



VIENNA POLICE HIGHLIGHTS

March 17, 2023

The following summary contains various incidents of general interest as well as vehicular crashes handled by the Town of Vienna, Virginia Police Department from March 10, 2023 to March 16, 2023. Readers are reminded an “arrest” is based upon probable cause and does not always mean someone was physically taken into custody. Furthermore, it does not mean an individual is automatically guilty of a crime. Judicial outcomes and post-arrest proceedings can be researched through the appropriate court’s website.

On July 1, 2021, citizens will be able to access Community Policing data via <https://data.virginia.gov/stories/s/rden-cz3h>. The Vienna Police Department had started complying with this state law in July of 2020. The portal will contain all non-consensual investigatory stops made by the Vienna Police Departments and other law enforcement agencies in the commonwealth.

UPDATE – Car Thefts and Tamperings

The National Capital Area, specifically the Northern Virginia area, has seen increased vehicle tampering incidents and vehicle thefts. A recent pattern has been identified where suspects enter the area in stolen vehicles and cruise streets between 3:00 AM and 7:00 AM. In addition to rifling through unlocked cars for valuables and money, they steal the vehicle when they encounter keys left in it. The Vienna Police Department would like to remind our community members to please stay vigilant, secure their cars and take the keys inside, and close and lock all doors of residences and garages to prevent criminals from targeting your property. Additionally, please call the police if you notice suspicious vehicles or people in your area, and share Ring doorbell or other security camera footage with us if you capture video related to these incidents. The Vienna Police Department is working closely with other Law Enforcement agencies in the region, coordinating our resources to investigate these crimes.

Arrest – Narcotics Violation 23-002255

March 11 7:22 p.m.

An officer observed a vehicle traveling through the apartment complex and recognized the driver as a man who was wanted on outstanding warrants. The officer initiated a traffic stop and confirmed the warrants.

Ofc. Mayar arrested the 33-year-old man from Cedar Lane, SE, Vienna, and transported him to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center. During the arrest, the officer found the man was in possession of narcotics. The two warrants were served on the man charging Felony Credit Card Theft and Misdemeanor Credit Card Fraud (*reference March 10, 2023, Vienna Police Highlights Incident #23-002066*). The man was also charged with Felony Possession of Cocaine and Misdemeanor Possession of Marijuana for the narcotics that were found during his arrest.

Arrest – Driving While Intoxicated 23-002265

Maple Avenue and Pleasant Street, NW

March 12 4:00 a.m.

An officer observed a vehicle stopped in the roadway on eastbound Maple Avenue. Upon the officer's interaction with the driver, they detected signs of impairment. The driver failed to complete a series of field sobriety tests and was placed under arrest.

After providing a sample of his breath for analysis, Ofc. Fitchue transported the 18-year-old man to the Fairfax County Adult Detention Center where he was charged with Driving While Intoxicated.

Grand Larceny

On October 25, 2022, between 1pm and 2pm, the subject pictured below is suspected of stealing a wallet from a purse of an unattended shopping cart at Giant, located in Vienna, VA. The suspect is seen on security camera approach a shopper's cart as her back was turned, reach into her purse which was in the top "seat" area of the cart and take the victim's wallet from the purse. The wallet contained several credit/debit cards as well as the victim's driver's license. The suspect then turned and exited with the wallet. The suspect is a B/M and was wearing blue jeans, a black hoodie, a patterned face mask, a tan backpack, and a San Antonio Spurs hat.
