The First Quarterly Recycling Day of 2022!

Town of Vienna Reaffirms AAA Bond Rating

Sound financial practices, a healthy fund balance and robust economic development helped lead to Vienna's latest AAA/Aaa bond rating from S&P Global Ratings and Moody's. The ratings made public last month are the highest available and have been maintained by the Town of Vienna for more than a decade.

"The highest bond rating available means the Town can borrow money from investors at the most favorable rate," said Finance Director Marion Serfass. "The bottom line is the highest bond rating saves the Town money."

The Town sought to reaffirm the ratings as it plans to issue \$12.5 million in general obligation bonds this month. These bonds will be used to pay for sidewalks, paving, park

improvements and water and sewer infrastructure. Vienna's bonds are typically issued every two years to fund capital projects and are repaid with meals taxes and water and sewer revenues rather than general fund dollars.

The Town's economic base remained strong throughout the pandemic with assessed values growing a cumulative 4% over the past five years. Moody's noted that its Aaa rating reflects Vienna's sizeable and growing tax base stemming from ongoing commercial and residential redevelopment. The strong financial standing is among the reasons the credit-rating agencies elevated Town's budgetary performance from adequate in 2020 to strong this year. 📈





Nutley Tree Replacement Begins

Callery pear trees have lived among the variety of trees on the Nutley Street median for decades. The blooms may be beautiful, but the Bradford variety is fragile in severe weather, non-native to Virginia and considered invasive. Over time, the spread of their seeds has led to an overabundance of Callery pear trees and a reduction in tree diversity in the region, which threatens the ecological balance among plants and wildlife in Virginia's urban forest.

Thanks to an anonymous donor, this non-native, invasive species will soon be removed from the Nutley Street median and replaced with native species, such as Black Gum, Honey Locust and Willow Oak that will provide beautiful color in the fall. Vienna Parks and Recreation maintenance staff will dismantle and remove the existing Callery pear trees and a contractor will remove the stumps and plant the new trees. All work will be overseen by Town arborist and park maintenance superintendent Jeremy Edwards.

"There are 27 Callery pear trees among 78 trees on the Nutley Street median," Edwards said. "We'll remove half of them in mid-March and replace them with native trees in April, and we will remove and replace the other half in the fall."

The work is expected to begin in mid-March between Princeton Terrace and Marshall Road. The project will require a temporary lane closure on Nutley Street between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m. daily. Overall, the project is expected to take up to four weeks from tree removal to replanting. 📍



Town Council Votes to Change Street Name

By Independence Day, Wade Hampton Drive in Vienna will be known as Liberty Street. The Town Council voted to rename the street Feb. 7 after a public hearing at which nearly one dozen residents voiced their support for changing the name.

The short street located off Maple Avenue had been known as Lewis Street, S.W. until 1962 when it was renamed for former slaveholder and Confederate general Wade Hampton in recognition of the 100th anniversary of the American Civil War. The street is roughly the location of where Hampton and his cavalry unit of about 600 men and horses came into Vienna at the end of December 1862 under the direction of Confederate General J.E.B. Stuart.

"I think we all know what was happening in the 1960s," said Vienna Mayor Linda Colbert referring to overt racism, particularly in southern states, during the Civil Rights Movement. "I like the name Liberty Lane because I think that's now what our Town is all about. We are all created equal, and we should all have equal liberties, and the name Liberty Lane puts the emphasis on it."

Liberty Lane was one of five options an ad hoc committee of residents and historians put forth for consideration. The committee was formed in June 2020 after resident Dee Dee Carter proposed the name change.

Town Leaf Mulching Options Under Consideration

For decades, the Town of Vienna leaf-mulching facility on Beulah Road, N.E. has produced mulch for residents.

Under the current program, the Department of Public Works collects leaves from the edge of Vienna streets from October through December. The leaves are transported to the mulching facility for storage. Approximately half of the collected leaves are mulched and delivered to Vienna residents throughout January, February, and March. The remaining leaves are currently delivered to Loudoun Composting.

The Town is now evaluating alternatives and related costs for the leaf collection and mulching program that

include a short-haul and long-haul option, and the Town Council wants to know what you think. The short-haul option eliminates mulch delivery while the long-haul option eliminates mulch delivery and the need to use the Beulah Road site.

Department of Public Works staff will present leaf-mulching options to the Town Council at a public hearing on Monday, March 21 at 8 p.m. in the Council Chambers at Vienna Town Hall. Town residents are encouraged to attend and provide feedback on the options at the meeting. Comments may also be emailed to the Town Clerk's office at MClark@viennava.gov. 




Lights Out for Earth Hour

How much good can be done in one hour? For the last 15 years, the World Wildlife Fund has led a global charge called Earth Hour, one hour where cities, towns and landmarks all over the world switch off the lights to raise awareness about environmental conservation. The Empire State Building, Piccadilly Circus in London, and the Sydney Opera House have turned off the lights in previous years.

This year, the Town of Vienna will also take part, turning the Town Green lights off from 8:30-9:30 p.m. on Saturday, March 26. The small gesture will mark the beginning of a month-long effort to raise awareness about climate change, plastic pollution and the importance of trees in Vienna.

The good news is that everyone and anyone can take part in Earth Hour. 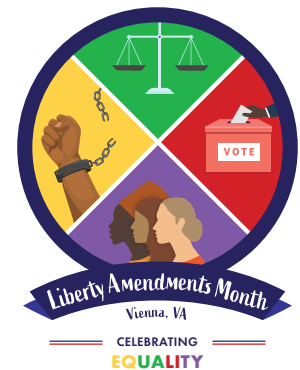

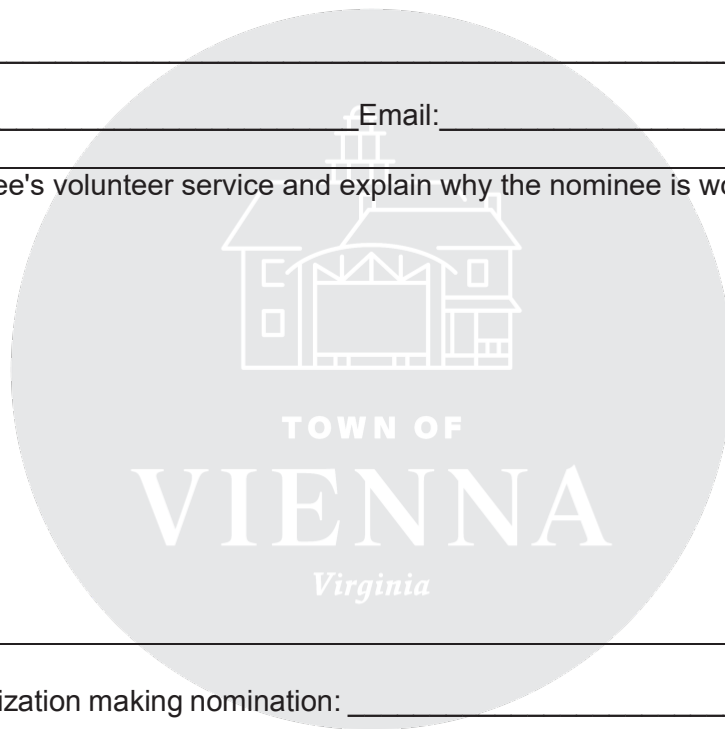
