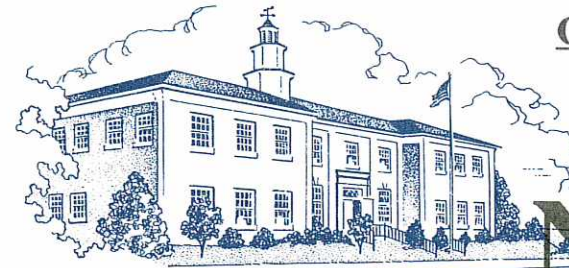

Leaf Collection Begins This Month

Fall leaf collection will begin on October 18 in north Vienna and October 27 on the south side of town. Department of Public Works crews using leaf vacuum machines will make three passes through town collecting leaves residents have raked to the curbside.

(Leaves put in plastic bags are picked up along with recyclable materials on the second collection day each week.)

Please rake leaves just to the curbside, not into the street. Cars parked on leaf piles may catch on fire, and children playing in the leaves may be struck by a passing vehicle. In addition, leaves may prevent rainwater from reaching storm water inlets.

Doing Business With the Town

It has been approximately a year since the Vienna Purchasing Office implemented a computerized bidders' list. Since then, the Town has been very successful in expanding its sources of supply and thus obtaining better prices for commodities and services. About 25% of prospective businesses are now included in the system.

With your application on file, the Purchasing Office is aware of the full range of commodities and services your company can provide. For a copy of the application and for information on bids currently in progress, call the Purchasing Office at 255-6359.

Upon receipt of the completed form, the information will be entered into the bidders' list. This list is used as a source of supply when the cost of a commodity/service requested by a Town department is greater than \$500 and is not covered under a contract or requires purchase under the "exceptions to the competitive bidding process" provisions of the Virginia Public Procurement Act. For purchases greater than \$5,000, bidders are formally notified.

Fairfax County Announces New Household Battery Program

Beginning October 1, Fairfax County will begin collecting a limited number and type of household batteries for environmentally safe disposal. This program is not aimed at the common alkaline household battery but rather at those batteries that contain heavy metals: cadmium, mercury, zinc and nickel.

The Household Battery Collection and Disposal Program is planned to operate at the County's 15 recycling drop-off centers, including the one at the Vienna Community Center.

This program targets household batteries that pose the greatest environmental concern. These are the

small "button" (or disc) batteries, mercury batteries, and rechargeable nickel-cadmium batteries.

The program is not collecting the more common alkaline batteries such as those used in radios, toys and flashlights. During the last few years, battery manufacturers have substantially reduced the mercury content in alkaline batteries, making them relatively benign. Alkaline batteries can be disposed of with regular trash.

The chart below describes the three battery types being collected in the program. For more information, call the County's Recycling Hotline at 324-5052.

"button" or disc	small disc-type batteries that are round and flat	watches, hearing aids, cameras
mercury	various shapes; will be labeled "mercury" on the battery casing	miscellaneous small appliances
rechargeable nickel-cadmium	various shapes; will be labeled "rechargeable"	power packs and other specialty items

NOTE: Mercury and rechargeable batteries are sometimes used as replacements for "button" batteries or standard cylindrical batteries (e.g. AA, C and D). Be sure to read the battery casing to see if it is labeled "mercury" or "rechargeable."

What Requires a Building Permit and What Doesn't ?

The Town of Vienna requires home owners, renters, business owners and tenants to obtain a building permit whenever they wish to make improvements to their property. A permit is required before any of the following improvements may commence:

1. Constructing, enlarging, altering, repairing, or demolishing any part of a building or structure. This includes but is not limited to installation of a new roof or siding, erection of a storage shed or other accessory structure, finishing a basement, and construction of new facilities such as retaining walls, fences, hot tubs, pools, driveways, satellite antennas, and building additions.

2. Changing the use of a building either within the same use group or to a different use group when the new use requires more structural strength, fire protection, exits, or sanitary provisions.

3. Removing or disturbing any asbestos-containing materials.

4. Additions, alterations, replacement, or relocation of any plumbing, mechanical, or electrical systems.

There are exceptions to when a building permit is required, such as ordinary repairs. The term "ordinary repairs" means replacement of materials with like materials, including but not limited to:

1. Painting.
2. Roofing when not exceeding 100 square feet of roof area.

3. Windows when they are replaced in exactly the same size and location.

4. Doors, except those in fire-rated wall assemblies or exitways.

5. Floor coverings and porch flooring.

6. Repairs to plaster, interior tile

work, and other wall coverings.

7. Cabinets installed in residential dwellings.

8. A notable exception is the construction of an accessory structure less than 8½ feet tall and with a total area of less than 150 square feet on a single-family lot. The installation of such a structure does not require a building permit, but its location is restricted in accordance with setback requirements for each of the three residential zones.

The information in this article is not a complete list of specific home improvement projects that require a building permit. If you have questions

or are unsure whether a permit is required, please call the Planning and Zoning Department at 255-6341.

Tree Removal Permit No Longer Required

The Town Council has adopted an ordinance eliminating the requirement for a permit to remove trees from private property. Council took this action in response to citizen questions about the need for such a requirement.

A tree removal permit would still be required, however, in the case of trees removed in conjunction with new construction.

Absentee Voting Now Underway

Voters in Fairfax County will vote on November 2 for Governor, Lt. Governor, Attorney General, members of the House of Delegates, directors of the Northern Virginia Soil and Water Conservation District, one elected school board referendum, and one school bond issue.

Voters who will be away from their polling place on election day should apply now to vote absentee. Applications may be obtained at the Office of the Electoral Board in the Fairfax County Government Center, County libraries, and seven governmental centers around the county, including the McLean Governmental Center, 1437 Balls Hill Rd. Voters applying by mail must send applications to the Electoral Board at 12000 Government Center Pkwy., Suite 323, Fairfax, VA 22035-0082. By law, all mailed applications must be received by 5 p.m. October 28.

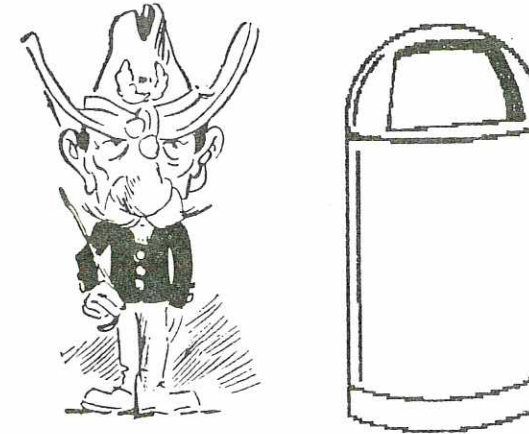

Ecoloday will also include hay rides, pumpkin painting and scarecrow making, plus a chance to contribute to a community mural to be displayed at the Government Center.

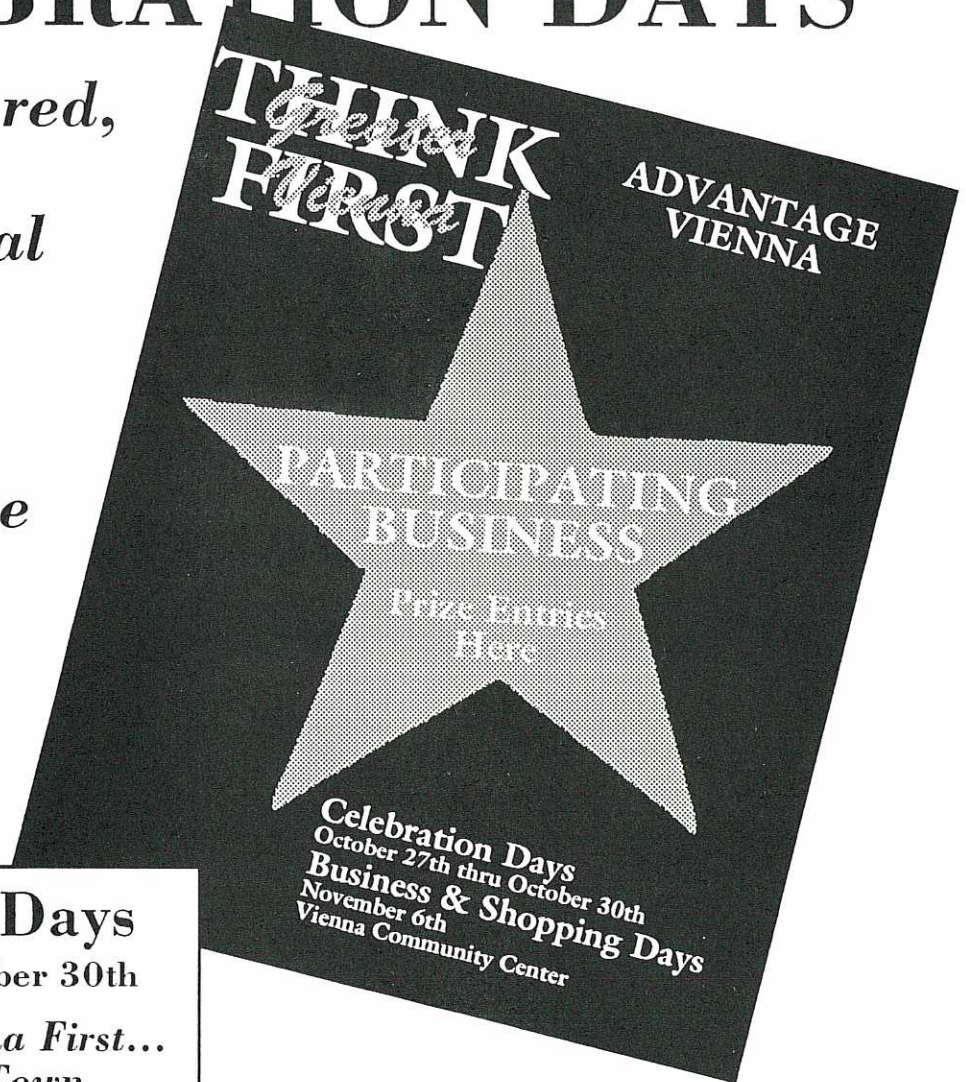
