Cleanup Ends

The annual Spring Cleanup will wind up this month on the south side of town. Cleanup crews are currently working in southwest Vienna and will move into the southeast quadrant on May 11.


Cleanup crews will pick up free of charge unwanted furniture, appliances, building materials, brush and other discards placed at the curbside. Each residence is limited to 300 pounds each of concrete and scrap metal, and two major appliances. Brush and tree limbs should be cut to 10-foot lengths.

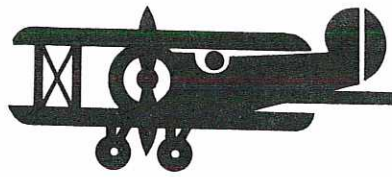

TOWN COUNCIL ACTION

MARCH 16, 1987

- Referred to the Planning Commission the revised development plan for Vienna Gateway East, to be known now as Vienna Village.
- Requested the Town Attorney to draft an ordinance soliciting proposals for a franchise to use Town right-of-way for a long-distance communications system. AT&T will be permitted to begin installation of a fiber optic cable along the W&OD Trail subject to receipt and approval of a letter of intent to accept a franchise. The agreement is to include language relative to trees and groundcover and to hold the Town harmless from negligent or accidental damage to the facilities.
- Approved the final plat of the resubdivision of Lot 120, Ayr Hill Subdivision.
- Approved the final plat of Ridgewood Subdivision with the following modifications:
 - Conservation easement to be conveyed in fee to the adjoining property owners for landscaping, with right of entry reserved to the developer during construction.
 - Variance granted to permit the fence to be constructed to a height of eight feet.
 - A portion of the sidewalk on the south side of Ridgewood Court to be waived and construction funds placed in escrow.
 - Chain of title to include covenant requiring disclosure of property's proximity to the Town pistol range and property yard.

Also approved the request of the Ridgewood Subdivision developers to construct a storm drainage structure across Town owned land, subject to meeting specifications established by the Director of Public Works. A 10-foot easement was granted particularly on Lots 158A and 159E.

- Authorized the Town Manager to commit the Town for 10% of the cost of installing a traffic light at Beulah Road and Church Street.
 - Reappointed Jerry Barnett and Marshall Potter to two-year terms on the Planning Commission.
 - Adopted an amendment to the Town Code relative to sewers and sewage disposal.
 - Adopted amendments to the flood plain ordinance.
 - Recommended the following persons to serve as Town election officials:
 - Chief Election Officer: Regina Jordan
 - Assistant Chief: Nancy Robeson
 - Clerks: Jacqueline Clark; Anna Wagner; James Bender; Joanne Cook; Lewis Robeson; Elfrieda Morrison; Donald Upchurch; Corrine Hanna
 - Alternate: Mary Thompson
- The Chief Election Official is to be paid \$100, the Assistant Chief \$85, and the Clerks \$75 each. Coffee, donuts and lunch will be provided from budgeted funds.

- Reapproved the minutes of the special meeting of February 18 to show quotations of all bidders on the bond issue to the last decimal place.

APRIL 6, 1987

- Approved the contract with TelPlus MidAtlantic, Inc., for a new phone system for Town Hall and other Town facilities at a cost of \$77,338 from budgeted funds.
- Requested Town staff, Historic Vienna, Inc., and Showke George to work out a plan for improving parking facilities behind the Freeman House and report back to Council.
- Appropriated \$5,515 from the contingency reserve account for repairs and improvements to the Bowman House basement.
- Accepted the bid by William B. Hopke Co., Inc., of \$57,861 for storm drainage improvements on Audreys Court, Park Street and Kingsley Road.
- Accepted the bid by Chasen's Business Interiors of \$5,194.15 for a modular work station in the Public Works Department.
- Informed all banking institutions having Town accounts of the persons granted draft authority. Appointed John Schoeberlein Acting Town Treasurer.

Choral Society Now Rehearsing

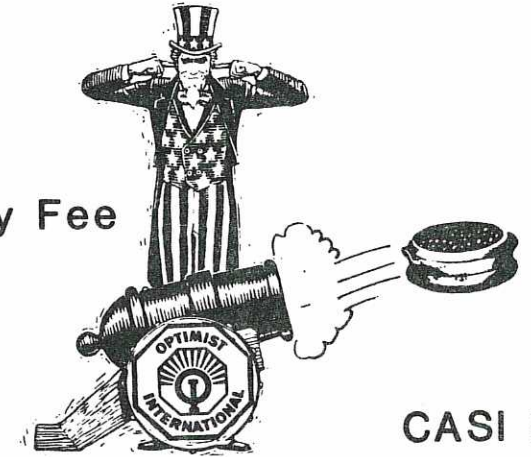
