No “Snow-prises” Here!

It’s safe to say that winter is in full swing after the first official snowstorm of 2024 in mid-January. Given the warmer temperatures and amount of rainfall just one week before, the inclement weather and impromptu snow day came as a surprise to many who thought the forecasted snowfall would prove to be a fluke. Though that wasn’t the case for the Town’s hard-working Parks and Recreation and Public Works staff members who know to be prepared for anything.

“In the days leading up, with temperatures approaching freezing and then dipping well below freezing during and after the storm, we tried to mitigate the impact,” said operations superintendent Jonathan Wooden. “We deployed our brine trucks, pre-treated roads, sidewalks, and parking lots, and spent day and night monitoring the situation.” Parks and Recreation Director Leslie Herman added “We were prepared for anything, but no event is without its challenges.”

Both Wooden and Herman agree that timing and temperature fluctuation can play a big role in how Town snow removal crews respond during a winter weather event. “It’s one thing to be prepared, it’s another to act accordingly during an hour-by-hour situation, especially when our crews are out in the elements” said Wooden. Herman confirms “But everyone acts as a team and is excellent at rolling with the punches and adapting to change.”

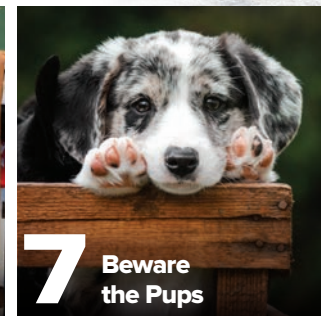
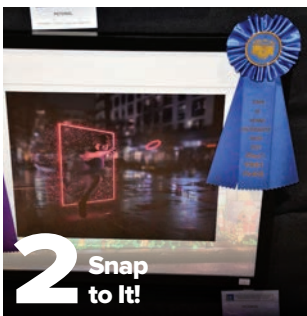

Charged Up for Battery Recycling

It’s been almost two years since the Town launched its battery recycling campaign and residents continue to take advantage of the program, dropping off batteries in droves. So far, public works has collected and shipped over 424.5 lbs. of household and tool batteries for recycling.

“After all this time, battery recycling is still going strong here in the Town,” says Adam Lehman. “Vienna residents have really shown us their commitment to recycling and helping the environment through this program which ultimately keeps batteries out of landfills.”

Mr. Lehman reminds everyone that recycling used batteries is not only the right thing to do, but also the safe thing to do. “Batteries contain toxic chemicals like lead, nickel, and mercury that can leak into drinking water sources if thrown in the trash. It’s best to recycle them. You’ll keep your family safe, help the environment, and keep our drinking water free of those toxic chemicals.”

Residents can drop off almost any regular size or rechargeable battery weighing less than 11 pounds that powers electronics, cell phones or children’s toys during regular business hours at Vienna Town Hall. Residents can use plastic zip bags for each lithium-ion battery, but bags are available at each recycling box location as well.

All batteries, including car batteries, can be dropped off at the Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill St. NE in Vienna on Quarterly Recycling days. The next Quarterly Recycling Day is scheduled for Saturday, March 2, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. Alternatively, if you can’t make it to a Quarterly Recycling Day, you can recycle batteries anytime at the Fairfax County I-66 or I-95 Transfer Station.

Richmond, Dillon and Billin'

In conversations about local government authority, you may have heard the phrase “but Virginia is a ‘Dillon Rule’ state,” and wondered what that means. The answer is pretty simple: A Dillon Rule state is one in which local government authority is derived solely from the powers conferred upon them by the State. The Vienna Town Council can’t do anything it wants about issues such as tree canopy loss or vape shops unless we have been granted specific authority by the state to do so.

This is a major restriction on what we can do at the local level. If the Town Council desires to act in an area where it doesn’t have state-bestowed authority, its only option is to “work Richmond” to try to get that authority.

So, how do we “work Richmond?” First, the Town establishes an annual list of legislative priorities to share

with our local senator and delegate (right now, Saddam Salim and Holly Siebold, respectively). Our state representatives consider the priorities in formulating their own draft bills to introduce into the Virginia House and Senate for further consideration. At times, council members get involved directly in the process, by testifying in support or opposition to a particular bill.

This year, the Town Council’s top three requests are

1. more local authority to address tree canopy loss;
2. opposition to any proposed nearby casino; and
3. no reduction in local zoning regulations.

To further push for these priorities, council members travel to Richmond annually while the Virginia General Assembly is in session, to make personal pleas and



meet with legislators. These trips are coordinated by the Virginia Municipal League (VML), an association of local jurisdictions which, among other things, lobbies for issues important to localities. During the year, council members may also serve on VML committees that draw up state-wide priorities for local authorities.

Finally, as council members, we try to stay in close contact with our legislative delegation, as well as elected officials in nearby jurisdictions. We exchange ideas and look for issues of common interest on which we can join forces. When it comes to seeking change in Richmond, there is power in numbers. 📌

Vienna, 1861. This vintage image depicts Professor Aeronaut Thaddeus Lowe's hot air balloon ascension on a reconnoitering expedition to Vienna, Va., during the Civil War. Known as the grandfather of the United States Air Force, Lowe built five balloons used to spy on the Confederate Army and was considered "the most shot-at man" due to his high profile in the air. He also built one of the largest balloons ever constructed to cross the Atlantic. 📍



Word from Juan

Beware of the Puppy Scam!

Here's a buyer-beware story that's sure to have you chasing your tail! It involves an online scam that pulls you in with images of cuddly puppies and promises to sell you your dream pet, only to have the fraudsters disappear with your money. In one case, the scammers supplied buyers with a Vienna address to pick up a puppy or a kitten they purchased online, only to have the buyers show up to find out they were victims of fraud! People from all over the United States and Canada have driven to this Vienna address to pick up a pet they paid for via phone, email, Zelle, or other sites that are constantly changing. It got so bad that at one point the homeowner decided to put up a front-door sign advising would-be pet buyers that they had been victims of fraud and to contact Vienna Police.

Detectives are working hard to shut down these sites, but the criminals keep opening new sites and changing their tactics. Since 2009, there have been 18 pet fraud case reports, and the most recent was on Dec. 16, 2023.

To avoid becoming a victim, be sure to do your research before purchasing a pet online. Check reviews, research reputable places to buy pets, and always pay in person once you have the pet in your hands. Don't be another victim of the puppy scam and lose hundreds or even thousands of dollars. Stay vigilant and be safe, Vienna! 📌
