New Traffic Devices Improve Emergency Response Time

he Town of Vienna's traffic signal improvement efforts not only make commuter traffic more efficient during various times of the day, they also include a special upgrade that automatically gives fire department

vehicles the green light during emergency responses. During a presentation at the July 8 Town Council meeting, Vienna Fire Chief John Morrison explained how the preemption system works to improve response times in emergency situations.

"Fire vehicles and ambulances have transmitters that turn the lights green, which makes it a little faster for us to get through town," he said enthusiastically. Morrison also noted that the technology makes it safer for all motorists because while it gives emergency responders green lights to keep moving, it also changes lights for motorists coming from other directions to red to ensure they stop.

Morrison says all fire department vehicles in Fairfax County have these transmitters, and the technology has also now been installed at all Town of Vienna intersections with traffic signals. He says the fire department has already seen an improvement in emergency response times.

"We've seen what we think is about a 10 percent reduction in response time as we travel down Maple Avenue," Morrison reported in his presentation to the Council. "As of now, we can go from Mclean almost to the City of Fairfax and never hit a red light...which makes a big difference to us when we are providing aid to the residents of the Town of Vienna or other fire department responders are coming in or we're going out."

Morrison says Fairfax County provided funding for the technology at two of the 15 intersections, and the Town Council approved the use of American Rescue Plan Act funds for the remaining intersections. Morrison thanked the Council and expressed appreciation for the investment in the community.



Stop Sign Campaign Yields Increase in Violations

or the third year in a row, Vienna police officers stepped up efforts in June to ticket motorists who fail to come to a complete stop at a stop sign, stop light or flashing red light. In the one-month period, officers issued tickets for 236 stop-sign violations and 153 other traffic violations. The number of tickets issues during this year's campaign was higher than in previous years. The goal of the stop sign enforcement campaign is to raise awareness and ensure motorist and pedestrian safety by avoiding preventable crashes. The annual campaign began in 2022 after numerous resident complaints and a noticeable uptick in violations.




Library Construction set to Begin in Spring 2025

onstruction on the new Vienna-Carter Library was expected to begin this fall, but Fairfax County administrative procedures are taking a little longer than expected, so Patrick Henry Library will continue to operate on the site until spring 2025. After that, a temporary Patrick Henry Library will open in the Cedar Park Shopping Center, and preparations will begin to construct the new Vienna-Carter Library on the current site at the corner of Center Street and Maple Avenue.

The new Vienna-Carter Library is a joint development project between Fairfax County and the Town of Vienna. While the County is funding most of the project, the Town will help pay for a portion of the parking garage to provide additional public parking for Vienna visitors.

The new library architectural concepts were unveiled to the public on June 28, 2023, during a Liberty Amendments Month "Liberty and Libraries" program. At 19,000 square feet, the new Vienna-Carter Library will be a third bigger than the current building. It will house more meeting spaces and reading nooks for kids and adults, provide ample parking thanks to a new parking garage, and include a welcoming outdoor plaza designed with small gatherings in mind.

The Fairfax County Library Board of Trustees voted recently to name the new library in honor of those who worked to bring an integrated library to Vienna – William McKinley Carter and his wife, Lillian Carter. Report a Problem with Vienna Connect!

ow, more than ever, there are many ways to stay connected to the Town of Vienna and report a non-emergency issue, including using the Town's mobile phone app, Vienna Connect! Just download the app on your Android or Apple device, register, and click "Report an Issue." The platform enables users to upload a supporting photo and features an interactive map that pinpoints the location of each report. Those who report a

> problem can expect email responses or check the status of their concern via the app.

Using the app might even save time! With the touch of a button, users can find the information they need and cross out items on their "To Do" list with ease like making a payment, checking for upcoming public hearings and Town Council meetings, or registering for a Parks and Recreation class.

Please note: Vienna Connect is only for non-emergency problems that do not require an immediate response. For time-sensitive non-emergency issues such as noise complaints, please call the Vienna Police Department non-emergency number: 703-255-6366. If it's an emergency, please call 911. You can also access Vienna Connect from a computer via the Town website. Just log on to www.viennava.gov, click on the "report a problem" button on the homepage and start reporting. **V**

The Value of Town Commissions and Committees

hat are the Town of Vienna commissions and advisory committees, who is on them, and what do they do?

The Town of Vienna has seven boards and commissions: Planning, Transportation, Zoning Appeals, Architectural Review, Conservation and Sustainability, Public Art, and Windover Heights Board of Review – all of which are advisory to the Town Council, except the Board of Zoning Appeals. There are also four advisory committees to boards and commissions – Bicycle and Pedestrian, both of which advise the Transportation Commission, Town Business Liaison, which advises the Economic Development Department, and Tree Advocacy, which advises the Conservation and Sustainability Commission. Most meet once a month, but the Planning Commission generally meets twice monthly.

The Vienna Town Council appoints residents to all of these bodies except the Board of Zoning Appeals, which requires a Council recommendation to the Fairfax County Circuit Court for appointment. Residents can submit an application

for appointment on the Town's website and then the Town Clerk sets up an interview with the Council. Some people get involved because they have an interest in or skills for a particular commission. Some people just want to serve their community and apply asking us to find them a good fit.

One benefit of having commissions, is their ability to delve deep into issues pertaining to their specific topic and make recommendations to the Council for a vote. A huge amount of work is done by the members, so by the time it reaches the Council, many of the concerns are worked out. The Council respects the comments and recommendations and uses them to make final decisions. Another beauty of having Town commissioners is that they bring a variety of different backgrounds, perspectives, and experiences to form a cohesive yet diverse group that works together to make the town better. They can act as Town communicators as they engage with their friends and neighbors and are able to both receive feedback on the town and relay correct information to the community.

In Vienna, we are blessed to have many residents who care so much about their town and get involved in Town groups including boards and commissions. If you are interested in learning more, visit the Town website **www.viennava.gov/boards**.

Know the Rules of the Road

t won't be long before students head back to school in Fairfax County, and that means an increase in road and pedestrian traffic. Our officers will keep a close eye on crosswalks and bus stops, and here are some ways you can help ensure motorists, bicyclists and pedestrians reach their destination safely from the first day of school to the lazy days of summer:

- **Parents** Remind your kids about the pedestrian rules and safety measures around school buses, school zones, crosswalks, and signals.
- **Drivers** School-related traffic will have an impact on travel times. Be sure to allow extra time for your commute as it may be impacted by school bus traffic, pedestrian and bicycle traffic, and drop-off and pick-up times. Be mindful not to stop in the middle of crosswalks or intersections. Avoid distractions and stay focused on the road and what is happening around you.



- School Bus Rules It is really important for motorists to stop for a school bus with lights flashing and stop arm out. This applies to all drivers in both directions unless a median separates your car from the school bus lane. Also, for safety reasons, remind kids to stay at least 10 feet away from the front, sides, and rear of the bus as these areas can be hard for the driver to see.
- **Bicyclists** Make sure to wear the right gear, such as a well-fitting helmet, and fasten it every time you ride. If you can, stick to the sidewalk; if you're on the road, ride in the same direction as traffic. When you're on the sidewalk, follow pedestrian traffic laws; if you're on the road, follow the same rules as other vehicles.
- **Pedestrians** Always walk with a responsible adult or in a group of friends. Stick to the sidewalk when possible; if there isn't one, walk facing the oncoming traffic. Stay focused on where you're going and avoid roughhousing with others. Wear bright, colorful clothes to help drivers see you better.

If we all follow these essential safety tips, everyone can help assure an accident-free school year! \boldsymbol{v}


ayor Linda Colbert offers several opportunities for residents to meet with her each month:
