REAL ESTATE TAX DUE NEXT MONTH

The first installment on 2013 Town of Vienna real estate tax bills is due on July 29. Mailed payments must be postmarked on or before that date to avoid penalties and interest. For your convenience, an overnight drop box is located at the front door of Town Hall.

Tax bills will be mailed out the first week of July. If your Vienna taxes are paid through your mortgage company and you receive the tax bill, please notify your mortgage company immediately. If you have sold the property and are not responsible for the tax bill you receive, please notify the Real Estate Office immediately at (703) 255-6325 or realestate@viennava.gov.

COMMENT FROM THE COUNCIL TABLE

Please Pardon Our Dust

Have you noticed? The Vienna Town Hall is changing. Maybe from the outside it doesn't look much different, but renovations are happening inside.

For years, Town Hall's heating and air conditioning system has kept the building too hot or too cold and often during the wrong seasons. Once a decision was made to replace the current system with a more efficient one, other changes fell into place.

As part of the renovations, new energy efficient windows are being installed, asbestos is being removed from throughout the building and updated wiring and other needed repairs are being made.

What this means for you, the citizen, is that many offices are moving to temporary locations throughout the duration of the project. These location

changes are happening about every three or four months, which means that at times finding the office you are looking for may be tough.

Throughout the duration of the project, residents can find the Finance Department in a temporary facility located behind Town Hall. Other offices will utilize Finance's space inside of Town Hall as swing space while work is being done in other parts of the building.

During this upheaval it is important to focus on the end result. Offices are being configured to better serve customers, residents and visitors. The Town Council Chambers will be equipped with state of the art audio and visual equipment so that citizens can watch Town Council meetings live on Cox channel 27 and Verizon channel 38. Throughout all parts of the



building, we are using energy efficient products as much as possible. The last time any changes were made to Town Hall was in 1996 with the addition of the elevator and other Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) requirements.

By the time of the Town Hall reception on Friday, December 13, 2013, the renovations will be completed and citizens will have the opportunity to visit the new and improved Town Hall.

We are certainly looking forward to that day!

ELECTION RESULTS

In the May 7 Town election, Town Councilmembers Laurie A. DiRocco, Carey J. Sienicki and Howard J. Springsteen were re-elected for new two-year terms beginning July 1. The vote totals are as follows:

- DiRocco: 806
- Sienicki: 710
- Springsteen: 708
- Thomas: 440

A total of 989 Vienna residents voted in this election, out of 11,084 registered voters, an 8.9% turnout. Thank you to all citizens who took the time to vote as well as those who served as election officers.

YARD SALE REGULATIONS

Each residence and/or family household may conduct no more than two yard sales during any calendar year. No permit is required.

Each sale must be conducted during daylight hours for no more than two consecutive weekends (Saturday and Sunday).

To advertise your sale, two signs of not more than two square feet each are permitted at the residence where the sale is being conducted.

Four additional signs of not more than two square feet each are permitted, as directional signs, provided permission is received from the owner of the property where the signs are to be placed.

TOWN HALL RENOVATIONS CONTINUE

All financial services are available in the annex located behind Town Hall. Renovations of the Council Chambers and 2nd floor offices expect to be completed by July 1. Public Works, IT and Planning and Zoning will be temporarily located in the old Finance space July through August. No sign may be exhibited more than two days prior to the start of the sale. Signs are not allowed in Town rights-of-way (ten feet from the curb or edge of pavement) or on utility poles. All signs placed illegally will be removed.

SOLAR FOR THE SOUL?

Power Purchase Agreement Workshop Scheduled for June 26

An interesting and cost effective way to have solar panels and get energy from the sun was passed into law this year in Virginia. If your house of worship is interested in having clean renewable energy as part of their earth care program, this new law allowing Power Purchase Agreements (PPA) may be just what you are looking for. With a PPA, a solar contractor installs and maintains the solar panel for the term of the contract. The non-profit that has the panels installed only pays for the electricity that they use. Aided by the federal tax credits that go with this arrangement and the fact that you are only buying the electricity, a PPA makes the price of solar electricity very attractive and there are little or no up-front costs.

Schools, local governments and non-profits are also covered under this new legislation. Power Purchase Agreements are what has made solar energy so widely distributed in other states. New Jersey has 1000MW of solar installed compared to Virginia's 10MW. New Jersey is 1/5th the size of Virginia and further north so it has less solar resources. PPA's have been blocked in Virginia and this new law is a crack which will allow, at least for some, a choice in how their energy is generated.

Planning Commission – approves preliminary plats of subdivisions, prepares the Comprehensive Plan for the future development of the town, hears and makes recommendations to Council on rezoning requests and other planning and zoning matters.

Board of Zoning Appeals – is authorized to hear and decide appeals of any decision made by the Director of Planning and Zoning, grant variances from the zoning code, approve conditional use permits and interpret the zoning map.

Board of Architectural Review – examines and approves plans for commercial buildings, signs and landscaping to ensure that new construction is not bizarre or garish and is harmonious and compatible with existing buildings.

Transportation Safety Commission – studies intersections, traffic signs, speed limits and other matters relating to street safety and makes recommendations to Council.

Windover Heights Board of Review – approves new construction and major exterior alterations of buildings within the Windover Heights Historic District in northwest Vienna to ensure that they are in keeping with the old and historic architectural aspect of the surroundings.

Town/Business Liaison Committee – makes studies and offers recommendations to Council on matters affecting the town's businesses and their relationship with other segments of the community.

Community Enhancement Commission – created to act as the focal point for beautification and litter control programs.

IN LOVING MEMORY: MAYO STUNTZ

Longtime Vienna resident and likely the Town's most well-known Vienna historian Mayo Sturdevant Stuntz died on Thursday, May 9, at the age of 97.

Stuntz was born and raised in Vienna, attending Vienna Elementary School in the 1920s. He went on to attend Cornell University, entered the U.S. Army during World War II and accomplished a 25 year career with the Central Intelligence Agency. Stuntz was well known for his historical contributions to the greater Vienna community. He and his wife of 66 years, Connie, co-wrote several books including "This Was Vienna, Virginia: Facts and Photos," an invaluable historical resource for the Town and the community.

"Mayo loved talking about Vienna and reminiscing about growing up

here," said Mayor M. Jane Seeman. "He never hesitated to share his fascinating stories and was always available to speak to groups about Vienna's history. I firmly believe that Mayo and Connie's book 'This Was Vienna' should be required reading for all residents."

On hearing of Stuntz's passing, former Town Public Information Officer Marie Kisner stated, "I and many others considered Mayo Vienna's unofficial historian. His book was my most valuable resource whenever

people requested information about town history or when researching their own family members. Mayo was very generous in sharing his time and knowledge with the many people I referred to him over the years. He taught me a lot about Vienna, and I'm so glad his books will always be available to help us understand and learn from the Town's past."

Stuntz is survived by his wife Constance Pendleton Stuntz, his daughter Anne (Brad Swanson) - president of Historic Vienna, Inc. - sons Reid (Linda) and Mayo, Jr (Elizabeth), a host of grandchildren and a great granddaughter.

Services were held on Wednesday, May 15, at Money and King Funeral Home.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

June 2003: At its April 21 meeting, the Town Council approved an agreement with Heartland Restoration to dismantle and remove the Moorefield House. Earlier this year, the Town Council had reluctantly accepted the recommendation of Historic Vienna, Inc., to raze the building due to the cumulative effects of age, water damage, vandalism and several additions and modernizations to the original portion of the house, built circa 1790.

June 1993: Vienna Elementary School, the oldest school in Fairfax County, will celebrate its 120th anniversary the week of June 7-12. Festivities will include an ice cream social, alumni reception, living history performances by the students and dedication of the old school bell.

June 1983: The Citizen Advisory Panel on Redevelopment of Commercial Zones, established by the Town Council to provide guidance on any redevelopment of Vienna's commercial and light industrial areas, will hold a public meeting June 9 to give residents, business persons and representatives of civic organizations an opportunity to express their views on commercial development/redevelopment in Vienna.

June 1973: Council has authorized the Town Manager to develop and implement a program for restoring the Freeman House at Church and Mill Streets to usable condition and operation. A resolution was adopted allowing for the restoration of the historic building, with the upper story to be converted into a dwelling unit for the use of a custodian and the rest of the building available for display of artifacts significant to local history.
