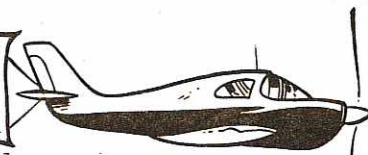

Results of Town Council's July 20, 1981, Meeting

* Adopted an amendment to the Zoning Code to include RM-2 zoned land to be eligible for reclassification to the Transitional zoning category.

* Approved a request by the Emergency Veterinary Clinic of Northern Virginia to erect the required masonry wall at the rear of Lot 141A in order to align the walls for the entire block.

* Added the definitions of amusement enterprise and mechanical amusement device to the Town Code.

* Accepted the first reading of a proposed Code amendment pertaining to soil erosion and siltation control.

* Adopted the Personnel/Policy Procedures Manual as amended.

* Established a new position in the Finance Department of Computer Programmer/Analyst, Grade 18, effective August 1. Abolished the position of Computer Programmer, Grade 7. Voted to abolish the position of ADP Supervisor, Grade 9, on the retirement of the present supervisor.

Improved Jitneybus System Ready for New Beginning

A revised system for the six-month extension of Jitneybus service has been developed by the Town staff and the Fairfax County Transportation Office. Shown here is a map of the new route, designed to tap additional areas of potential ridership and provide more convenient service.

This system will begin operating by the end of the month. New schedules are now being printed and will be available from Jitneybus drivers, as well as at Town Hall, the Community Center, Patrick Henry Library and many Vienna businesses. Schedules will also be inserted in the October Newsletter.

The Fairfax County Board of Supervisors agreed in July to give the Jitneybus an extra six months of life to try to increase ridership, which has been below the minimum required for success ever since the system began a year ago.

Under the revised system, both Jitneybuses will begin the route at Tysons Corner Center. One bus will run the route clockwise and the other counter-clockwise, thus providing two-way service all along the route.

Service will be extended to areas in northwest and northeast Vienna, the Rotonda and Tysons Towers complexes and, during morning and afternoon rush hours, the Northrop-Page Technology Park. Non-productive portions of the present route along Church Street and Echols Street will be eliminated.

The regular fare of 50¢ a ride will be continued. Persons age 60 and over may ride for half fare, and children under five still ride free when accompanied by a full-fare paying passenger.
