debit card without having to visit Town Hall. You can only pay online for parking violations issued by the Town of Vienna; online payment is not available through the Town of Vienna's website for moving violations or other citations received from the Town of Vienna Police Department.

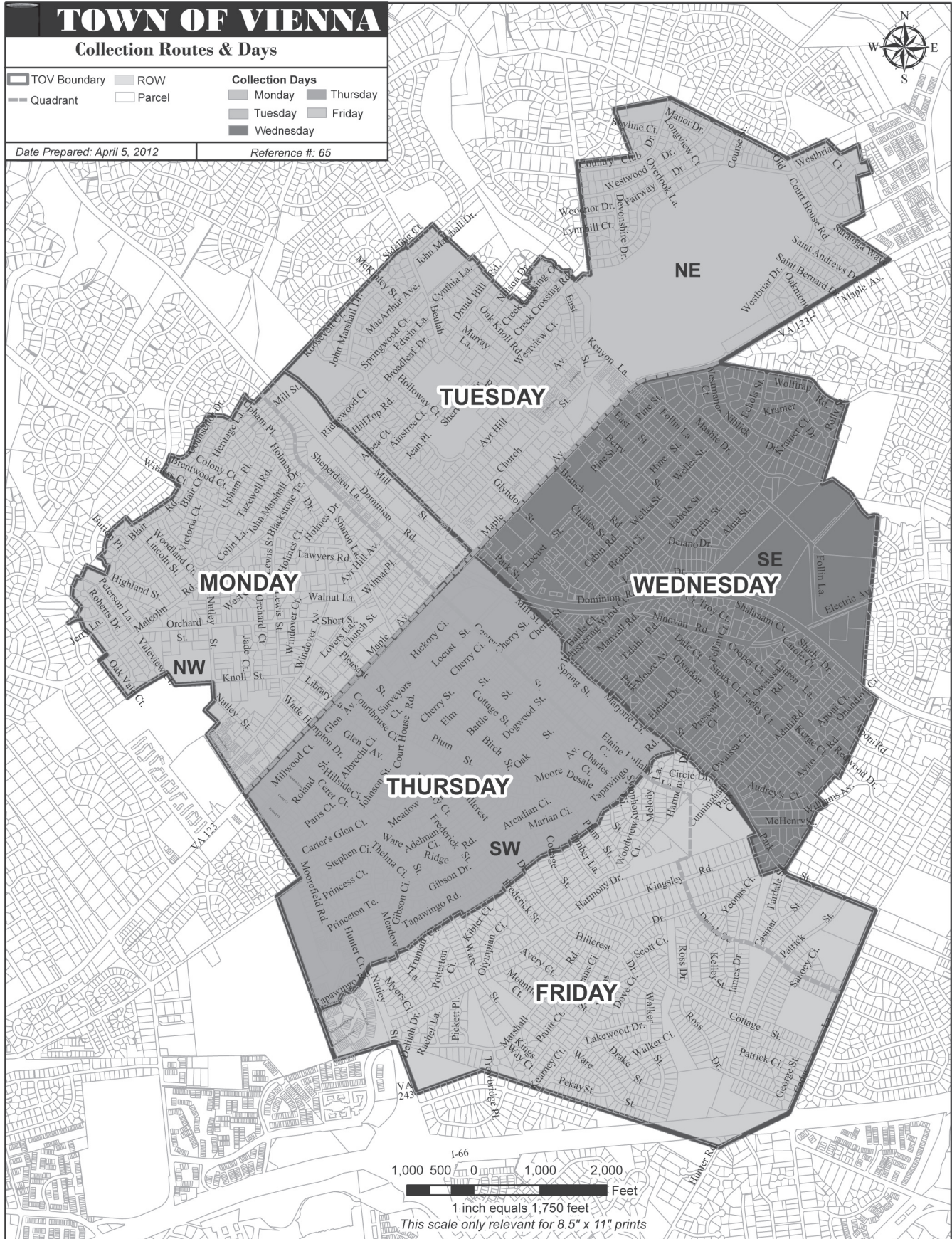
### ELECTION RESULTS

In the May 1 Town election, Mayor Jane Seeman and Town Councilmembers Laurie Cole, Edythe Kelleher and Michael Polychrones were re-elected for new two-year terms beginning July 1. The vote totals are as follows:

- Seeman: 504
- Cole: 454
- Kelleher: 489
- Polychrones: 438

A total of 558 Vienna residents voted in this election, out of 10,427 registered voters, a 5% turnout. Thank you to all citizens who took the time to vote as well as those who served as election officers.

# NEW REFUSE COLLECTION ROUTE AND DAYS EFFECTIVE JULY 2, 2012



## CURB PAINTING IS INEFFECTIVE

The Public Works Department does not recommend painting a house number on the curblin in front of a residence because it can be easily obstructed from view by automobiles parking along the curb or debris that may be left at the curb, such as leaf or snow piles. Permits are required to do any work in the Town right-of-way and they are not granted for painting the curblin. Also, if Town crews do any maintenance work that replaces the curb, the number will not be repainted.

Some residents have received offers to paint their house numbers on the curb. These solicitors do not have permits to work within the Town public right-of-way, nor do they have business licenses to operate within the Town of Vienna, so they are not legally allowed to do the work. If you receive such a solicitation, please call the Vienna Police Department's non-emergency number at (703) 255-6366.

Residents should display large house numbers at least five feet above the ground near the entrance or garage door that faces the street. This will ensure the numbers can be seen on the darkest night, in the worst of weather and not be hidden by foliage or parked vehicles.

## TOWN COUNCIL TO CONSIDER PROPOSED BIKE ROUTES

*By the Transportation Safety Commission*

In June, Town Council will consider a Transportation Safety Commission recommendation to sign several Vienna roads as 'bike routes.' These routes have been included in the Fairfax County Bike Route Map since 2008.

*Bike routes* are signed sections of roadway that identify preferred routes for cyclists who are comfortable riding in traffic. These signs remind motorists that cyclists belong and assure cyclists that they have not lost the route. Like other Vienna roads, the travel lane is shared between cyclists and motor vehicles. These are not "bike lanes," which involve creating a separate travel lane dedicated for bicycles.

A bike *route* does not take away parking or change the rules of the road. There are no additional burdens imposed on motor vehicles or on adjacent homeowners. Where traffic calming lane striping is present, cyclists can "take the shoulder" to ride separate from motor vehicles when there are no parked cars. This is the arrangement on the existing bike route on Courthouse Road SE.

Town Council will consider this topic at one of its June Town Council meetings. The public is invited to attend and provide their input on this topic. Detailed information on this item will be included in the Town Council meeting agenda available on the Town's website after 12 pm on the Friday prior to the meeting.

## PUBLIC PARKING OPPORTUNITIES IN VIENNA

In addition to street parking, other parking is available around Town for public use. These public parking locations are available in-part through agreements made between the Town and other public and private entities in an effort to provide additional parking during special events and high-volume times, such as weekends and holidays. Residents and visitors are encouraged to respectfully use these locations, observing the appropriate space, time and day limitations.

1. **Vienna Community Center**, 120 Cherry St. SE: Cherry Street Lot: Parking for the Community Center only.  
Park Street Lot: Parking for Community Center, athletic fields and the W&OD trail.
2. **Vienna Town Hall**, 127 Center St. S: Open to the public after 4:30 p.m. on weekdays and anytime on weekends.
3. **Vienna Elementary School**, 128 Center St. S: Open to the public after regular school hours, evenings and weekends.
4. **115 Park St. SE**: Open to the public after 6 p.m. on Monday through Friday, after 12 p.m. on Saturday and anytime on Sunday.
5. **Vienna Assembly of God**, 100 Ayr Hill Ave. NE: Open to the public Saturday mornings during the Farmers Market, 8 a.m. to 12 p.m., May through October.
6. **Caboose Parking Lot**, 132 Church St. NE: Open to the public after 5 p.m. on Fridays and anytime on Saturday and Sunday. \*Note: Parking not available during Farmers Market from 8 a.m. to 12 p.m. on Saturdays, May through October.
7. **Town Green/W&OD Trail Parking**, Between Church St. NE and Maple Ave. E: Open to the public anytime. Parking accessible from one-way entrance on Maple Avenue East; public parking spaces face the W&OD Trail.
8. **Vienna Shopping Center, Next to 116 Maple Ave W**: Public parking spaces are available on the far eastern corner of the parking lot next to the Sunoco Station at 102 Maple Ave W.

## YARD SALE REGULATIONS

*A reminder from your Vienna Planning & Zoning Department*

- Each residence and/or family household may conduct no more than two yard sales during any calendar year. No permit is required.
- Each sale must be conducted during daylight hours for no more than two consecutive weekends (Saturday and Sunday).
- To advertise your sale, two signs of not more than two square feet each are permitted at the residence where the sale is being conducted.
- Four additional signs of not more than two square feet each are permitted, as directional signs, provided permission is received from the owner of the property where the signs are to be placed.
- No sign may be exhibited more than two days prior to the start of the sale.
- Signs are not allowed in Town rights-of-way (ten feet from the curb or edge of pavement) or on utility poles. All signs placed illegally will be removed.

## GROWING UP GREEN

This summer, I'll be packing up all of my eighteen years of "stuff" and trekking across the country to settle into a tiny dorm room at Brigham Young University. In college, there will be no one to remind me to turn off the faucet when I'm not rinsing, my dad won't ask me to turn out the lights when I leave a room and my mom will not remind me to reach into the garbage can and put the apple cores or carrot peels from the regular trash into the composting bin under the sink. My backyard has a vegetable garden, a rotating composter, a vermiculator and a rain barrel. I grew

up with parents that were determined to teach me to "reduce, reuse, and recycle." Did I always enjoy those lessons? No! Most of the time, I just threw compostables in the correct receptacle to avoid reaching my hands back into the trash.

But in all seriousness, "growing up green" is economical, rewarding and fun. All of my science fair projects have revolved around composting or worm farming. I love eating things that I helped grow without the taint of poisonous pesticides. I even collect the

## REAL ESTATE TAX DUE NEXT MONTH

The first installment on 2012 Town of Vienna real estate tax bills is due on July 30. *Mailed payments must be postmarked on or before that date to avoid penalties and interest.* For your convenience, an overnight drop box is located at the front door of Town Hall.

Tax bills will be mailed out the first week of July. If your Vienna taxes are paid through your mortgage company and you receive the tax bill, please notify your mortgage company immediately. If you have sold the property and are not responsible for the tax bill you receive, please notify the Real Estate Office immediately at (703) 255-6325 or [realestate@viennava.gov](mailto:realestate@viennava.gov).

To pay by credit or debit card online, visit [www.viennava.gov/index.aspx?NID=255](http://www.viennava.gov/index.aspx?NID=255). To pay by phone with a credit card, call 1-888-2PAYTAX (1-888-272-9829) and use the Jurisdiction Code 1094 for real estate. Make sure you record the confirmation number given to you at the end of the transaction as this will serve as your proof of payment. A convenience fee applies to all credit or debit card payments. No portion of this fee goes to the Town of Vienna.

## PPEA: OPPORTUNITY FOR INNOVATION

Lately, you may have heard some rustle around Town about "PPEA" and you've probably thought to yourself, "What is *that*?" PPEA refers to the Public-Private Education Facilities and Infrastructure Act that was passed by the General Assembly in 2002. The Act allows agencies, institutions and localities to form partnerships with the private sector to develop and complete major projects that serve the public interest. The projects are not limited to "educational" facilities and the PPEA essentially provides an opportunity for the public and private sectors to work together to develop projects that benefit the entire community. In order to utilize these types of partnerships, in February of this year the Town Council adopted procedures to provide guidance regarding requests made pursuant to PPEA. The guidelines are available on the Town's website at [www.viennava.gov/index.aspx?NID=856](http://www.viennava.gov/index.aspx?NID=856).

Under the PPEA, the Town can receive solicited and unsolicited proposals for a public-private partnership project. Under the PPEA regulations, other interested firms or private entities have 45 days after the initial bid is received to submit a competing conceptual phase proposal for the project for simultaneous consideration by the Town. Private entities may submit unsolicited bids to the Town at any time.

Currently, the Town has received an unsolicited proposal to construct a parking structure at 120 Church Street NE. At the time of printing of this publication, no other bids have been received for this project. Once the 45-day period has ended, the Town will review any and all submitted proposals for this specific project and will schedule public meetings to receive resident and business input on the project. The proposal for the parking garage on Church Street is available on the Town's website at [www.viennava.gov/index.aspx?NID=874](http://www.viennava.gov/index.aspx?NID=874). Information on meetings will be available on the Town's website, and advertised in local newspapers and the Town Newsletter.

The PPEA is intended to encourage innovative partnerships between responsible public and private entities and provides a unique opportunity for localities to work with private organizations to develop long-term capital projects that benefit the community as a whole.

## THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

*From the Vienna Newsletter Archives*

**June 2002:** At its April 2 meeting, the Town Council awarded a contract to Lewis-Scully-Gionet to prepare alternative design concepts and a final master plan for the proposed Town park at Maple Avenue and Mill Street.

**June 1992:** The Town Council will hold a public hearing June 1 on a proposal for curbside recycling in Vienna. If approved, regular trash and grass would be picked up on the first collection day of the week; newspapers, brush, grass, plastic bottles, glass jars and bottles, metal food and beverage cans, and aluminum foil would be picked up on the second day.

**June 1982:** At its June 28 meeting, the Town Council will hold a public hearing to consider recommendations from the Transportation Safety Commission concerning ten intersections in Vienna controlled by stop signs. Last fall, Council requested the Commission to study all Vienna intersections having stop signs and recommend which, if any, should be modified.

**June 1972:** The Town Council adopted its land use plan for the next five years, including the Planning Commission's stream valley park concept, which will protect Wolftrap Creek, Piney Branch, Hunter Branch and other major streams in Town.
