Vienna Parking Survey Begins Feb. 1

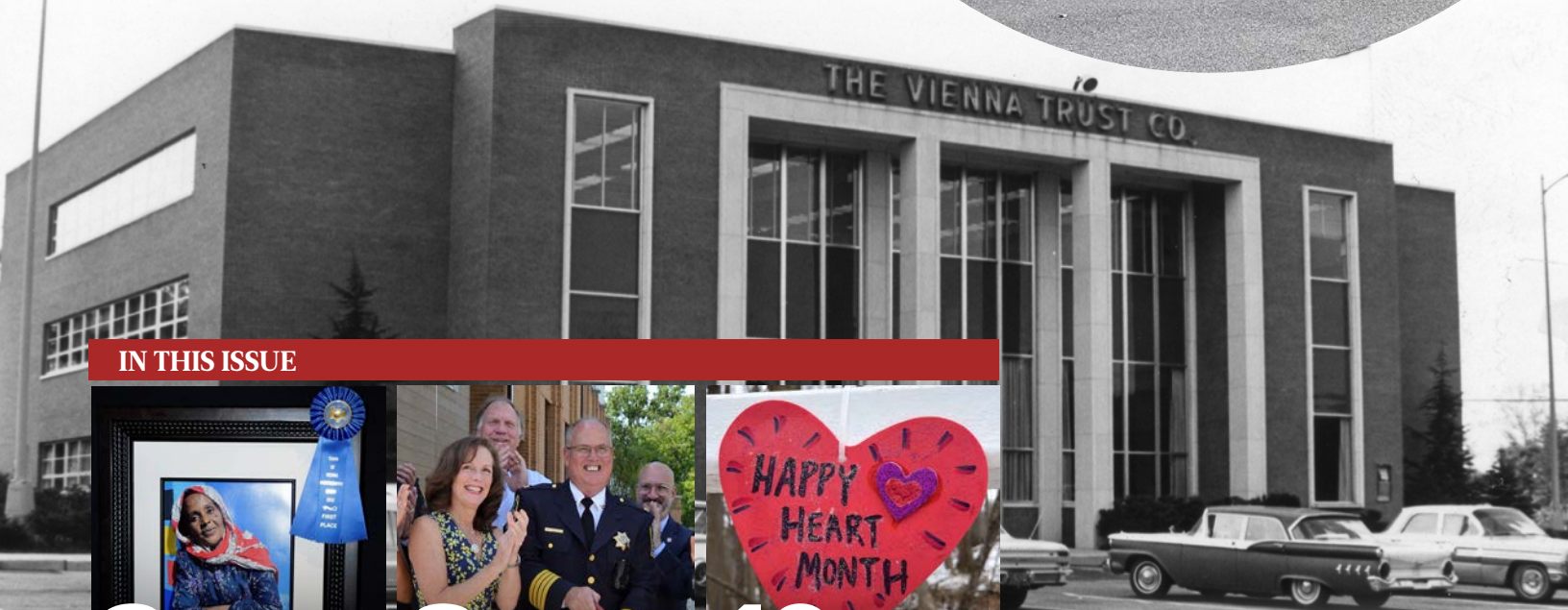

"Part of the study involves a survey of residents and business owners to understand their concerns regarding on-street parking and parking in public and private business areas," said Economic Development Director Natalie Monkou. "The study will help inform our plan to address current parking needs and anticipate future needs as they relate to the Town's zoning code update."

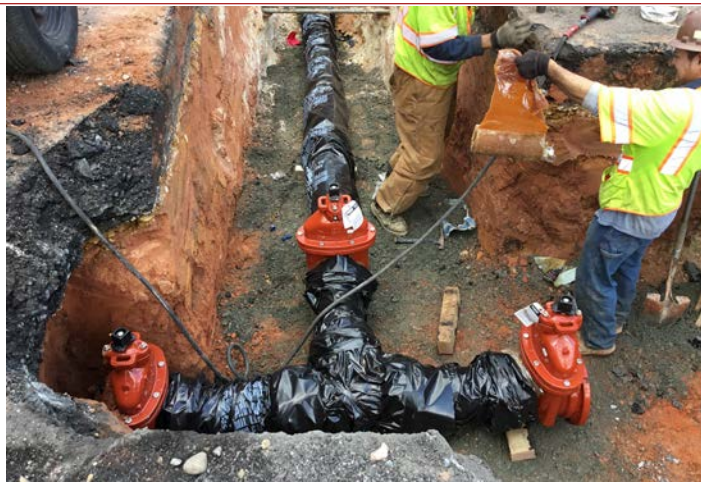

Pardon Our Pipes

Did you know the Town of Vienna supplies water to parts of Fairfax County just outside the Town limits? About 30% of the 131 miles of water mains maintained by the Vienna Public Works Department are found in subdivisions surrounding the Town. It is the Town's responsibility to keep the pipes in good working order and replace them when needed. Over the last decade, the Town has replaced over 10 miles of aging water mains and that is what Frank Torre, project engineer for the Town of Vienna, and his team, continue doing.

Out of the 12 water main replacement projects for FY2023, nine are complete and the last remaining three are either in progress or planned, all of them outside of the Town. These projects may be beyond Town limits, but they are just as important as all the others. "Based on boundaries, these projects may seem like they aren't the Town's responsibility, but below ground, they are," said Frank Torre. "It's incumbent upon us to ensure all Town water pipes are in good, working condition—no matter where they lead to." Each project takes place in stages. Staff identify pipes that need replacing, project timelines and traffic control patterns are established,



and property owners and residents are notified. For out-of-town work, special permits are required from VDOT. Work begins when existing utilities are marked, and pipe locations are verified. Water services, gas services, buried electric lines, and fiber optic cables all must be carefully protected from damage via a hand digging process. Construction crews then replace existing 4" thru 8" cast iron water mains with new concrete lined ductile iron water pipes.

Extra water valves located under the pavement and new hydrants, which allow for an extra level of fire protection and improved water quality, are also installed. The new pipes are then flushed and tested for pressure and bacteria. When testing is complete water services are transferred to the new main and restored to households. In the end, these projects benefit everyone who receives water services from the Town. "Our ongoing work will give customers access to clean, safe water for years to come," says Frank.

The last water main replacement project outside of Town will take place on Concerto Circle and is scheduled to begin in late February 2023. To learn more about this project and others, visit www.viennava.gov/watermainprojects. 📍

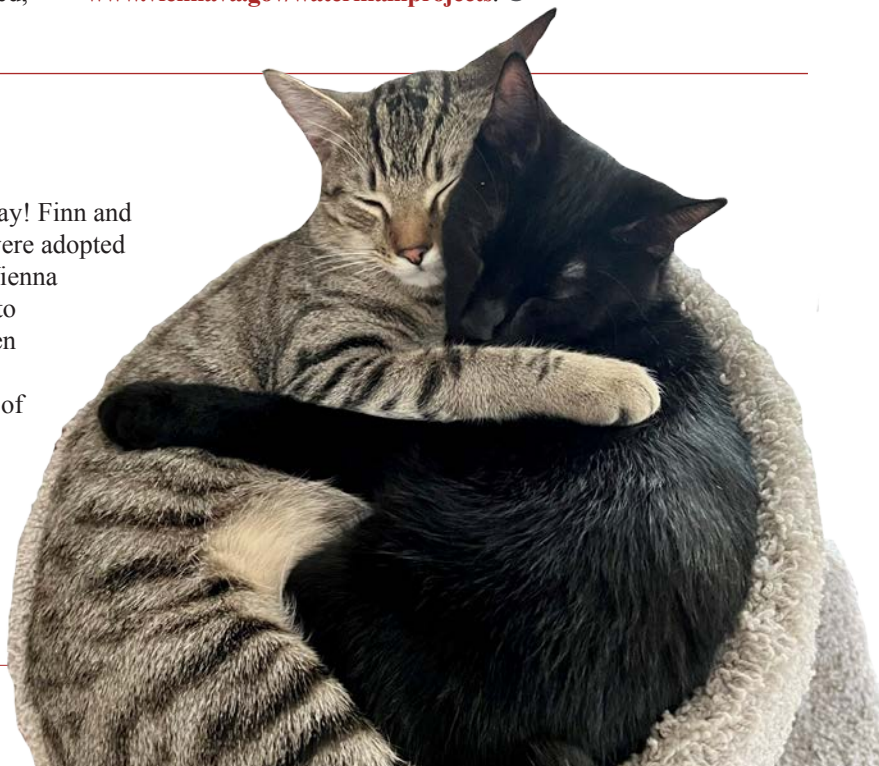


Mayor's Pet of the Month

Vienna Police Captain Gets Firsthand Experience in the FBI

Have you ever wanted an inside look at the FBI? Well, for one of Vienna's finest, he got to do just that! Following in the footsteps of Vienna Police Chief Jim Morris and Deputy Chief Dan Janickey, Captain Art Sylmar has become just the third person in the Vienna Police Department to graduate from the FBI National Academy.

Thanks to his 25 years of service and leadership with the Vienna Police Department, Captain Sylmar was recommended by Chief Morris and selected by the FBI to participate in the invitation-only academy. Captain Sylmar began the intensive 11-week program last October in Quantico, Va., at the same facility where the FBI trains its new special agents and intelligence analysts.

He attended alongside members of law enforcement from all over the world and focused his time on crime scene management, forensics and investigations, public information, social media, and physical fitness. When he wasn't in the classroom, he was in the gym, training with academy fitness instructors in preparation for the infamous "Yellow Brick Road," a grueling 6.1 mile run complete with obstacle courses. Upon completion of the course, Sylmar received a yellow brick to signify his accomplishment.

Captain Sylmar graduated on Dec. 8, 2022 and is excited to apply everything he learned in the academy, right here in Vienna. "This has been an experience of a



lifetime that I'll never forget," says Sylmar. "I'm forever grateful to the Bureau and Chief Morris for giving me this opportunity. I can't wait to take the skills and knowledge I've gained and use it to better myself and the community."

The FBI National Academy's develops and enhances future law enforcement leaders. Nearly 54,000 graduates have completed the FBI National Academy since it began in 1935 and we're proud to say three (and soon to be four) of those graduates have come from Vienna. Vienna Police Captain Tu Farhan is currently attending the academy and will graduate in the spring. 🇺🇸

During a recent grand opening celebration at a new Vienna business, I was happy to share in the joyous family celebration with the community and taste some of the store's

products while welcoming the new owners to our wonderful Town. Amid the festivities, I happened to notice a vision-impaired individual being escorted into the business to make a purchase. This brought to mind a topic I have raised in just about every Town Council meeting and conference session when the issue of new sidewalks is raised.

Many have spoken about maintaining Vienna's small-town charm. This is something I support, and for me, small-town charm includes the concepts of kindness, inclusiveness, and compassion towards all. The more walkable our community is, the safer our community is, and the more connected our community is. All of this is part of maintaining the best of what Vienna has always been; and making the community a better place in the future - for everyone.

Almost every day that I move around Vienna, I see more and more parents pushing young children in strollers; residents walking (many using walkers, canes, or mechanized devices); children walking to and from schools – or simply walking to friend's home or local business; and parents teaching younger children how to walk or ride bikes. Where to Take Hard-to-Recycle Items

As a dedicated environmentalist, I am often asked about how to recycle and where to take certain items for proper recycling. The short answer is that most plastics are very hard to recycle, which is why reducing and reusing should be the priority. Only a few things can be recycled curbside, and any item you take for recycling pretty much anywhere must be clean and dry.

Several businesses are stepping up their efforts to accept hard-to-recycle items. Here's a list of some in our area and what they will accept:

Trace-The Zero Waste Store on Church Street accepts toothpaste tubes, deodorant containers, empty floss containers and toothbrushes, pens, markers, plastic pencils and glue sticks for recycling. While you're in store, consider learning about a more sustainable options for everyday use.

Nordstrom or Nordstrom Rack accepts empty beauty product containers for recycling.

Most Home Depot stores accept compact fluorescent light bulbs, plastic plant pots and rechargeable batteries for recycling.

MOM's Organic Market accepts old shoes, wine bottle corks, and eyeglasses. The store also accepts small electronics that can be refurbished for people in need.

Giant, Safeway, Harris-Teeter and WaWa accept clean, dry plastic bags and mailers for recycling. Mailers must be all plastic, with stickers cut off.



Don't forget to take clean glass containers to one of three purple bins for recycling. They're located on Mill Street in Vienna, Dunn Loring School at Idylwood and Gallows roads and at the Providence Community Center on Vaden Drive.

Batteries weighing less than 11 lbs. can be dropped off in the box at the Vienna Community Center and at Vienna Town Hall during normal business hours. Town of Vienna residents can also recycle most electronics, batteries, scrap metal and motor oil by taking them to quarterly recycling days at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill Street, NE. The next date is Saturday, March 4, 2023, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. For a full list of accepted items, visit www.viennava.gov/recycling.

Hard-to-recycle items can also be taken to the I-66 Transfer Station in Fairfax County. It accepts things like used cooking oil, electronics, scrap metal, and some types of batteries, glass and compost. Details are available online: <https://bit.ly/I-66Transfer>.

Wherever you take your recyclables, please make sure they are clean. Dirty items contaminate everything else and slow the process. The more care you take to sort properly means your items are more likely to be recycled. ♻️

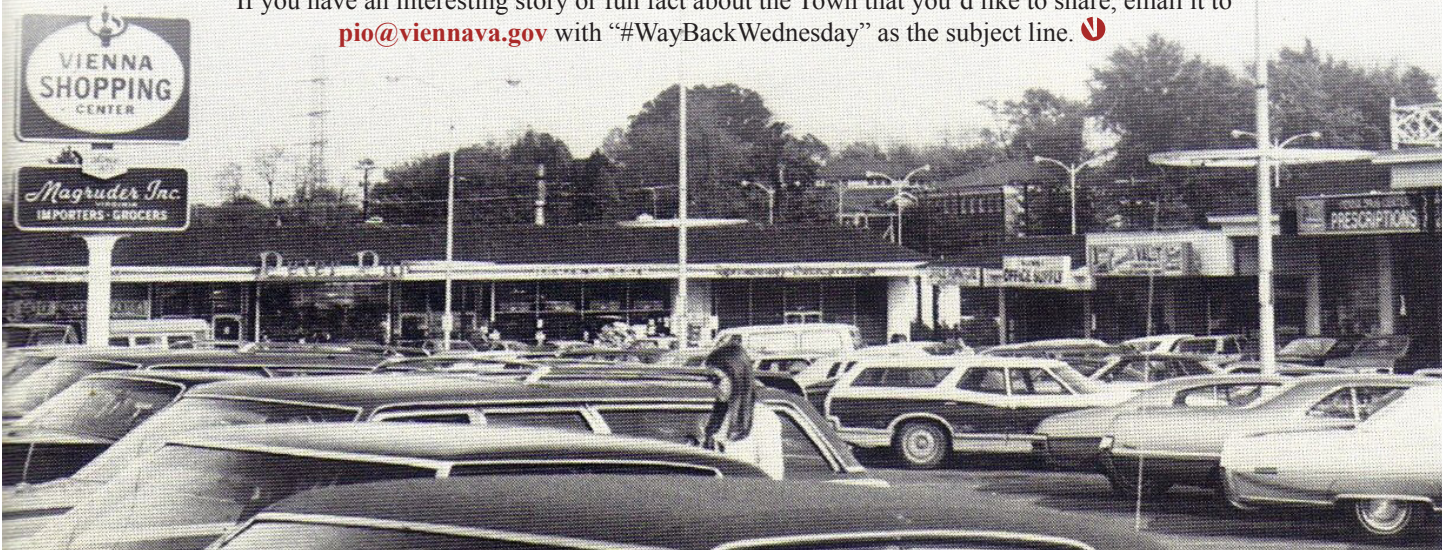

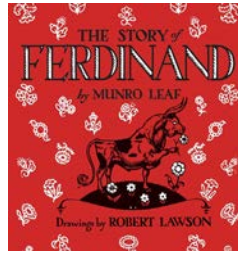
