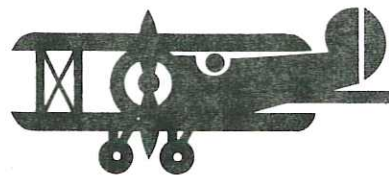
(You or a representative must be present at the drawing to claim a prize. All prize awards are final.)

TOWN COUNCIL ACTION

February 28, 1983

Council appointed the members of the Citizen Panel on Redevelopment of Commercial Zones. They are Chairman Mary Harlow, Jim Tate, Ed Vogel, John Stone, Thomas Bond, Ellaveen Barmby, Julian Johnson, Dwight Avis, Will Daniels, Planning Commission Chairman Arthur Kimberly and Architectural Review Board Chairman George Hicks.

Following a six-month study, this panel will recommend to Council any new ordinances or other measures "to encourage and where necessary require that development and redevelopment of commercial and light industrial land in Vienna enhance the tax base and the appearance of the Town."

The resolution creating the panel also reaffirms Council's commitment not to expand commercial zones or increase land use density or building height limits within those zones.

Other Council action:

* Authorized the Mayor to prepare letters of appreciation to Mr. Hazlett and Mr. McAmis for their service on the Transportation Safety Commission.

* Adopted an ordinance relative to unlawful use of public right-of-way or other property, which gives the Town more power to enforce the prohibition against illegally posted signs.

* Reappointed Public Works Director John Stockton and Lt. Zed Childress to the Transportation Safety Commission for two-year terms.

* Accepted the dedication for public street purposes of a 815-square foot parcel of land at the southeast corner of the Illinois Tool Works property abutting Electric Avenue.

* Approved the conversion plat for Park Terrace Apartments to condominiums.

* Approved the final plat of the resubdivision of Lot 25, Kingcrest Subdivision, contingent on the installation of curb, gutter and sidewalk or funds being placed in escrow for these improvements.

* Approved an easement agreement for the purpose of public street and storm drainage facilities across the Galihier property.

* Adopted an ordinance relative to persons 16 and 17 years old participating in all activities of a volunteer fire department in the Town of Vienna.

* Approved the requested transfer of funds within the current Town budget.

* Approved the Transportation Safety Commission's recommendation to install reflectors to help correct an unsafe condition at Talahi Road and Park Street.

Town Attorney Is Fellow Of Trial Lawyers College

Town Attorney John F. Gionfriddo has recently become a Fellow of the American College of Trial Lawyers, an honor attained by only a small percentage of attorneys in the country.

The purpose of the organization is to improve the standards of trial practice, the administration of justice and the ethics of the trial branch of the law profession.

The College of Trial Lawyers currently numbers 3,700 Fellows in the United States and Canada. Membership is by invitation of the Board of Regents and is limited to one percent of the trial lawyers in each state. U.S. Chief Justice Burger is a Fellow, as was the late Leon Jaworski, special prosecutor in the Watergate case.

Mr. Gionfriddo was inducted into the American College of Trial Lawyers at a ceremony during the group's recent Spring Meeting in Boca Raton, Florida, attended by over 1,200 persons.

Mr. Gionfriddo has been practicing law in this area for 26 years and has been Town Attorney since 1966. He is a graduate of the Georgetown University School of Law and a member of the American Bar Association, Virginia State Bar, D.C. Bar and the Virginia Trial Lawyers Association.

Register Bikes for Protection

Bicycles are one of the most frequently stolen items reported to area police departments. Vienna Police statistics show that during the past year about 200 bicycles were reported stolen, while no more than 30 were returned to the owner.

Registration of bicycles with the police is an easy way to help protect your investment. The Vienna Police Department and the Vienna Optimist Club will sponsor a bicycle registration and rodeo on Saturday, May 21, from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. at the Vienna Community Center.
