Halloween Parade October 26

The 42nd annual Vienna Halloween Parade will step off at 7 p.m. Wednesday, October 26. Leading the parade will be Grand Marshall Arn Kritsky, Vienna's contribution to the summer Olympic games held in Korea last month. Kritsky, a champion weightlifter, graduated from Oakton High School and George Mason University and is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Paul Kritsky, owners of Skandia Furs on Church Street.

This year's parade theme is "Scenes from the Silver Screen," marking the silver anniversary of the Greater Vienna Chamber of Commerce. This theme is generating some excellent float designs, and applications for floats are still being accepted. In addition to these colorful floats, the parade will feature marching bands, military units, antique cars, horses, cartoon characters, and many youth and adult specialty groups.

The parade will begin at Maple Avenue and Branch Road, follow Maple to Courthouse Road, turn left on Courthouse and left again on Locust Street to disband at Waters Field.

Children of all ages are invited to walk in the parade in their Halloween costumes. For safety reasons, CHILDREN MUST BE REGISTERED IN ADVANCE TO PARTICIPATE. Registration will be held in the children's section at Patrick Henry Library on Saturday, October 22, from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m.; Monday, October 24, from 1 to 4 p.m.; and Tuesday, October 25, from 3 to 7 p.m. Children must be accompanied by an adult at registration.

The children's parade route will end at Maple Avenue and Center Street to

Bag Prices to Rise

The price of plastic trash bags sold by the Town to residents will be increased when the current supply is depleted. The price for a box of 50 lightweight bags will increase from \$5.50 to \$7.50 and for a box of 100 heavy weight bags from \$18.50 to \$24 (includes 4.5% Virginia sales tax).

Fires in two refineries this summer resulted in a 51% increase in the cost of materials used to manufacture the bags and may also cause a shortage in the number of bags available.

The Town's current supplier still offers the lowest prices of those contacted. If prices decline, these savings will be passed along to residents; however, there is no indication when, if at all, this might occur.

Trash bags may be purchased at Town Hall Monday through Friday from 8:15 a.m. to 4:45 p.m. Sales are made to town residents only.

Town Hall will be closed Monday, October 10, for Columbus Day. Trash will be collected as usual for residents on the Monday/Thursday route.

Are You Registered to Vote?

October 8 is the last day to register to vote in the general election on November 8. Last-minute voter registration will be conducted at Patrick Henry Library October 1 and 8 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., October 5 from 3 to 9 p.m., and October 6 from 7 to 9 p.m. For additional registration locations and hours, call 246-VOTE.

Absentee voting applications are available at all registration sites or by calling 246-8695. Voters who will be out of town on election day must cast their absentee ballots *in person*. Absentee voting will be conducted at the office of the Electoral Board, 4031 University Dr. in Fairfax, weekdays through October 18 from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m., weekdays from October 19 through November 4 from 8 a.m. to 9 p.m., and Saturdays through November 5 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. In-person absentee voting will also take place at the McLean Governmental Center, 1437 Balls Hill Rd., and four other satellite locations

weekdays through November 4 from 3 to 9 p.m. and Saturdays through November 5 from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m.

Registered voters who moved *before* the last general election on November 3, 1987, must transfer their registration in order to be eligible to vote on November 8, 1988. Election officers say the most distressing part of their job at the polls each election day is turning away the folks who have lost their vote by failing to report a move. Voters who move within a jurisdiction can transfer by sending a card or letter to the registrar giving the old and new address (each family member who has moved must sign it) or by re-registering at the main office, 4031 University Dr., 3rd Floor, Fairfax, VA 22030, or at a field registration site. Church St. Funding On the Ballot

On the ballot for the November 8 general election will be the candidates for President, Vice President, U.S. Senate and House of Representatives, plus a State referendum on parimutuel betting and five County bond referendum questions.

Of special interest to Vienna residents and businesses is the County bond referendum on commercial revitalization. If approved by voters, \$1.23 million of these funds will come to the Town for improvements on Church Street between Lawyers Road and Park Street, including placing utility lines underground, brick sidewalks, reconstruction of driveway entrances, street furniture and landscaping, and gas street lights.

All eligible Vienna residents are urged to register and vote on November 8.

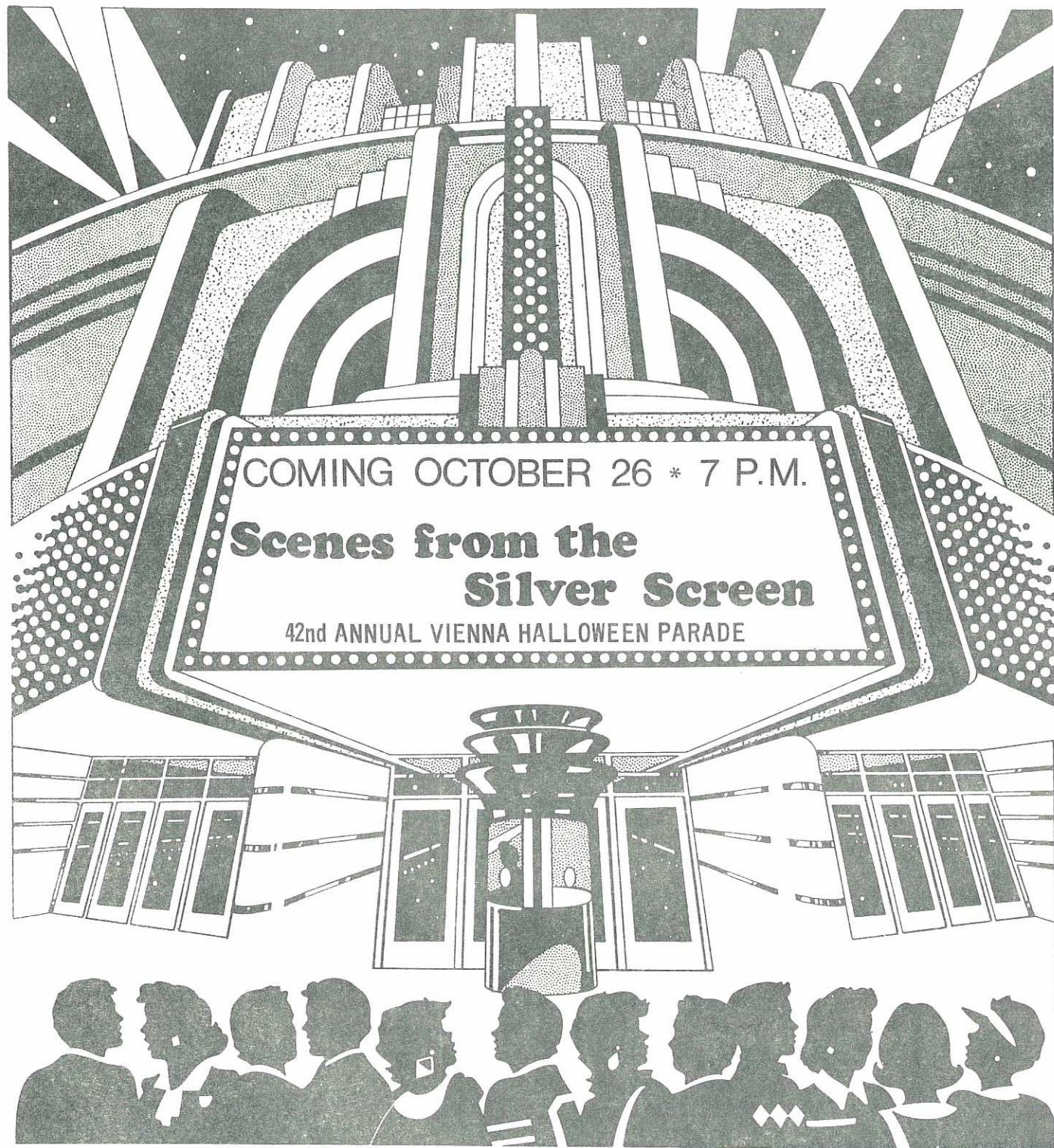

Cleanup Rules

— Building materials - wood, broken concrete, building brick and block, stones, fences, drywall and paneling - will be picked up. Concrete is limited to 300 pounds per residence. Building materials generated by contractors and/or persons employed by homeowners to renovate, repair and/or perform maintenance on their homes will not be picked up.

— Sod, stumps and brush in lengths of no more than 10 feet will be picked up. Please separate brush and branches from other discards.

— Leaves are not picked up by Cleanup crews. Leaves may be raked to the curb/edge of pavement to be picked up in the fall leaf collection (beginning November 7), or leaves may be bagged and put out with the regular trash.

— Discarded furniture, swing sets and playground equipment will be picked up.

— Up to 300 pounds of scrap metal and small automobile parts such as engine blocks, transmissions and tires will be picked up. Whole automobile bodies will not be picked up.

— Two major appliances per residence will be picked up. These include stoves, refrigerators, dishwashers, washers, driers, hot water heaters, air conditioners and furnaces. Old heating oil tanks will not be picked up.

— Paint cans, used motor oil and hazardous wastes will not be picked up.

— For the safety of Cleanup crews, please separate large pieces of glass from other discards.

— Residents of corner lots are requested to place discards in front of the property, not on the side.

— Please keep Cleanup items away from regular trash, fire hydrants, water meters, gas valves, fences and utility poles.

Celebrate Fire Prevention Week
