Fall Leaf Collection Begins This Month

Fall leaf collection will begin on October 9 in south Vienna and October 22 on the north side of town. Department of Public Works crews using leaf vacuum machines will make three passes through town collecting leaves residents have raked to the curbside.

(Leaves put in plastic bags are picked up on the second trash collection day each week.)

Please rake leaves just to the curbside, not into the street. Cars parked on leaf piles may catch on fire, and children playing in the leaves may be struck by a passing vehicle. In addition,

leaves may prevent rainwater from reaching storm water inlets.

- Conducted an executive session to interview candidates for appointment to the Windover Heights Board of Review and the Community Beautification Commission.

- Approved curbside recycling for a trial period of 18 months beginning January 1, 1993. The program will initially use bags for recyclables; however, Council's desire is to shift to a bin system at the earliest possible opportunity.

- Adopted amendments to the Windover Heights Historic District ordinance.

- Approved entering into a hold harmless agreement with Mr. & Mrs. Lloyd Phillips of 514 Meadow Lane, S.W., for use of Town right-of-way.

- Approved change orders for the police station construction in the amount of \$16,406.

- Approved the installation of a temporary four-way stop at Glyndon Street and Owaissa Court/Drive, S.E., and "No Through Truck" signs on

Glyndon Street during the reconstruction of Park Street. The Police Department was directed to use radar surveillance frequently in the area. In addition, a temporary stop will be installed at Cottage Street and Moore Avenue, S.W., during the reconstruction project and the stop at Cottage and Oak Street temporarily covered.

- Appointed Kristine Dombrowski to the Board of Architectural Review for a two-year term.

- Appointed Paul Snodgrass to the Town/Business Liaison Committee for a term to expire May 13, 1993.

- Appointed the following members to the new Community Beautification Commission: town residents Karen O'Meara and Jane Seeman for two-year terms, Richard VanPelt for a three-year term, and Nancy Laubis for a four-year term; business community representatives Ann McNeish and Daphne Sloan for one-year terms and Ernie Myers for a four-year term; and Madison High School student Kate Beurmann for a one-year term.

- Appointed the following members to the Windover Heights Board of

Review: certified architect Thomas Kamstra, Beautification Commission representative Karen O'Meara, and at-large citizen representative Jill Decker for one-year terms; and Board of Architectural Review representative Shirley Damon and Planning Commission representative Edward Chase for two-year terms.

- Adopted an ordinance prohibiting smoking in Town facilities.

- Authorized Town participation in the Virginia Municipal League's insurance liability pool.

- Adopted amendments to the Town employee retirement plans concerning terms for members of the Administrative Retirement Committee.

- Authorized preparation of the final plans and specifications for sidewalk construction at the following locations: Tapawingo Road from Frederick to DeSale Street; Moore Avenue from Cottage to DeSale Street; Plum Street from Courthouse Road to Cottage Street; Nutley Street from Maple Avenue to Windover Avenue and from Windover to 247 Nutley; Glyndon Street from Ayr Hill Avenue to the Mobil station and from Ayr Hill to Glyndon Park; and Creek Crossing Road from East Street to Fairway Drive. Approved construction of a sidewalk adjacent to Jiffy Lube at Maple Avenue and Courthouse Road pending acquisition of the appropriate easements.

- Awarded the following bids: dump truck cab and chassis to Central Motor Co. at a price of \$28,750; and dump body and hoist to Wilbar Truck Equipment at a price of \$7,295.

- Referred to the Planning Commission for public hearing and recommendation a proposed ordinance prohibiting an accessory building from being used as a dwelling.

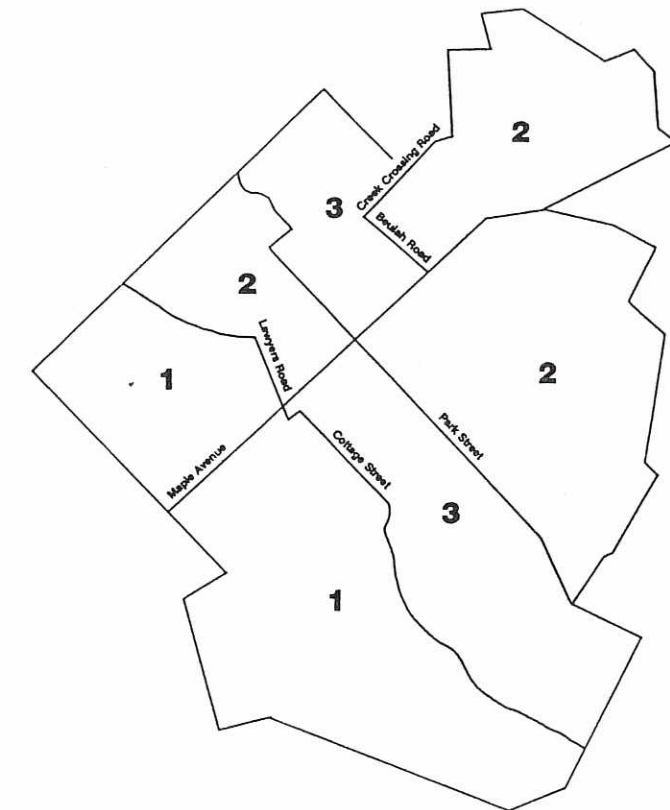

Voter registration will be conducted that day at these locations in and near Vienna: Patrick Henry Library, 10 a.m.-5 p.m.; Safeway food store, 10 a.m.-2 p.m.; Tysons Corner Center, 12 noon-5 p.m.; and Tysons Corner Division of Motor Vehicles Office, 9 a.m.-2 p.m. For other registration sites and dates, and for information about homebound registration, call the Fairfax County General Registrar's Office at 591-8523.

You must also notify the General Registrar's Office by October 3 if you have had a change of address since last year's general election.

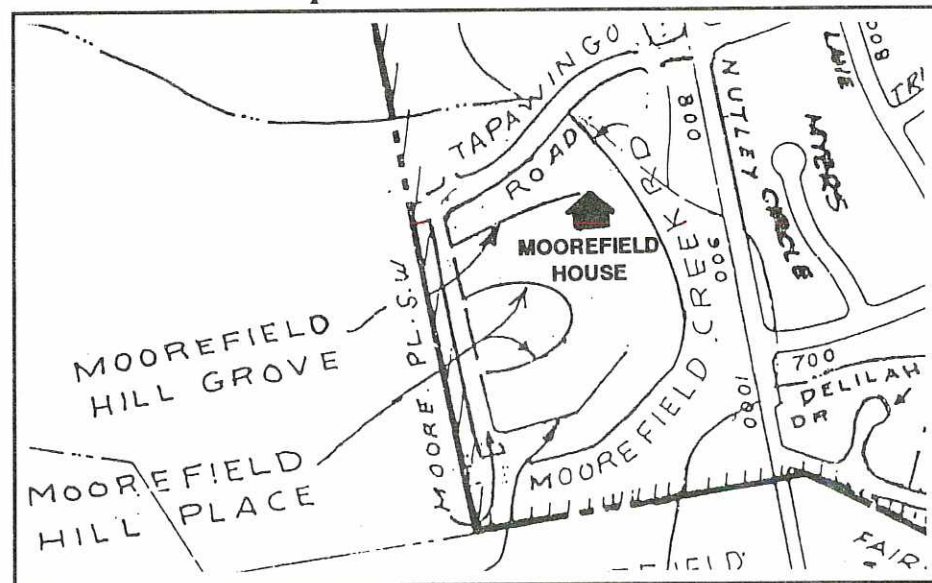
On November 3, citizens will vote on the president and vice president; member of the House of Representatives; a revision to the Virginia constitution to establish a revenue stabilization

fund; three state bond questions on higher education, mental health facilities, and parks; and a county transportation bond referendum.

There have been two changes in Vienna voting precincts. Precincts #1 and #5 have been combined to form a new Vienna Precinct #1, which will vote at Cunningham Park Elementary School where both of the old precincts voted. Precincts #2 and #3 have been combined to form a new Precinct #2, which will vote at the Vienna Community Center, where old #2 voted. (Old Precinct #3 had voted at Vienna Elementary School.)

Those unable to go to the polls on election day may vote absentee by mail or in person at a number of locations. For applications and information, call the County Electoral Board at 246-4735.

The historic Moorefield house is located off Nutley Street, S.W., at the end of Moorefield Hill Grove, in the Townes of Moorefield subdivision. The house was built around 1790 by Jeremiah Moore, a Baptist minister who suffered jail and official persecution for his staunch belief in the separation of Church and State. The house is the oldest in town and is one of the few remaining examples of a late 18th century farm home. Historic Vienna, Inc., has undertaken a major fund-raising campaign for the restoration of Moorefield. Public Hearing On Parking Of Boats, RV's

The Town Council will hold a public hearing on Monday, October 5, on two proposed ordinances to regulate parking of trailers, camping trailers, boats, boat trailers, and recreational vehicles in residential zones. The hearing will be part of the regular Council meeting, which will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall.

The first ordinance would permit parking of these vehicles in single-family residential zones only behind the front building line of the house; in townhouse and apartment zones, a common parking area would be designated.

The second ordinance would prohibit parking of these vehicles on any residential street for more than one hour a day, except when preparing for a trip.

Copies of the proposed ordinances are available for review in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall.

Town Receives Tree-planting Grant

The Town of Vienna Department of Parks and Recreation has been awarded a grant of \$11,220 by the Virginia Department of Forestry to help replace trees in the median strip on Nutley Street, S.W.

This fall, the Town will place 22 linden trees and 16 flowering pear trees in the Nutley Street median strip to replace existing hawthorn trees planted in the 1960's that are now dead or dying because of disease and pollution.

The grant is part of the Small Business Administration Natural Resources Development program, the purpose of which is to use small businesses to plant trees on public lands. The Town intends to contract with two separate local small businesses to furnish and install the trees; one nursery

will be awarded a contract for the linden trees, the other for the pear trees.

The Town of Vienna has long emphasized community beautification, including the planting and maintenance of street trees. The use of linden and pear trees should provide a good mix of hardiness, disease resistance, colorful foliage, spring flowers and, eventually, a dense tree canopy to help reduce air and noise pollution generated by the high volume of traffic on Nutley Street.
