Cleanup Scheduled Next Month

Vienna's annual Fall Cleanup will be conducted next month according to the schedule shown below.

1987 Fall Cleanup Schedule

STARTING DATE	QUADRANT
October 5	Northeast
October 9	Southwest
October 21	Southeast
October 28	Northwest

During the Cleanup, residents may place furniture, building materials, brush and other items at the curbside for free pickup by the Department of Public Works. To help keep Vienna looking as attractive as possible, please follow the Cleanup schedule and do not set out discards more than a week in advance of the starting date for your quadrant. Those who put items out too soon may be required to move them or to pay for a special trash pickup by the Town.

PLEASE NOTE: Stoves, dishwashers, refrigerators, washers, driers, hot water heaters and other major appliances must be separated from other discards set out for pickup. Fairfax County's new Waste Reduction Program requires that these items be separated from other trash before disposal at the County sanitary landfill. Each residence is limited to two major appliances per Cleanup.

Other limitations on the amount and type of debris are as follows:
 • Each residence is limited to 300 pounds each of concrete and scrap met-

al. Whole automobile bodies will not be picked up.

• Leaves will not be picked up by Cleanup crews. Leaves in plastic bags will be picked up on regular trash collection days.

• No debris of any kind may be brought in from outside of town for pickup by Cleanup crews.

Please separate brush and branches from other discards, and keep all Cleanup items away from regular trash, fire hydrants, water meters, gas valves, fences and utility poles. Resi-

Gardeners Can Purchase Mulch

During the last week of September, the Department of Public Works will deliver leaf mulch (composted leaves only, no wood) to town residents at a cost of \$40 for a one-ton dump truck load. Additional truckloads will be delivered to the same address on the same day for \$20 each.

This program will not only aid residents who wish to prepare their gardens this fall, but it will also create storage space for this year's crop of leaves.

Citizens must request leaf mulch delivery no later than Friday, September 18, and payment must be received by the Public Works Department by Wednesday, September 23. Deliveries will be made only from Monday, September 28, through Friday, October 2.

Because only a limited number of deliveries can be made during this week, orders for mulch will be taken on a first-come, first-served basis. Call Public Works, 255-6382, to sched-

Proclamation

WHEREAS, The Constitution of the United States of America guarantees each American the freedom and opportunity to build a free, prosperous and independent life, but each generation, in turn, must understand and defend these freedoms and opportunities otherwise, through carelessness or indifference, they will be lost; and


WHEREAS, It is of the greatest consequence that American citizens recognize and understand the provisions and principles contained in the Constitution of the United States of America in order to be able to support it properly and effectively; and


WHEREAS, The people of the United States should be deeply grateful to the nation's Founding Fathers for their wisdom and foresight in formulating and adopting the Constitution; and

WHEREAS, The heritage of our constitutional guaranties should be celebrated by appropriate ceremonies and activities during Constitution Week, September 17 through 23, 1987, as designated by proclamation of the President of the United States of America in accordance with Public Law No. 915;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, Charles A. Robinson, Jr., Mayor of the Town of Vienna, in the Commonwealth of Virginia, do hereby proclaim the week of September 17 through 23, 1987 as Constitution Week, in the Town of Vienna, and urge all citizens of said Town to pay special attention during that week to our Federal Constitution and the advantages of American Citizenship.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, I have hereunto set my hand and caused the Seal of the Town of Vienna, Virginia, to be affixed this 10th day of August in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and eighty-seven and of the Independence of the United States of America, the two hundred and eleventh.

Northern Virginia Senior Olympics

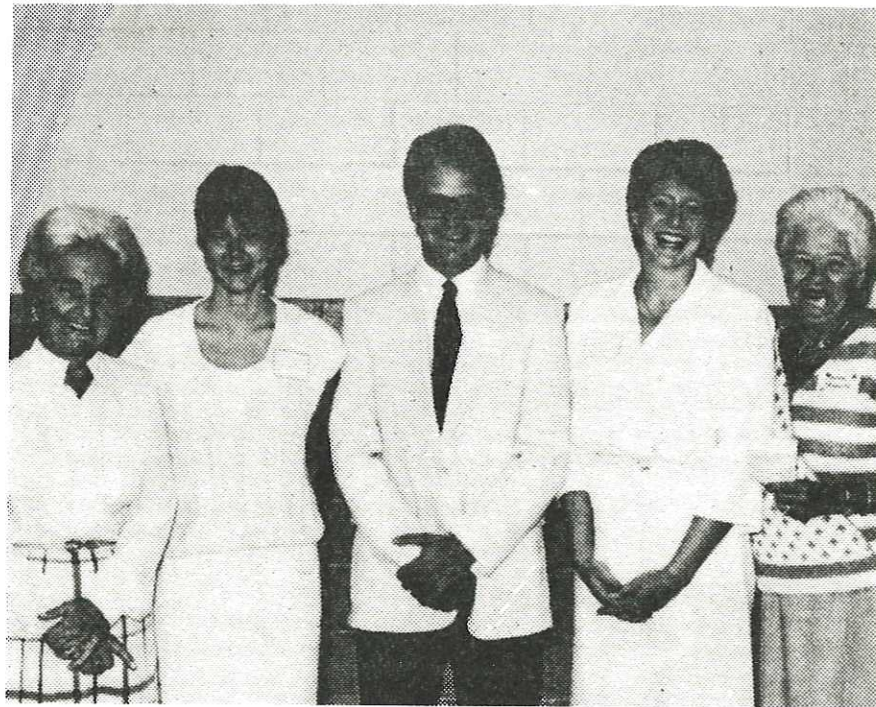

- 1. The nominees must contribute above and beyond normal performance of business activity.

5. "Citizen of the Year" must be nominated from the non-business community.

SUBMISSION OF NOMINATIONS

To expedite the submission of nominations, the following guidelines are offered to nominators:

- 1. On request from the Selection Committee, be prepared to submit a concise basic statement (not more than three pages in length) which contains the following information:
- Identification of the nominee
- A description of the achievement as such, and a description of the nominee's role, extent of responsibility and extent to which the achievement exceeds normal performance or business activity or has contributed significantly to the betterment of the community.
- Citations of tangible evidence demonstrating the stature of the achievement.
- Identification of the nominator.
2. To the extent feasible, supplement the basic nomination statement with pertinent exhibits, such as documents, testimonials, news stories, or other similar supporting evidence.
3. If the nominator wishes to have any of the supporting material when it has served its purpose, this should be clearly specified.
