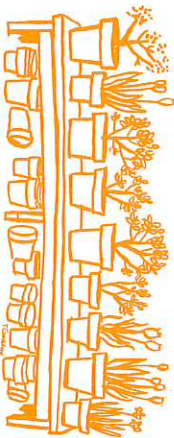

EARTH WEEK APRIL 9-14
CLEAN-UP WEEK IN VIENNA

Spring Clean-Up Week in Vienna will be a part of National Earth Week this year. Citizens are urged to make a special effort in cleaning up, not only their own homes and yards, but also the sidewalks and gutters in front of their homes.

Vienna's twice yearly Clean-Up Weeks are designed to give the homeowner an incentive to do a thorough Spring and Fall cleaning of yards, basements and garages. Everything is accepted in the regular trash removal including furniture and appliances which normally require a special paid pickup.

Because of the enormous amount of trash processed during this period, delays are inevitable. Your collection may be taken on the regular day.

VIENNA WILL BEGIN EXPERIMENT WITH CURBSIDE NEWSPAPER PICKUP

In recognition of Earth Week, and at the request of the Vienna Environmental League, Inc., the Mayor and Town Council have agreed to begin a pilot program of curbside newspaper pickup throughout the Town for three consecutive months.

The program will begin during the second week in May, and continue the second weeks in June and July. The Thursday, Friday and Saturday trash collection of that week will include only newspapers which have been tied in easily handled bundles, or placed in brown paper bags such as those used for groceries. Magazines and other paper products are not acceptable at this time. Do not use trash cans or plastic bags.

Results of the questionnaires on the recycling of newspapers indicated that the great majority of those answering, desired curbside pickup. The success of the program will depend on the cooperation of all Vienna residents both in setting out their papers on the proper day, and in NOT putting out other trash on that day.

This is our first step forward in the townwide recovery of resource materials in recognition of our environmental problems. Please help us to make it a successful one. The papers will be sold to a recycling center and will result in a savings to the Town of landfill and hauling fees. If the program is a success during the trial period it will become a regular feature of the Town's collection program.

NEW POST OFFICE

The Post Office Department has purchased the property on Lawyers Road, directly opposite Church St. as the site of Vienna's new post office.

Since 1965 the Master Street Plan of the Town has provided for the extension of Church from Lawyers Rd. through to Pleasant St. This extension would cut through the lower side of the Post Office tract. Postal officials have requested the Town to abandon the plan for the Church Street extension. Town officials still want the street opened. The matter has not yet been resolved.

No construction date has been set for the new post office.
