VIENNA'S GROWING RECREATION PROGRAM

Vienna first created a Town Recreation Department in March of 1962. The new Department was headed by a part-time Recreation Director, and was established to provide summer playground programs.

From this small beginning six years ago, the Town's recreational activities have grown and diversified. The completion of the first wing of the Community Center in April of 1966, and the appointment at that time of a full-time Recreation Director, provided Vienna residents with a year-round recreational program, as well as a facility which permitted the broadening of recreational and cultural opportunities for all ages.

With the combining of the Town's Parks and Recreation Departments under the new Department of Parks and Recreation last year, and the decision to move ahead with construction of the Community Center's two-story addition, a comprehensive program of adult and youth recreational activities and instruction courses was made possible.

COMMUNITY CENTER FACILITIES

The original wing of the Community Center contained the offices, kitchen, rest rooms, lobby, and a large all-purpose room. The new addition includes a music room, storage room, and a lounge on the lower level. On the upper floor are rest rooms and two large meeting rooms on either side of a center hall. Each of these two rooms may be partitioned off with folding doors to make a maximum of seven smaller meeting rooms.

The addition is so constructed that groups using the two-story wing will have easy access to the kitchen facilities. A patio has been constructed in the "L" formed where the two buildings join. Doors leading from the new wing, and from the all-purpose room, to the patio provide additional space for use during warm weather.

TOWN HALL PROFILE

In forthcoming issues of the newsletter, it is planned to present a short biographical sketch and photograph of key personnel in your Town government. Since this newsletter is devoted primarily to the Community Center and our recreation programs, it is a pleasure to present the Director of Parks and Recreation, Mr. Judson D. Hockman.



As Vienna's first full-time Recreation Director, Mr. Hockman took over his duties in February of 1966. Well qualified for the post, "Jud" came to Vienna from Front Royal, Va., where he served in a similar capacity for more than four years.

Jud graduated from Lynchburg College in 1957, with a B.A. Degree in Physical Education. He has since received his Master's Degree in Education from the University of Virginia. He served three years with the U.S. Army Military Police Corps. He and his wife and son, Dale, reside in Vienna. Jud has twice been the recipient of the Jaycees Distinguished Service Award; once in Front Royal, and the second, the year following his arrival in Vienna.
