Mayor Elected VML President

Mayor Charles Robinson has been elected president of the Virginia Municipal League (VML), a statewide service organization of local governments and agencies.

VML's membership includes virtually all of Virginia's cities and urban counties, and most of the state's towns. Its office in Richmond supplies legislative, public information, research, management training and legal services to local governments throughout Virginia.

Mayor Robinson has been a member of VML's Executive Committee since 1976. He chaired the League's Town Section from 1976 to 1979 and is the first chairman of the Virginia Municipal Group Self Insurance Association, established by VML in 1980 to provide workers' compensation coverage to local government agencies throughout the Commonwealth.

Paper Pickup

Beginning in 1984, the Town's newspaper pickup schedule will be revised. Papers will be collected in the northeast and northwest sections of Vienna on one Wednesday, and in the southeast and southwest the following Wednesday.

For example, the pickup dates for January will be:

- Jan. 4 & 18 - north side of town;
- Jan. 11 & 25 - south side of town.

Under this alternating system, all residents will receive bi-weekly newspaper pickup.

Pickup dates will be listed in the 1984 Town Calendar and the monthly Newsletter.

Rabies Clinic

Over 300 active rabies cases have been found this year among wild animals in Fairfax County. Make sure your dog or cat is protected by a current rabies vaccination as required by law.

A special low-cost rabies inoculation clinic will be held on Sunday, November 13, from 12 noon to 4 p.m. at the County Animal Shelter, 4500 West Ox Rd. in Fairfax. Dogs over a year old will receive a three-year vaccine for \$6. Dogs under a year old and all cats will receive a one-year vaccine for \$3.

In bringing animals to the clinic, dogs should be on a leash and cats confined to a box or basket.
