Weekly Curbside Recycling Proposed

The Town Council will hold a public hearing at its June 1 meeting on a proposal for curbside recycling in Vienna. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall.

The proposal calls for Town sanitation crews to provide trash collection on the first regular pickup day each week and collection of recyclables on the second pickup day. The only additional cost to residents would be the purchase of special bags for recyclables, available at local grocery stores for \$8 to \$14 (depending on size) for a year's supply.

The Monday/Thursday, Tuesday/Friday, and Wednesday/Saturday collection schedule would remain un-

changed. Regular trash and grass would be picked up on the first collection day of the week, and newspapers, brush, grass, plastic bottles, glass jars and bottles, metal food and beverage cans, and aluminum foil would be picked up on the second collection day. Curbside recycling would eliminate the need for the recycling bins at the Vienna Community Center except for cardboard, which would not be picked up at curbside initially.

With the convenience of curbside recycling, the amount of trash sent to the landfill should be dramatically reduced. Neighboring jurisdictions that have implemented similar programs report citizen participation at around 90%.

Public Hearing On FY 93 Budget

The average Town of Vienna homeowner will see a decrease in his Town real estate tax bill under the proposed Town budget for fiscal year 1992-93. The Town Council will hold a public hearing on the proposed budget at its May 18 meeting, which begins at 8 p.m. in Town Hall.

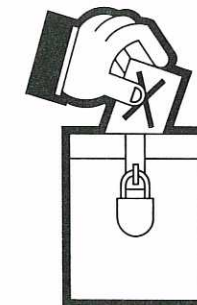
The proposed general fund budget of \$9,429,792 is based on a real estate tax rate of 30¢ per \$100 of assessed valuation. Due to an overall reduction in property assessments, homeowners whose assessments decreased by 3.34% or more in 1992 will see a reduction in their Town tax bill.

The proposed water and sewer fund budget is \$3,169,208. The total water and sewer rate paid by customers will not change.

If Council considers it necessary, a final budget work session to discuss comments made at the public hearing will be held at 9 a.m. Saturday, May 30. Adoption of the budget is scheduled for the June 1 Council meeting.

Copies of the proposed budget are available in the Human Resources Office at Town Hall.

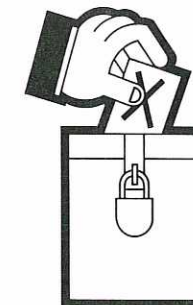

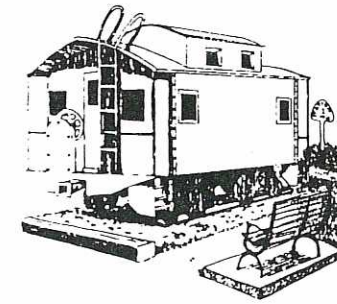

Laws Curb Clutter of Temporary Signs

'Tis the season for temporary signs advertising garage sales, real estate sales, and all sorts of business services such as yard work and home improvements. These ads pop up on telephone poles, stop signs, street signs, in yards, and along public rights-of-way.

The Planning and Zoning Department reminds citizens that this clutter of signs is an eyesore and, in most instances, against the Town Code. The next time a yard sale or other activity prompts you to post a sign, please keep the following regulations in mind:

- It is unlawful to place signs on street lights, telephone poles, markers

or other signs, or to place a sign without a permit within 10 feet of the curb or edge of pavement.

- A maximum of two real estate directional signs may be displayed on Saturdays and Sundays only.

- The following yard/garage sale signs are permitted: two signs of four square feet on the property where the sale will take place; and two directional signs of two square feet.

New Tub Grinder Saves Town Money

During its first six months of use, Vienna's tub grinder machine has saved the Town over \$12,000 in landfill fees while providing residents with tons of free leaf and wood mulch.

The tub grinder, which recycles leaves and brush into mulch, is located at the Town's property yard in Northside Park. It was purchased for \$70,000 last October. Since then, Vienna's Public Works Department has processed 2,000 cubic yards of leaves and 1,100 cubic yards of brush.

The mulch is delivered free of charge to town residents during the winter months. This winter, public demand was so great that the leaf mulch supply was exhausted and the wood mulch is back-ordered.

Now that the Public Works Department is familiar with the tub grinder's capabilities, it is anticipated that more leaves and brush can be recycled next fall, saving more money and filling more resident requests for mulch.

Rabies Clinic

A low-cost rabies vaccination clinic for dogs and cats will be held on Sunday, May 3, from 12 noon to 2 p.m. at the Fairfax County Animal Shelter, 4500 W. Ox Rd. The clinic is sponsored by the Northern Virginia Veterinary Medical Association and the County Department of Animal Control.

Vaccine given to animals over one year old costs \$6 and provides protection from rabies for three years. Vaccine given to animals under a year old costs \$4 and provides protection from rabies for one year. Puppies and kittens should be at least three months old to receive vaccine.

When animals are brought to the clinic, dogs must be restrained on a leash and cats confined to a cat-carrier or other container.
