September 3 is the deadline to enter the annual Fall Tennis Tournament sponsored by Vienna Parks and Recreation.

Fall Cleanup Is Next Month

The Town's annual Fall Cleanup will begin on Tuesday, October 12. This year, cleanup crews will start in the northwest section and proceed clockwise through the northeast, southeast and southwest sections of town. The cleanup crews will spend anywhere from a few days to a couple of weeks in each section, depending on the volume of debris.

During the cleanup, residents may place items such as building materials, furniture, appliances, brush and tree limbs at the curbside for free pickup. Please keep debris away from fire hydrants, water meters, gas valves and fences.

Brush and branches should be separated from other discards, and all

cleanup items should be kept separate from regular trash.

Because cleanup crews comprise the same personnel who perform street maintenance and other public works duties, there is time for only one cleanup sweep of the town. Once a section has been covered, crews cannot double back. Residents may call the Public Works Department at 938-8000, ext. 241 for more information.

Water & Sewer Rate Hearing

A public hearing will be held September 13 to set the rates for water and sewer use. The hearing will be part of the regular Town Council meeting, which begins at 8 p.m. in Town Hall.

Water and sewer rate increases have been proposed to make this fund self-supporting and meet rising costs for bulk water and for sewage treatment.

The water rate for town residents would increase 17¢ per 1,000 gallons, from 68¢ to 85¢. For out-of-town customers, the rate would go from 91¢ to \$1.13, a 22¢ increase. The sewer rate for all users would increase 28¢, from \$1.62 to \$1.90 per 1,000 gallons.

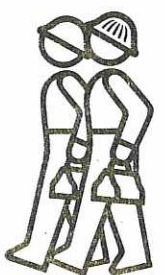
A 30% increase in the cost of bulk water from Falls Church became effective July 1. Falls Church officials cite as the reason for this increase the inclusion of operation and maintenance costs in their water prices.

The Town must also pay a 2% increase for Potomac Interceptor and 18% for Accotink sewage treatment. This increase is due to normal inflation and does not include future costs that may be levied against local juris-

dictions to upgrade the Accotink facility.

These increases are beyond the Town's control and must be made up by customer rate increases to avoid a deficit in the water and sewer fund.

Also at the September 13 meeting, Council will hold a public hearing on a proposal to limit terms of membership on Town boards and commissions. The proposal is intended to create more opportunities for interested citizens to serve on boards and commissions.

Members of the Planning Commission, Architectural Review Board and Transportation Safety Commission would be limited to three consecutive terms and two consecutive terms as chairman. The chairman of the Historic Windover Board of Review also would be limited to two consecutive terms.

To create additional openings, the membership of the Planning Commission and the Transportation Safety Commission would be increased.

Town Council Action

August 16, 1982

Council adopted a policy statement that "video games and arcades will not impose a deleterious effect upon the Town of Vienna," and that "the Town zoning code shall impose such conditions upon the issuance of any special use permits deemed necessary to ensure compatibility with land use policies." The Town Manager was directed to review existing Town ordinances and those of neighboring jurisdictions and recommend a new ordinance, if needed, to further regulate video games.

Other Council Action:

* Adopted a resolution providing for a cooperative agreement between the Town, the Virginia Commission of Outdoor Recreation, Wells Fargo Bank and local organizations to construct a "gamefield senior fitness course" on the W&OD Trail. Directed the Parks and Recreation Director to ask the Regional Park Authority if an adjacent piece of land could be used for the exercise trail.

* Accepted the bid by Browning-Ferris, Inc., of Fairfax for rental of a 30-cubic yard dumpster container and dumping service at \$60 per month, to come from budgeted funds.

* Accepted the bid by Superior Paving Corp., Centerville, of \$43,983 for the street resurfacing contract, and accepted the bid by National Asphalt Paving Co. of \$169,124.29 for bulk asphalt needs.

* Set September 27 as the date for a public hearing on a proposal to levy a surcharge on sewer bills of commercial establishments that deposit extraneous grease into the Town sewer system.

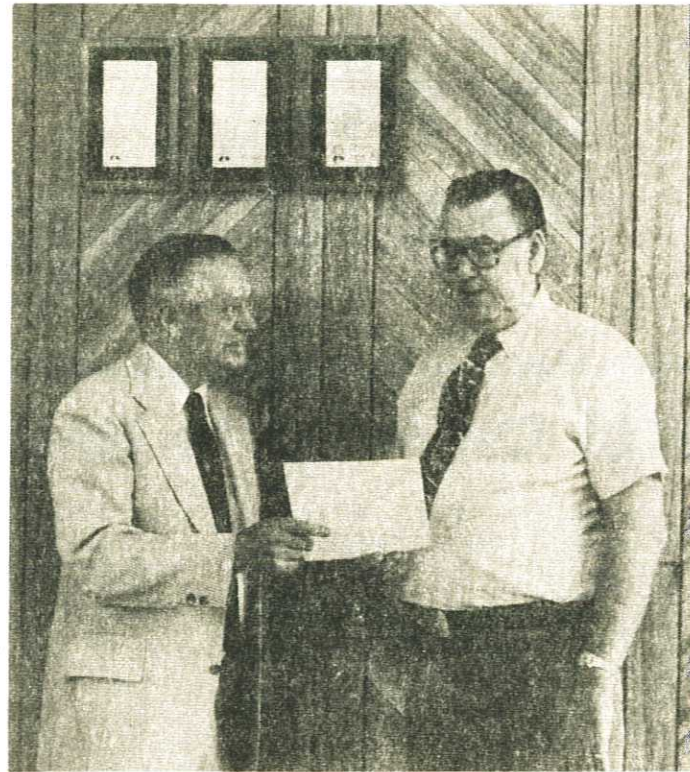

Certificate Awarded For Finance Report

For the third consecutive year, the Town of Vienna has been awarded a Certificate of Conformance in Financial Reporting, the highest form of recognition in governmental accounting and financial reporting.

The certificate was awarded by the Municipal Finance Officers Association of the United States and Canada for Vienna's 1981 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report. It is important to the Town as a means of achieving and maintaining a favorable bond rating.

In order to receive a Certificate of Conformance, a municipal government must publish an easily readable and efficiently organized annual report. The report must satisfy both generally accepted accounting principles and applicable legal requirements. Eligible reports are evaluated by a review committee of government finance officers, certified public accountants, educators and others with expertise in accounting and financial reporting.

Copies of the 1981 Comprehensive Annual Financial Report, which summarizes the Town's financial operations and highlights of last fiscal year, are available for public inspection in the Finance Department at Town Hall.

Vienna Child, Grandparents Will Lead Halloween Parade

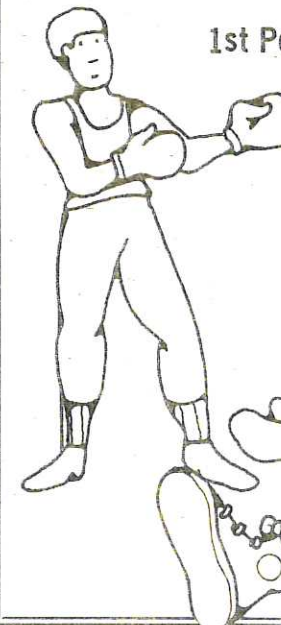
