Brochure on Pages 3-4 Revisions to Trash/Special Pickup Regulations Effective March 1

The Town Council has approved a number of changes in the Town's solid waste regulations, effective March 1. The changes result from new waste disposal policies being implemented by Fairfax County and increased disposal costs.

The major changes in the Town regulations are as follows:

1. "Yard waste," defined as grass, leaves and small clippings, will be picked up on the first collection day of the week. Yard waste must be bagged and separated from the regular trash. Yard waste does not include bundled brush, which will continue to be collected on the second collection day of the week.
2. Residents will be required to call for a special pickup within 48

hours from the time discards are placed at the curb. Should a resident not call, the Town will proceed to collect the debris anyway and charge the resident for the appropriate number of special pickups.

3. Each residence will still receive two free special pickups per year. The fee for additional pickups has been changed to a flat \$25 for brush and increased from \$50 to \$75 for other debris.

Phone Book Recycling Underway

"Operation ReDial," the annual telephone book recycling program, is underway, coinciding with the major distribution periods for the C&P and One Book directories. In Vienna, the collection container is located in the Giant Food parking lot at 359 Maple Ave., E. Old phone books can be dropped off 24 hours a day through May 15.

Operation ReDial is for phone books only. Please do not leave plastic

bags or other materials in the collection containers.

Clean Fairfax County, Inc., will pick up phone books from senior and disabled citizens who are unable to go to the collection site. To request this service or to volunteer to assist in this effort, call 324-5471.

Mulch Delivery Ending

Residents may pick up mulch themselves in any amount. The mulch is stored on Town owned property off Beulah Road near Glyndon Park. Look for the sign, "Free Leaf Mulch & Wood Mulch."

All businesses in the Town of Vienna, including home occupations, must renew their business licenses by March 1. The annual license tax is based on gross receipts, and the rate varies according to the type of business.

- Referred to the Planning Commission for a public hearing and recommendation a proposed ordinance regulating screening of satellite antennas.

Water Mains Flushed in Spring

Each spring, the Town of Vienna flushes the water mains in its distribution system in order to maintain a high standard of water quality and to ensure proper and efficient operation of the fire hydrants. This year the preventive maintenance program will begin in early March and continue until the end of May. Water mains are usually flushed between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Water mains are flushed by opening the fire hydrants and allowing the water to flow freely for a short period of time. The flushing cleans out sedi-

ment that normally accumulates during the summer and winter, and enables the Town to test and perform routine maintenance on the 800+ fire hydrants within its service area.

Flushing may result in some discoloration and the presence of sediment in the water reaching your home or business. These conditions are not harmful and should be of short duration. The Town appreciates your tolerance of this inconvenience. If you need more information, please call the Customer Service Office at 255-6385.

BEAUTY TIP: Snow is beautiful, but walking in the snow to bus stops, school, work or shopping can be treacherous. A good neighbor tries to get his sidewalk shoveled as soon as possible so folks won't have to walk in the street or on slippery walkways. For those who cannot shovel their own sidewalks, the Vienna Parks and Recreation Department's Odd Job Bank can provide a list of people who can be hired to shovel snow. Call 255-6360.

1. Discarded furniture, swing sets and playground equipment.
2. Sod and brush.
3. 300 pounds of scrap metal per residence, small automobile parts such as engine blocks, transmissions and tires. All tires must be removed from the rim.
4. Trees and limbs of a diameter greater than 1½ inches and no more than 8 feet in length.
5. Each residence will be limited to the disposal of two major appliances per special pickup. Major appliances shall include stoves, dishwashers, refrigerators, washers, dryers, hot water heaters, air conditioners, and furnaces.
6. Building materials, which shall include the following items: wood, broken concrete, bricks or block, fences, drywall, and paneling. Each residence shall be limited to 300 pounds of concrete per pickup.

SPECIAL CONDITIONS

The Public Works Department will not pick up the following items:

1. Gas tanks
2. Fuel oil tanks
3. Mounted tires (Town crews will pick up the tire and the rim as long as they are separated.)
4. Large tree stumps
5. Paint cans
6. Biohazardous waste including needles and syringes

NOTES:

- Plastic trash bags may be purchased from the Finance Department at Town Hall every weekday from 8:00 A.M. to 4:30 P.M.
- Hazardous materials such as fuel tanks, paints, solvents, insecticides, etc. can be disposed of through the Fairfax County Hazardous Waste Disposal Program. (The drop-off center for hazardous waste is the Fairfax County Fire and Rescue Academy located at 4600 West Ox Road. Call 324-5068 for further information.)
- Large tree stumps can be disposed of at the Fairfax County Transfer Station located on West Ox Road or at the Fairfax County Landfill located in Lorton, Virginia.

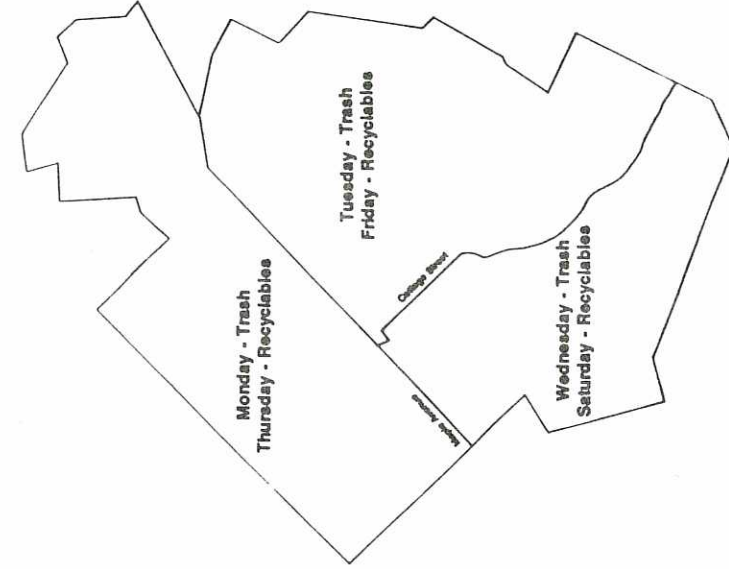

ROUTES

Monday and Thursday

All residences north of Maple Avenue.

Tuesday and Friday

All residences south of Maple Avenue and east of Cottage Street.

Wednesday and Saturday

All residences south of Maple Avenue and west of Cottage Street.

GENERAL INFORMATION

Collection for regular trash and yard waste (except bundled brush) will be made once weekly on the first collection day of the week.

Collection for mixed recyclable materials, newspapers and bundled brush will be made once weekly on the second collection day of the week.

Collection will not be scheduled for Sundays, Thanksgiving Day, Christmas Day, and New Year's Day. When a regular collection day is missed because of adverse weather conditions, a holiday, or mechanical difficulties, collections will be made on the next regularly scheduled day for that route.

Every effort will be made to cover the established routes as efficiently as possible. Whenever adjustments in the schedule occur, notices to this effect will be placed in the *Vienna Newsletter* and local papers.

REFUSE

Regular household trash, and yard waste consisting of grass, leaves, and small clippings will be collected on the first day of the scheduled route. Yard waste must be bagged and separated from the regular trash.

All refuse shall be placed at the curbline or edge of pavement by 7:00 A.M. on collection day (but not earlier than 6:00 P.M. the preceding eve-

ning) where it will be easily and safely accessible.

Refuse containers shall not be placed and left on a sidewalk or any portion of a street right-of-way where they would interfere with traffic. All trash cans shall be removed from the curbline or edge of pavement as soon as possible after trash pickup and by 7:00 P.M. the same evening as collection. The Town reserves the right to designate the collection point where there is a question or doubt.

All trash containers shall be regular water-tight cans made of metal, or plastic (if non-breakable), equipped with handles, tight-fitting covers and with good bottoms. Cans with a maximum capacity weight, quality and type expressly designed for refuse disposal shall be used. Paper bags used in trash compactors and plastic bags may be substituted for cans. The bags shall be removed from the can or other holder, tied at the top, and placed at the curbline or edge of pavement.

In the interest of health and safety, defective trash cans will be red-tagged by trash crews indicating that they are no longer suitable for use. These will be removed the first pickup the following week if left at curbside in an upside-down position.

RECYCLABLES

Mixed recyclable materials, newspapers, and bundled brush will be collected on the second day of the scheduled trash route. Recyclables shall be placed at the curb or edge of pavement by 7:00 A.M. on collection day (but not earlier than 6:00 P.M. the preceding evening) where they will be easily and safely accessible. Recyclables shall be prepared in the following manner:

MIXED MATERIALS: GLASS bottles and jars, all colors; PLASTIC bottles and jugs; METAL food and beverage cans; and ALUMINUM foil and plates shall be placed together in a transparent plastic bag.

NEWSPAPERS: Shall be bundled with string

or placed in brown paper (not plastic) bags separate from other recyclables.

BRUSH: Shall be cut in four-foot lengths and bundled. The diameter for brush collected in bundles is limited to 1½ inches.

(Cardboard is not currently collected at curbside but can be taken to the recycling center at the Vienna Community Center.)

SPECIAL PICKUPS

Each residence or nonprofit organization located in a residential zone is allowed two free special pickups each year. All items shall be placed at the curb or edge of pavement and on the front side of the property. Discards shall not be placed so that they block the sidewalk or street. Discards shall not be placed around trees, poles, signs, fences, or other obstructions.

Residents must call for a special pickup within 48 hours from when they place discards at the curb or edge of pavement. Residents not complying will be notified that they have 48 hours in which to call for a special pickup. After issuing the notice and no action is taken by the resident, the Town reserves the right to schedule and collect the debris within 10 working days. The resident will then be charged for the appropriate number of special pickups.

Each special pickup is limited to one dump truck load per residence or nonprofit organization located in a residential zone. Each residence receives two free pickups per year. Additional pickups may be arranged at a charge of \$75.00 per load for all items except for brush; additional loads of brush will be charged at \$25.00 each. Residents or nonprofit organizations may call the Special Pickup Hotline at 255-5727 to arrange for a special pickup. The amounts and type of debris are limited to the following:
