Election Results

Three Councilmembers were chosen in the May 5 election. Incumbents, Carey Sienicki and Howard Springsteen have been re-elected. Sienicki has served on the Vienna Town Council since 2011 and Springsteen has served on the Town Council since 2009. Newly elected Councilmember Tara Voigt will begin her term on July 1.

The vote totals are as follows:

- Sienicki: 389
- Springsteen: 383
- Voigt: 386

Out of 10,483 registered voters, 471 voted; a 4.5% voter turnout. Thank you to all citizens who took the time to vote as well as those who served as election officers.

- Approved increasing the expenditure for Datamatx to \$26,700 in the Water and Sewer Fund.

- Approved the Final Plat and specific modifications and waivers from the Vienna Town Code for Onondio Cove. This approval is further conditioned upon the formal approval of the proposed partial vacation of Ninovan Road, SE as requested by the applicant.
- Adopted the Ordinance to Vacate the portion of Ninovan Road SE, east of Tapawingo Road and adjacent to 911 Ninovan Road SE, accepted payment of \$21,306.00 from Satpal Sahni of Swan Homes, LLC for the vacated portion.
- Approved the proposed ordinance to re-number the Code of the Town of Vienna, Chapter 18, Zoning, Article 14, CMP Industrial Park Regulations, Section 18-95.1.
- Adopted an ordinance to amend the Code of the Town of Vienna, Chapter 17, Subdivisions, Article 5, Improvements, Section 17-67.1 Dedication of Sidewalks for Single-Lot Development; and Section 17-67.2 Completion of Sidewalks for Single-Lot Development.
- Adopted the Pedestrian Master Plan resolution.
- Approved the Solid Waste Management Plan Update.
- Increased contract IFB-15-08 with ABS by \$35,843 to install various HVAC items, winterize our system and include on-call electronic control maintenance.
- Approved the installation of the TSC recommended lane striping in the 400 Block of Center Street, North.
- Withdrew request for consideration of the vacation of a portion of Locust Street SE.
- Approved additional A&E fees, under RFP 14-03, to Lukmire Partnership for the Vienna Community Center gymnasium redesign in the amount not to exceed \$29,802.
- Approved the partial bond reduction for public improvements located at the 301 & 303 Niblick Drive SE subdivision to a surety amount of \$26,932.43 to be held until the remainder of the public improvements are completed.
- Awarded a \$50,000 design contract to Rinker Design and Associates for the Park & Locust Street mini-roundabout design.
- Approved the additional \$5,000 design work, RFP 12-01 with RDA for the John Marshall Drive NW sidewalk project.
- Awarded a \$310,000 Westbriar Drive NE sidewalk construction contract to Sagres Construction.
- Approved the Memorandum of Understanding agreement with Fairfax County for the Wolftrap Creek Stream Restoration Phase II Project and authorized the Mayor to execute the agreement pending final legal review by the Town Attorney.
- Increase FY15 spending with Espina Paving, Inc., IFB 14-21 by \$82,000.00 to \$343,565.00 from accounts #10414-47402 for \$62,000.00, and #50111-47408 for \$20,000.00.
- Approved an additional emergency expenditure of \$15,000.00 with HD Supply.
- Awarded a \$38,000 fuel management and fuel dispensing equipment replacement contract IFB 15-10 to Jones and Frank.
- Adopted a proposed ordinance to re-number the Code of the Town of Vienna, Chapter 18, Zoning, Article 14, CMP Industrial Park Regulations, Section 18-95.1

Transportation Safety Commission – Studies intersections, traffic signs, speed limits and other matters relating to street safety and makes recommendations to Council.

Windover Heights Board of Review – Approves new construction and major exterior alterations of buildings within the Windover Heights Historic District in northwest Vienna to ensure that they are in keeping with the old and historic architectural aspect of the surroundings.

Town/Business Liaison Committee – Makes studies and offers recommendations to Council on matters affecting the town's businesses and their relationship with other segments of the community.

Community Enhancement Commission – Created to act as the focal point for beautification and litter control programs.

Bicycle Advisory Committee - Serves as an advisory committee to the Town of Vienna's Transportation Safety Commission (TSC) by providing citizen input in planning the bicycle transportation infrastructure improvements and in promoting bicycling initiatives within the Town of Vienna.

The Pedestrian Advisory Committee - Serves as an advisory committee to the Town of Vienna's Transportation Safety Commission (TSC) by providing citizen input in planning the pedestrian infrastructure improvements and in promoting pedestrian initiatives within the Town of Vienna.

Public Art Commission - Advises and assists the Town Council on matters relating to the advancement of public art in the Town, including the development and funding of a public art program.

June is the last month for Solarize sign-ups & June 13th is the Native Plant Sale.

June 30th, 2015 is the last day to sign up for Solarize Vienna! Why is this important? Solar power on your home is easier and more economical than ever. You get a discount and ease of purchasing from the group bulk purchasing power and you get the 30% Federal Investment Tax credit. This tax credit, however, goes away the end of 2016. To qualify for the ITC your system has to be installed and operational before the end of the calendar year. In 2016, the people who didn't take advantage this year are going to be rushing in and you may not get in the queue in time. If you are interested, go to SolarizeVienna.org and sign up. You'll get a FREE energy check-up to make your home more efficient and a FREE solar assessment to determine if your home is appropriate for solar panels.

And on June 13th from 8AM til 1PM at the Town Green, the CEC will be hosting a native plant sale. Last fall's sale was so successful that we decided to have a spring sale, too! Native plants are easier to grow, require less water once established and support the birds and other animals that are native to our area. By planting natives you help make a pathway for bugs, pollinators and birds to feed as they move through the area. Mix some in your garden and see how they work for you!

Real Estate Tax Due Next Month

The first installment on 2015 Town of Vienna real estate tax is due on July 28. Mailed payments must be postmarked on or before that date to avoid penalties and interest. For your convenience, an overnight drop box is located at the front door of Town Hall.

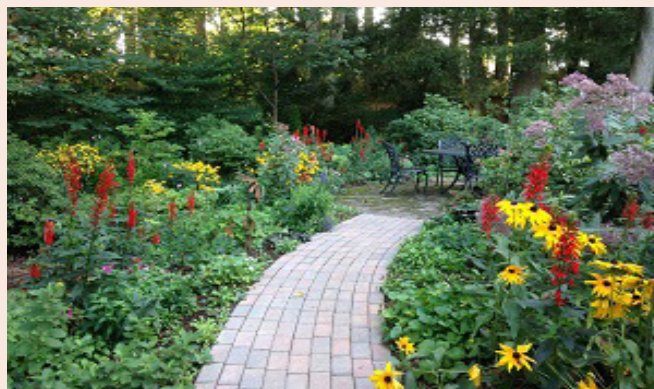

Stormwater Action Plan

In Vienna, when it rains almost all of the stormwater in Town is collected by a series of ditches, inlets and pipes that drain directly to our local streams and eventually into the Chesapeake Bay via the Potomac River. That water picks up a harsh variety of elements including oils, bacteria, phosphorous, nitrogen and sediments. Eventually that contaminated water drains right into our streams and directly pollutes our local and regional waterways. In order to help reduce these pollutants the Town has in place various measures and programs that are regulated by the Virginia Department of Environmental Quality (DEQ) and by the Federal Clean Water Act. The Town operates its local storm drain system, which is regulated, under a state permit called a Municipal Separate Storm Sewer System, otherwise known as our MS-4 Permit. Specific measures include public education and outreach, public involvement, illicit discharge detection and elimination, construction site stormwater control and post development stormwater management.

In accordance with the Clean Water Act, the DEQ has also set specific reductions of pollutants, including phosphorous, nitrogen and sediments. These pollutants draining from Vienna that enter the Chesapeake Bay are called Total Maximum Daily Loads (TMDLs). Our MS-4 Permit requires the Town to develop and implement a Chesapeake Bay TMDL Action Plan that details specifically how these reductions will be achieved. In general the plan proposes to meet the reduction requirements through methods including our long-standing street sweeping program and through a cooperative agreement with Fairfax County with which major stormwater improvement projects will be implemented. Examples of large projects include various stream restoration projects including the recently completed Wolfrap Creek Phase 1 restoration and the current projects on Hunters Branch and Wolfrap Creek Phase 2. A draft Action Plan has been prepared and available for public review and comment.

Highlights of the plan are:

- Continue the erosion and sedimentation program with all new development or construction projects.
- Continue mechanical street sweeping to collect pollutants before they enter streams.
- Begin annual steam inspection to identify maintenance issues or improper discharges into our streams.
- Continue major stream restoration projects like the recently completed Wolfrap Creek project.

Solarize Vienna Sunsets June 30

The Town-sponsored program to reduce the cost and complexity of going solar will wrap up June 30. To access the program's bulk purchasing discounts, residents and businesses have until the end of the month to register at SolarizeVienna.org. As of May 18, the program had drawn a strong response, enrolling more than 125 participants for either a Home Energy Checkup or a Solar Assessment.

The Energy Checkup is free and includes a home evaluation, advice from a certified energy coach and installation of more than \$100 of energy-efficient products including CFL light bulbs and smart power strips. The Solar Assessment will determine if your home is a good candidate for solar. Five contracts for solar panels have been signed as of May 18. A Solarize informational meeting will be held June 9 at Town Hall, 127 Center St. at 7:30 p.m.

THIS MONTH IN HISTORY

From the Vienna Newsletter Archives

June 2005: Dominion Virginia Power and the Northern Virginia Regional Park Authority (NVRPA) have signed an agreement to enhance tree preservation along the W&OD Regional Trail. The agreement provides guidelines to plant and maintain “the right tree in the right place” and also governs the use of herbicides by Dominion.

June 1995: The grand re-opening of Patrick Henry Library is scheduled for June 24. The library expansion includes space for over 100,000 items, quiet reading room, children’s room with its own information desk, 65-seat meeting room, eight-seat conference room, eight terminals for the online catalog, lounge seating for homework and research, periodicals display and improved access for people with disabilities.

June 1985: The Vienna Woman’s Club recently planted a Canadian hemlock tree at the Town’s Bowman House Arts and Crafts Center on Center Street. The tree was dedicated to outgoing member Mrs. Hill, who has belonged to the club for the past 23 years.

June 1975: The Town of Vienna was officially recognized as a Bicentennial Community, Wednesday, May 21, by the American Revolution Bicentennial Administration (ARBA). Vienna was recognized because of its “meaningful Bicentennial activities.” In order to receive the honor the Town had to have an active Bicentennial Commission with useful, sound and active programs.
