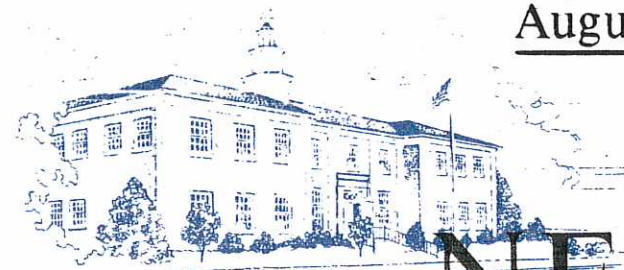

## Change in Trash Regulations Proposed

At its August 17 meeting, the Town Council will consider a proposed change in Town trash regulations governing pickup of stoves, refrigerators, washers and driers, hot water heaters and similar items. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. at Town Hall.

Fairfax County now requires these heavy or bulky metal items, known as "white goods," to be separated from other trash before disposal at the I-66 solid waste facility. The new requirement is the first phase of the County's Waste Reduction Program, initiated to conserve limited sanitary landfill space.

Council will consider a proposal that stoves, refrigerators and other white goods may no longer be included for pickup during the Spring and Fall Cleanups, but would be picked up on an appointment basis for a fee of \$15.

## Service Awards

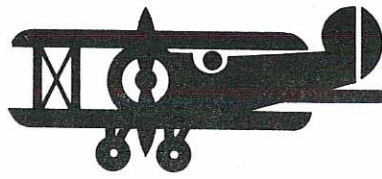

# TOWN COUNCIL ACTION

JUNE 15, 1987

- Approved the purchase of jackets for the James Madison High School girls softball team, coaches and assistant coaches, at a cost not to exceed \$1,000, to be funded from the donation account and, if necessary, from the contingency account.
- Conducted a public hearing on a proposed amendment to the zoning code regarding conditional uses in RM-2 zones. This hearing will be continued at the August 17 meeting.
- Approved the draft Broadview Community Plan, for planning purposes only, with the understanding that no construction be undertaken to abutting property owners until they are furnished copies of the plans including evaluation of the probability for saving trees.
- Appointed Peat, Marwick Main & Co. to perform audit services for the Town for the period covering FY 1986-87, 1987-88 and 1988-89.
- Took no action on a proposed site plan modification for Tech Center II, 901 Follin Lane, S.E., and referred the proposal to the Town staff for a recommendation.
- Approved the application for the development of 23 condo units (16 townhouse units and 7 one-floor units) at the corner of Park and Locust Streets, S.E. Permitted 56% lot coverage and granted front and rear yard set back waivers.
- Approved a new 1,500-square foot painting facility for Vega Precision Laboratories, subject to a written commitment from Vega within 10 days to comply with the governing ordinance.
- Approved the landscape plan for Perpetual Savings Bank, 535 Maple Ave., W., with the provision that a maple tree be incorporated into the plan.
- Adopted the Town budget for fiscal year 1987-88 and set the following tax rates: real estate, 31¢ per \$100 valuation; bank net capital, 80¢ per \$100 valuation; utility tax, residential - 20% of first \$15, commercial - 15% of first \$300.
- Set the water rate at \$1.02 per 1,000 gallons for town residents and \$1.36 per 1,000 gallons for out-of-town customers. Set the sewer rate for all customers at \$2.10 per 1,000 gallons.

JUNE 22, 1987

- Conducted a public hearing on proposed revisions to the sign ordinance. This hearing is recessed until the September 14 Council meeting.

JULY 6, 1987

- Following a public hearing, awarded a long-distance com-

munications franchise to AT&T in the amount of \$5,000 franchise fee along with a \$50,000 bond. AT&T is to add language to the franchise documents relative to restoration of trees and plants along the W&OD Trail.

- Following a public hearing, rezoned the property at 511 Marshall Rd., S.W., from RS-16 to RS-12.5.
- Released the public improvement bond for Cunningham Park Subdivision and accepted the improvements into the Town system.
- Waived the off-site improvements required in connection with the subdivision of the property at 503 Park St., S.E. Funds will be escrowed for possible future installation of a concrete sidewalk along the Tapawingo Road side.
- Approved additional parking and a revised landscape plan for National Health Laboratory, 1007 Electric Ave., S.E., on condition that the trees shown on the plan have a 4" minimum trunk diameter and that a plan be submitted for promoting the use of Metro by employees and the public.
- Awarded the following bids:
  - F&F-Jacobs, Sons, of Baltimore for police uniforms.
  - Wilbar Truck Equipment Co. of Springfield for a rear loader refuse body at a price of \$20,997.
  - Central Motor Co. of Springfield for a trash truck cab and chassis at a price of \$51,979, to come from bond funds.
  - Central Motor Co. for a truck-tractor and two demolition trailers at a price of \$114,970, to be financed through a three-year lease purchase agreement.
  - Marantha Drapery Service of Woodbridge to replace and install draperies at Town Hall at a cost of \$5,364.24.
- Reappointed Town officials and made committee appointments for this fiscal year.
- Reappointed Ron Faett to the Local Administrative Retirement Committee as a representative of the financial community for the period July 1, 1987, through June 30, 1989.
- Set September 14 for a public hearing on a proposed ordinance relative to dangerous dogs.
- Rescheduled the September 28 Council meeting for September 21.
- Agreed to join with Fairfax County in a local emergency planning district with the understanding that the Town will have representation on that committee.
- Set the fee for a special trash pickup at \$40.

## Halloween Parade Call for Floats

Vienna area businesses, service clubs, school groups and other community organizations are invited to enter floats in the 41st annual Vienna Halloween Parade. This year's parade will be held on Wednesday evening, October 28.

"The Blessings of Freedom" is the parade theme, in honor of the Bicentennial of the U.S. Constitution. Floats should be designed to depict one or more of the freedoms guaranteed by the Constitution. The rights of free speech, religion, press, voting and others may be portrayed historically or in a modern way.

The Halloween Parade is sponsored by the Greater Vienna Chamber of Commerce and the Vienna Jaycees in cooperation with the Town of Vienna. For parade entry application forms, call the Chamber of Commerce at 281-1333. Specifications for floats must be submitted by September 30. All entries are subject to approval by the Halloween Parade Committee.

## "Battery for Life"

During the winter of 1985-86, the town lost four lives and three homes in a series of tragic fires that could have been averted if the residents had been alerted. Why weren't they?

This question led to the creation of a fire prevention program called "Battery for Life." In each of the fatal fires, the residents could have been alerted if their smoke detectors had been equipped with batteries that worked.

Any citizen who makes an appointment for a home fire safety survey will receive, free of charge, a spare battery for each smoke detector in the home. The batteries are delivered by the firefighter who makes the safety survey.
