Yard Sale Rules

Residents are reminded that yard sales are limited to two per year for any one household.

Signs advertising a yard sale may be displayed for two days prior to the sale. Two signs measuring no more than four square feet each are permitted on the property where the sale will take place.

In addition, two directional signs of no more than two square feet each may be displayed elsewhere on private property with the owner's permission. No signs are allowed on utility poles or on public property.

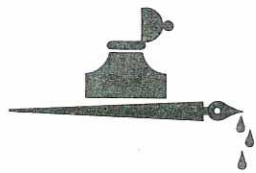

Town Council Action . . .

May 7, 1984

* Reversed the decision of the Historic Windover Board of Review and approved an application to construct a house at 322 West St. N.W.

* Awarded the franchise for natural gas service to Washington Gas Light Co.

* Approved the site plan modification requested for Tech Center II in the Vienna Technology Park. The owner/developer is to plant and maintain evergreens six feet or more in height along the entire line abutting the W&OD Regional Park trail.

* Approved a waiver to install a wooden fence between the Town Hall property and abutting residences, provided written approval is obtained from the adjacent property owners.

* Accepted a bid of \$205,000 by E.E. Lyons Construction Co., Inc., for the Cottage Street rehabilitation project, funds to come from the general bond fund.

* Accepted a bid of \$47,466 by Owens and Dove, Inc., for the Marshall Road rehabilitation project, funds to come from the general bond fund.

May 21, 1984

* Conducted a public hearing on the proposed Town budget and real estate tax rate for fiscal year 1984-85.

* Denied a request for a waiver of the required water service deposit.

* Accepted two petitions from residents of the Windover Heights Subdivision concerning drainage and sanitary sewer problems. Directed the Town staff to take the necessary actions to correct these problems. The sanitary sewer problem is to be corrected immediately. The gas line in front of

310 Johnson St. S.W. is to be investigated and corrective action taken immediately.

* Requested the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors to continue recreation programs at Louise Archer School pending receipt of a report from the County Police Department. Also asked the Board to consider establishing an upper age limit for the recreation programs and to increase patrols at the school until the current problems there are abated.

* Accepted the bid of \$26,100 by Site Engineering and Construction Corp. for the Westwood Terrace Booster Station, funds to come from the water and sewer fund. The Town will seek reimbursement of funds from the developer.

* Accepted the bid of \$15,685 by Vernon E. Moses for concrete repairs, payment to come from the general fund. Appropriated \$1,581.05 from the contingency reserve to cover the difference between budgeted funds and the bid received.

Chief of Management Services Appointed

Nancy E. Novak has been appointed Chief of Management Services for the Town of Vienna. Her duties will include personnel, budget and risk management functions, and serving as assistant to the Town Manager.

Before coming to Vienna July 1, Novak was Assistant to the Town Manager in Munster, Indiana, for five years. She also served as Acting Town Manager of Munster for several months earlier this year.

Novak received a bachelor's degree in business administration from Purdue University and a master of public administration from Indiana University. Her professional affiliations include the American Society for Public Administration, the International City Management Association and Pi Alpha Alpha National Honorary Society for Public Administrators.

Keep Branches Trimmed

Town ordinance requires property owners to keep tree branches, shrubs, vines and hedges trimmed so that they do not overhang sidewalks and streets.

On some streets, tree branches and other growth obstruct the passage of pedestrians and bicyclists and block the view of motorists.

Owners will be notified if vegetation on their property is obstructing the right-of-way and will have 10 days in which to cut the growth. If it is not cut within that time, the Public Works Department will do the cutting and the cost will be billed to the owner.

Baseball School

Little League Baseball School for children aged 7 through 12 will be held at Yeonas Park August 6-11.

Boys and girls will learn the fundamentals of baseball or reinforce skills already learned. Participants should wear long pants and tennis shoes and bring a glove. Other equipment will be furnished.

Children may attend from 9 a.m. to noon or from 1 to 4 p.m. The fee is \$4, payable the first day of the school. To register, call the Parks and Recreation Department at 938-8000 ext. 277.

Rabies Vaccine Won't Hurt Pets

Some pet owners who took their dogs and cats to the rabies vaccination clinic at the fire station last May inadvertently received a one-year certificate for a three-year shot and may be concerned that another shot next year will harm the animals.

There is no danger, according to Dr. Melissa Gates of the Northern Virginia Veterinary Medical Association. The one-year and three-year vaccines used at the clinic are exactly the same. The extra charge for the three-year shot is for record-keeping costs.

Always Use Your Whole Address

New residents and out-of-towners are often confused by Vienna's division into quadrants and the "mirror image" addresses of some streets that lie in two different quadrants, for example, Tapawingo Road Southeast and Southwest or Church Street Northeast and Northwest.

When calling for emergency police or fire and rescue service, be sure to give your *complete* address, including quadrant, to ensure the fastest response time. This is also important when ordering merchandise to be delivered or commissioning work at your home. One resident suggests giving the two intersecting streets as well as the complete address.
