RECREATION

NEWSPAPER COLLECTION
CONTINUES IN JUNE-JULY



Vienna's 3 day trial newspaper pick-up in May generated 42.4 tons of newspaper. It is expected that the June collection will be better, since many residents seemed unaware of the program in spite of a special mail out to each home by the Environmental League and the article in last month's Newsletter. It is estimated that the Town residents discard 80 tons of newspapers each month.

In June, the newspaper pick-up will be taken on the 14th, 15th and 16th and will replace your usual collection whether Thursday, Friday, or Saturday. Only newspapers, either tied in bundles or placed in grocery bags, will be collected on those days. The same thing will apply to the second collection during the 2nd week in July.

PUBLIC HEARING SCHEDULED
JUNE 11 FOR 1973-74 BUDGET



A Public Hearing will be held on the proposed 1973-74 budget on June 11 at 8 p.m. in the Council Chambers at the Town Hall.

The proposed budget as submitted to Council by the Town Manager, totals \$3,474,910, a 7 1/2% increase over the present budget. The \$3,132,609 budget for this year was 15% higher than the previous year.

No tax increase is called for in the proposed budget. No new programs are included and no departmental allocations show significant increases.

A separate budget has been included for expending the Town's Revenue Sharing Funds, as required by Federal Law. These funds will be used for capital expenditures - major equipment purchases and major improvements.

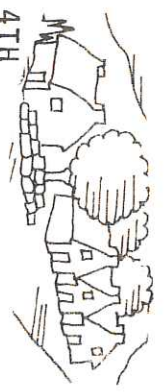
ILLEGAL SIGNS

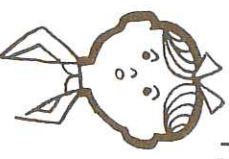

SIGN UP TO ENTERTAIN FOREIGN VISITORS ON 4TH



This year marks the silver anniversary of Vienna's Foreign Guest Program. For twenty-five years the residents of Vienna and surrounding county areas have taken visitors from foreign countries into their homes for the afternoon on July 4th. These foreign guests, on special training missions in the United States, come from the many countries receiving State Department Aid, and are obtained through International Center in D. C. It is often their only opportunity to visit an American home.

Guests arrive by bus and are greeted at the Town Hall at 12:30 p.m. on the Fourth. They are returned to Town Hall where their buses leave at 10 p.m. immediately after the town fireworks. They do not stay overnight. Host families are asked to take a minimum of two guests for the afternoon. Since all are students, they speak English and are intelligent, active people, anxious to get to know Americans and to learn about our way of life. In the 25 years of the program, many Vienna families have found the experience of entertaining these visitors a delightful one, and of particular cultural benefit to the children who learn that people from other lands can be very much like themselves.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE RECREATION AND PARKS DEPARTMENT

The Recreation and Parks Department was authorized by Town Council in February of 1966. The department has grown to include an Associate Director of Recreation, George Chinn, a secretary, Barbara Gatterdam and a Program Director, Kitty Corbin. The department is responsible for scheduling the Community Center and organizing a year round program of classes and special events. Some 90 acres of parkland, including all entrance ways to the town are maintained by the department.

Four picnic areas which may be scheduled and reserved in advance are available as well as four lighted tennis courts. Two other lighted tennis courts and two lighted athletic fields, Waters and Cunningham Park are owned by Fairfax County but are also maintained and used by the Town of Vienna. Hiking and biking trails have been constructed throughout the stream beds with maps available at the Community Center.

A BRIEF HISTORY OF THE RECREATION AND PARKS DEPARTMENT

The Vienna Recreation and Parks Department was authorized by Town Council action in 1965. The Department officially began in February 1966 with Judson Hockman as the first and current director.

The Recreation and Parks Department maintains a close relationship with civic clubs, garden clubs, the Vienna Women's Club, and youth oriented agencies. The Department is also a co-worker with Vienna Youth Incorporated which provides youth football, soccer, wrestling and basketball. The maintenance of some 90 acres of parkland, including the median strips dividing the entrance ways to town is also a responsibility of the Recreation and Parks Department. Four picnic areas which may be scheduled and reserved in advance are available, as well as four tennis courts, including two lighted ones. Two other lighted tennis courts and two lighted athletic fields, Water's Field and Cunningham Park are Fairfax County owned facilities but the Town of Vienna maintains and also uses these fields. Hiking and Biking trails have been constructed throughout the stream beds in the town, maps can be obtained at the Community Center.

THE VIENNA COMMUNITY CENTER

The Community Center houses the Recreation and Parks Department and is located in a lovely wooded area on Cherry Street. Most of the Department's classes are held in the Community Center as well as meetings, demonstrations and special functions. In addition to meeting rooms, there is a large game room and a gymnasium type facility which houses many athletic events, exhibitions, shows and parties. The Community Center offers space on a no fee basis for special interest groups. Individuals with interests in such areas as creative writing, poetry, discussions, gardening, etc. are urged to form groups and arrange time for these activities.

If you think you can be of any service to your Recreation and Parks Department and/or Community Center—most any talent is of interest to us—or perhaps as a volunteer for particular programs or activities, or just as someone with imaginative ideas, come by the Community Center and visit.

SPECIAL SUMMER PROGRAMS

THERAPEUTIC RECREATION PROGRAM

This program is designed for children with mild problems caused by 1) lack of physical fitness and/or coordination, 2) obesity, 3) emotional disturbances, 4) social difficulties, 5) speech or auditory disabilities, and 6) perceptual difficulties. The program is open to children pre-school through junior high. The approach to improvement will be primarily through physical activity, arts, crafts, and music. Although the staff will consult with medical and other specialists, the clinic will not be under medical supervision. The instructor is Ann Cain who will be assisted by several volunteers. The program will run six weeks, Monday through Thursday from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. beginning July 9th and finishing August 17th. The fee for the program is \$35.00 which is payable in two parts if necessary. If you are interested in enrolling your child or would like more information, please come to the Community Center to register or call 938-8000, ext. 277.

SUMMER PLAYGROUNDS
