## This Month in History

*from the Vienna Newsletter archives*

**MARCH 1998** – The search is on for Vienna's oldest tree. Councilman Bob McCormick, chairman of the Oldest Tree Committee, is accepting nominations until March 1, when 10 finalists will be selected for judging by Wheat's Lawn and Custom Landscaping. At a ceremony on April 25, a plaque will be placed (harmlessly) on Vienna's oldest tree, with the nine other finalists honored as "Senior Citizens."

**MARCH 1988** – Republican candidates in Virginia's March 8 presidential primary election include Bush, Dole, du Pont, Haig, Kemp and Robertson. On the Democratic ballot voters will choose from Babbit, Dukakis, Gephardt, Gore, Hart, Jackson, Larouche and Simon.

**MARCH 1978** – Location of the K Route Metrorail terminal station will be on the Town Council's agenda for March 20. Citizens are invited to express their preference for either a Vienna or a Tysons Corner location. The K Route originally was planned to terminate at a Vienna station in the median of I-66. An alternative Tysons Corner station would be located in the median of the Dulles Airport Access Road with access by pedestrian overpasses from parking lots on both sides of Spring Hill Road. The Town Council recently reaffirmed its opposition to the Vienna location because of the likelihood of high-density land development in the area and the resulting traffic impact on the town's residential streets.

## Recycle Motor Oil, Antifreeze, Batteries

The next quarterly recycling day for used motor oil, antifreeze and car batteries is Saturday, March 1, from 8 a.m. to 2 p.m. at Northside Property Yard, 600 Mill St., N.E. (entrance at the dead end of the street). This service of the Public Works Department provides citizens a convenient and environmentally responsible way to dispose of vehicle waste products. Too often, used oil is improperly poured down storm drains or into sewers. Just one quart of oil can pollute 250,000 gallons of water, releasing toxic metals such as lead, cadmium and arsenic into the environment. Recycled oil is a valuable resource that can be re-manufactured into new fuels.

Antifreeze, like oil, can contaminate water and should never be disposed of in drains or sewers. In addition, antifreeze stored around the house presents a great danger to children and pets; it tastes sweet but is deadly poison.

Improper disposal of automobile batteries is a leading cause of lead contamination in landfills and energy recovery facilities. In Virginia it is illegal to dispose of automobile batteries with refuse.

## Business License Renewal Deadline

Town businesses are reminded that March 3 is the deadline for payment of the annual business, professional, and occupational license (BPOL) tax. All businesses in the Town of Vienna, including home occupations, must renew their business licenses each year.

The amount of the tax is based on gross receipts, and the rate varies according to the type of business. The gross receipts threshold is \$50,000, below which the tax does not apply. Businesses with gross receipts of \$50,000 or less pay only the minimum license fee of \$30 per year.

License tax renewal forms were mailed at the end of January, and forms are also available in the Finance Department at Town Hall and online at [www.viennava.gov](http://www.viennava.gov). For more information or assistance in figuring license taxes, call 703-255-6321.

## Planning Commission Studies Church Street Parking

The Town Council has directed the Planning Commission to analyze the adequacy of parking and other parking issues in the Church Street Pedestrian District. The Commission will gather data, solicit information and suggestions from businesses and the public, and make recommendations addressing both short-term and long-term parking needs.

The public may submit their views on Church Street parking by going to the Town Web site at [www.viennava.gov](http://www.viennava.gov) to complete a short survey. Responses can be submitted electronically. Individuals without Internet access may complete the survey form on page 10 of this newsletter and bring or mail it to the Planning and Zoning Department at Town Hall.

The Planning Commission has already mailed survey forms to property and business owners on Church Street to gather information concerning parking habits of employees and customers, as well as other information. This survey is also available online or may be obtained from the Planning and Zoning Department.

All responses should be submitted by March 16.

## Future of Tysons Corner Subject of Public Forum

"Tysons Future: Gridlock or Smart Growth?" a forum to discuss issues associated with "urbanizing" Tysons Corner, will be held at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, March 6, at the McLean Community Center, 1234 Ingleside Ave. Residents of Vienna, McLean, Great Falls, and other Northern Virginia communities are invited to attend.

Community leaders and Fairfax County personnel will share insights on the options under consideration by the Tysons Corner Land Use Task Force, which was commissioned by the Board of Supervisors in 2005 to make recommendations on how to foster the economic vitality of Tysons Corner in the 21st century, and their impact on the local economy, transportation network, schools, and infrastructure. The planning process assumes that Metrorail will come to the area and that both residential and commercial density will increase.

Participants will include Vienna Town Councilwoman Laurie Cole; task force member and former Dranesville District Supervisor Stu Mendelsohn; Dranesville School Board representative Jane Strauss; Chief of Policy and Plan Development, County Department of Planning & Zoning, Sterling Wheeler; and Providence District Council chairman Charlie Hall. There will be ample time for citizen input.

## Traffic-calming Report on April 7 Council Agenda

At its April 7 meeting, the Town Council will consider the final report of a town-wide traffic-calming study. The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall, and citizens are encouraged to attend and comment on the report.

The firm of ATCS, P.L.C., was contracted by the Town Council last year to conduct the traffic-calming study, which was to address key locations in town, including those that already have traffic-calming measures in place, focusing on residential streets. The study assesses cut-through traffic and speeding in residential areas.

A draft of the report was presented to the Vienna Transportation Safety Commission at its February meeting, and copies are available for public review in the Public Works Department at Town Hall. The draft may also be viewed at the Town Web site, [www.viennava.gov](http://www.viennava.gov). The final version should be available in mid-March.

- Authorized the Town staff to assist the Vienna-Tysons Regional Chamber of Commerce with the development of an Oktoberfest and Taste of the Town. A proposed agreement outlining details of the event will be submitted to Council for approval. All Town staffing costs are to be reimbursed by the Chamber.

- Approved the installation of a speed hump on Tazewell Road, N.W., the exact location to be determined by the Department of Public Works.

- Approved construction of a concrete retaining wall along the new sidewalk at 200 McHenry St., S.E., at a cost of \$1,500.

- Approved a one-time salary adjustment for eight police officers to correct an administrative calculation error.

- Appropriated \$419,193 from the fiscal year 2007 General Fund encumbrance reserve to the fiscal year 2007 General Fund.

## Noise Restrictions on Council Agenda

At its March 17 meeting, the Town Council will consider a proposed amendment to the noise ordinance that would prohibit construction activity by commercial firms on federal holidays in addition to Sundays.

Residential property owners and occupants, and non-profit organizations, would be allowed to work on dwellings on Sundays and holidays, but could not begin work until 9 a.m. Currently, a 7 a.m. starting time is allowed.

The meeting will begin at 8 p.m. in the Council Chamber at Town Hall, and all interested citizens are encouraged to attend.

## Report Housing Violations to Planning & Zoning Department

Your Vienna Planning and Zoning Department reminds you that the Town limits the number of individuals who can live in any residential dwelling. Only a "family" or "family equivalent" is permitted to occupy a single-family home, townhouse, condo, or apartment. The Town Code defines these terms as follows:

- A family is one or more persons related by blood or marriage occupying a single housekeeping unit and using common cooking facilities. In addition to the persons related by blood or marriage, not more than two boarders or lodgers are permitted.
- A family equivalent is two or more individuals not related by blood or marriage and not exceeding four persons.

Private apartments that are separated from the main dwelling unit and "in-law suites" are prohibited by the Town Code.

For more information or to report violations, call the Planning and Zoning Department at 703-255-6341. The Town staff works closely with Fairfax County's code enforcement "strike team" to control illegal boarding houses, hoarding, and other health and safety violations in Vienna neighborhoods.

## Tax Relief Offered to Senior and Disabled Low-income Homeowners

Both the Town of Vienna and Fairfax County offer real estate tax relief for low-income homeowners who are 65 years old and over, or permanently and totally disabled. To qualify, the following requirements must be met:

- Total household income of \$72,000 or less. This amount excludes \$6,500 of income of relatives, other than the spouse, who reside in the household. Also excluded is \$7,500 of any income received by a disabled homeowner. 100% tax relief is given for total combined income of \$52,000 or less, 50% tax relief between \$52,001 and \$62,000, and 25% tax relief between \$62,001 and \$72,000.
- Total combined assets of no more than \$340,000. This amount excludes the value of the residence, up to one acre of land, and household furnishings.
- Disabled persons applying for the first time must show evidence of disability.

In addition to real estate tax relief, Fairfax County provides rental grants and relief from personal property tax for one automobile per household.

Applications for 2008 for all programs are due April 1. This date may be extended to December 31 of next year for first-time filers or if hardship conditions exist which, through no fault of the applicant, prohibit applying by April 1.

## Give Your Home An Energy Audit

The greenhouse gas emissions from the average house are equivalent to two average automobiles. By making improvements – sometimes as simple as fixing leaks, adding insulation, or installing a hot water heater blanket – you can reduce your energy use. A home energy audit is the first step to assess how much energy your home consumes and to evaluate what measures you can take to make your home more energy efficient. ## Rules for Block Parties

Planning a neighborhood block party? If your event will require closing a street, you must submit a petition for a permit at least two weeks in advance. The petition must include the following information:

- Date, location (street to be closed), and starting and ending times of the block party;
- Names, addresses, and signatures of all residents who will have their driveways blocked during the street closure; and
- Name, address, and daytime phone number of the person who is organizing the event.

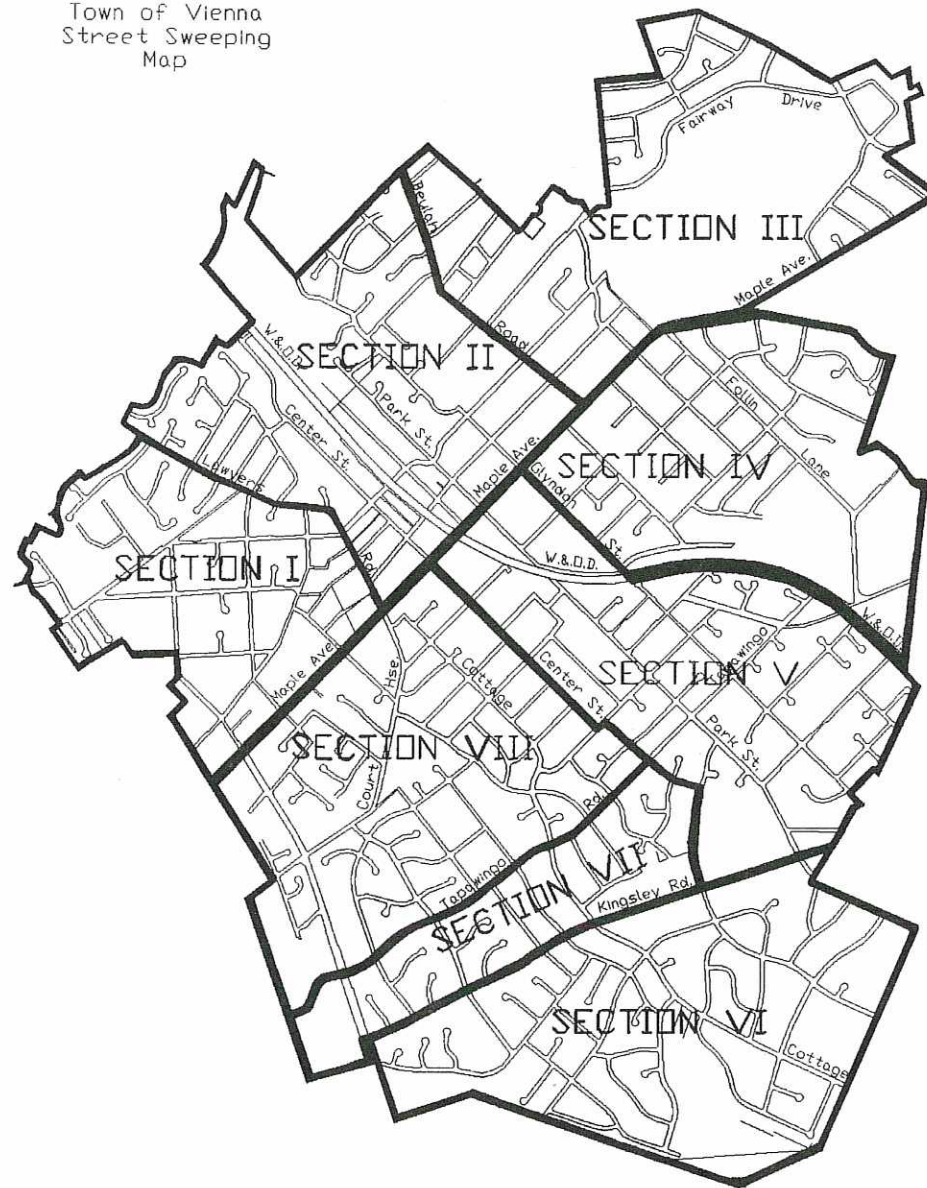

## Voter Registration Deadline April 7

Monday, April 7, is the last day to register to vote in the May 6 Town election. You are eligible to register if you are a Vienna resident, at least 18 years old by election day, and a U.S. citizen.

You may register in person in the Fairfax County General Registrar's Office at the County Government Center or by mail. Application forms are available in the Town Clerk's Office at Town Hall, all public libraries and other locations around the county, and at the County Web site, [www.fairfaxcounty.gov](http://www.fairfaxcounty.gov).

If you are already a registered voter, no additional registration is required for the Town election; however, you should check your voter registration card to be sure it lists your current name and address. You must notify the Registrar's Office of any change in your name or address before the registration books close for the election.

## Water Mains Flushed in Spring

Each spring the Town of Vienna flushes the water mains in its distribution system in order to maintain a high standard of water quality and to ensure proper and efficient operation of the fire hydrants. The preventive maintenance program begins in early April, and flushing usually occurs between 11 p.m. and 5 a.m.

Water mains are flushed by opening the fire hydrants and allowing the water to flow freely for a short period of time. The flushing cleans out sediment that normally accumulates during the summer and winter, and enables the Town to test and perform routine maintenance on the 800+ fire hydrants within its service area.

Flushing may result in some discoloration and the presence of sediment in the water reaching your home or business. These conditions are not harmful and should be of short duration.
