Organizations May Request Funds

Non-profit organizations seeking donations of Town funds during fiscal year 1987-88 should submit their re-

quests to the Town Manager by Friday, February 27.

Requests must be made in writing, accompanied by a copy of the organization's budget and a current financial statement listing all sources of revenue.

Address requests to the Town Manager at Town Hall.

During March and April, Town departments will submit their individual budgets to the Town Manager for review. Copies of the proposed budget will be available for the public beginning May 11. A public hearing on the budget is scheduled for June 1 and adoption by the Town Council June 15.

Town Council Action

DECEMBER 15, 1986

- Referred to the Transportation Safety Commission for study and recommendations a letter from the Council Square Homeowners Association concerning traffic safety problems at East and Church Streets, N.E.
- Appointed Ted Thomas to fill the unexpired term of John Everhard on the Planning Commission, the term to expire January 17, 1988.
- Appointed Shirley Damon to the Board of Architectural Review for a term to expire December 15, 1987.
- Scheduled a public hearing for March 9 on a proposed revision of the sign ordinance.

DECEMBER 22, 1986

- At a special meeting, adopted a resolution appealing to the Fairfax County Board of Supervisors the decision of the County Planning Commission to approve the application for development of Virginia Center adjacent to the Vienna Metro Station.

JANUARY 5, 1987

- Denied a request for 72% lot coverage (25% allowed by the Town Code) for Vienna Medical Park, corner of Park and Locust Streets, S.E.
- Denied a request for 65.4% lot coverage for expansion of Vienna Medical Clinic, 135 Center St., S.
- Approved the final plat of Townes of Vienna Subdivision, Section Two, corner of Nutley and Roland Streets, S.W.
- Approved the Town's participation in funding of the State and Local Legal Center, an organization that advances and defends the interests of state and local governments before the Supreme Court, at a cost to the Town of \$250.
- Requested the Town Manager to inform Fairfax County that the Town will provide water service to Ankerdale Subdivision on Drewlaine Drive off Old Courthouse Road as soon as a request for service is received.
- Recommended to the Circuit Court the reappointment of John Fitzgerald to a five-year term on the Board of Zoning Appeals.

Celebrate Black History Month at Patrick Henry

Live story theater, films, a gospel music concert, a rededication, and several other community events are planned at Patrick Henry Library during February in celebration of Black History Month.

The festivities begin on Tuesday, February 3, at 7 p.m. with a free showing of two films, "Black History, Lost, Stolen or Strayed" and "Harriet Tubman and the Underground Railroad." These documentary films explore the unique contributions of Black citizens to the development of modern America.

FILMS FOR KIDS, GOSPEL SONGS, AND MORE

The library will offer a full day of free family activities on Saturday, February 7, starting at 10 a.m. with more films for children aged three and up on an African folktale theme. At 11:15 a.m., the Gospel Singers of First Baptist Church of Vienna will present a 30-minute concert of traditional favorites, followed by the rededication of the Carter Memorial Collection of books on Black Americana. Vienna Town Councilman George Lovelace will introduce the Carter family, who will present the library with an oil portrait of early Vienna library supporter William McKinley Carter. Refreshments will be served courtesy of the Friends of Patrick Henry Library.

Saturday's activities continue at 2 p.m. with a live performance by the Maryland Hall Story Theatre of "A Story, A Story," a collection of folktales from faraway places, including Africa and Haiti. The Maryland Hall Story Theatre is an outreach program of Maryland Hall for the Creative Arts, designed to bring the cultural enrichment of live theater to children aged five and up. PANEL DISCUSSION OF "BLACKS IN VIENNA"

Local history buffs won't want to miss the next Black History Month event at the library, a free panel discussion entitled "Blacks in Vienna" on Tuesday, February 10, at 7:30 p.m. Speakers Vondell Carter, Sylvia Taylor and Deloris Evans will present an overview of the development of the local Black community and its impact on the Vienna of today.

Black History Month will conclude with another free film showing on Tuesday, February 17, at 7 p.m. "The Autobiography of Miss Jane Pittman" starring Cicely Tyson, depicts the long life of a former slave who marches for her civil rights at the age of 110.

Complementing these activities at the library will be a special photographic exhibit on loan from the Anacostia Neighborhood Museum. "Black Women: Achievements Against the Odds," a series of portraits, will be on display February 2-12.
